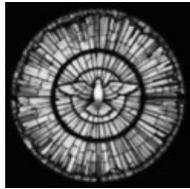

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

When Jesus saw the people gathering he invited them to come forward and listen. He had a very important message to share with them. Saint Matthew says that Jesus 'sat down' to teach them. When a rabbi sits it is a significant gesture because it says silently to the people that he is about to teach them and share with them a very important message. Jesus begins His message, which I've taken the liberty of putting into a modern context:

"Blessed are they who place the love of family and friends before all else, who possess a spirit of gratitude that compels them to give of their own blessings to others — for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

"Blessed are they who grieve, who struggle to cope but continue to hope: the single mom or dad trying to raise their children alone, the parents who wait for the lost daughter or son to return — for they will be comforted.

"Blessed are they who find their joy in the happiness of others: the young couple just starting out, the devoted teacher, the dedicated friend — for they will inherit the earth.

"Blessed are they who can see beyond their own interests and agendas to the greater common good, who understand and honor their ethical and social responsibility to their community — for they will be filled.

"Blessed are they who treat classmates, coworkers and employees with respect and dignity; who never forget what it was like to struggle to raise a family, to be the "new kid," to start a new job; who keep in mind the many times they've been forgiven and received a second and third chance that they didn't deserve — for they will receive mercy.

"Blessed are they who seek justice for the poor and the abused, who speak up for the victimized and powerless, who refuse to compromise in matters of justice and truth — for they will see God.

"Blessed are they who possess the rare gift for bringing people together, who possess the humility to make the first move to forgive and enable reconciliation to take place; who bring healing to those who have been hurt, ignored, or rejected — for they will be called children of God.

"Blessed are they who are ridiculed and criticized for doing what is just and good, who refuse to give into the cynicism around them, who will not rationalize injustice and justify falsehoods — for the reign of God is theirs.

"Rejoice and be glad" Jesus told the group that had met that night in the church hall, "for your reward in heaven will be great."

In every time, in every place, there are "Beatitude" people in our own families, in our own towns, in our own parish who have embraced the "blessedness" of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount: realizing the many blessings they possess, they seek to reveal God's blessings in the lives of others through compassion, generosity, mercy and peace; trusting in the mercy of God they have experienced in their own lives, they seek to be the means for others to realize God's presence in their lives. May God's grace illuminate our hearts that we may embrace the vision of the Beatitudes: to seek the grace and joy of God in all things.

Did you know....



February 2nd is significant in several ways.

- Among the many feasts in the Christian calendar, the **Feast of the Presentation** is one of the oldest. "...on the fortieth day, Joseph and Mary brought the Lord into the Temple..." **Jesus —"the Light of the World"**
- **Candlemas Day** became a day in Christianity when Christians would take their candles to the church to be blessed. By placing candles in their windows, they felt blessings would be brought to their household for the remaining winter.
- During a plague in the sixth century in Constantinople, the emperor ordered huge prayer processions with candles during the Feast of the Presentation to ask God for deliverance from the disease. After the plague passed, the celebration of Candlemas spread throughout Europe.
- As time passed, the day took on another interpretation. The following English folksong highlights the idea of weather prognostication.

*"If Candlemas be fair and bright,
Come, Winter, have another flight;
If Candlemas brings clouds and rain,
Go Winter, and come not again."*

In Germany, an animal was introduced, and according to German lore, if a hedgehog saw his shadow on Candlemas Day, there would be a "Second Winter" or 6 more weeks of bad weather. As Germans came to America, namely Pennsylvania, so to came their folklore. In Punxsutawney, PA, in 1886, a groundhog was chosen to help predict the weather and thus **Groundhog Day** came about.

Even though Groundhog Day is a day to take everything a little less seriously and break up the winter monotony, let us not forget the importance of The Feast of the Presentation in our lives.

Not all young ones, to be sure, are properly described as meek. But it's certain that, one day, the children will inherit the land. TODAY'S READINGS: *Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13; 1 Corinthians 1:26-31; Matthew 5:1-12a (70). "Blessed are the meek, for they will inherit the land."*

Monday, Jan 30, 2023

The only way they'll know you are a Christian

Mohandas Gandhi, who led India's campaign for independence from British rule and whose birthday is today, once said, "If it weren't for Christians, I'd be a Christian." Followers of all religions, including Gandhi's Hinduism, at times do reprehensible things that run completely counter to what those religions teach. As a member of a colonized people, Gandhi certainly saw the worst of what Christians are capable of. But his statement isn't entirely a rebuke—Christ spoke to his heart. Jesus told us that we will be recognized as his disciples by our love for one another. Ask yourself how well you represent your faith.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Hebrews 11:32-40; Mark 5:1-20 (323). "Go home to your family and announce to them all that the Lord in his pity has done for you."*

Tuesday, Jan 31, 2023

A love that works

At the height of the Industrial Revolution, impoverished Italian boys were drawn to the city of Turin in search of factory work. But, for many reasons, they fell on hard times and were often jailed. Saint John Bosco helped them with lodging, education, vocational training, and just plain patience and loving care. He also protected young workers from unscrupulous employers by crafting signed apprenticeship agreements—the first real employment contracts used in Europe. He revolutionized the work of educators, too, writing: "Without confidence and love, there can be no true education. If you want to be loved . . . you must love yourselves, and make your children feel that you love them."

Faith gives us strength. It allows us to perform mighty deeds. But to be clear, as Brazilian writer Paulo Coelho explains, "Faith is not desire. Faith is will. Desires are things that need to be satisfied. Will is a force that changes everything around us." In God's realm, where our faith resides, we are each whole and complete and nothing is impossible. Address today's challenges through the lens of faith.

Make a perfect offering of your life

Today's feast marks an ancient Jewish tradition in which the firstborn child was "consecrated to the Lord" by way of two sacrificial turtle-doves or young pigeons offered at the Temple 40 days after birth. The mother, considered ritually unclean after giving birth, was also purified on this same day. But the visit of Mary and Joseph to present the infant Jesus is unique, marked by an outpouring of prophecy. Simon and Anna testify that a light has come into the world and that salvation is at hand. We honor the link to ancient tradition as we celebrate the Presentation today, but we also appreciate how Jesus not only fulfills but surpasses all the traditions of his time and place. Here at last is the perfect offering.

TODAY'S READINGS: *Malachi 3:1-4; Hebrews 2:14-18; Luke 2:22-40 (524). "The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him."*

Be a healing light

The historical details of Saint Blaise's fourth-century life in what is now modern-day Turkey are lost in the shroud of the centuries, but the tradition of his healing powers endures. The healing of throat diseases is what is most ascribed to him. When Blaise was imprisoned during a persecution of Christians, he apparently healed a choking boy with the aid of candles that lit his dark cell. On another level, the enduring tradition speaks to the ongoing need for healing that we all share. Whether it be a physical ailment or a wounded soul that needs tending, say a prayer today to Saint Blaise, the keeper of the flame.

Her own sweet dreams of freedom began with her mother singing old African-American spirituals that drew on biblical stories and psalms filled with cries of lament and hope for salvation. 
