FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Lenten fast and abstinence regulations for the Diocese of Worcester are as follows:

- ♦ Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics fourteen (14) years of age and older on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent.
- ◆ Fasting is to be observed by all Catholics who are eighteen (18) years of age but not yet fifty-nine (59) years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- ♦ Those who are bound to fast may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed Lenten penitential practices.

During the Wednesdays of Lent (except for Ash Wednesday), we will again show episodes from the critically acclaimed series "The Chosen" beginning at 7:00 PM in the parish center followed by a discussion. This proved to be very popular and was well attended last year. Please join us and bring a friend!

SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

The confession schedule will be expanded for Lent. Confessions will be heard on Saturdays from 11:00 AM until 12:00 noon and 2:30 to 3:30 PM in the church. There will be a Deanery Communal Penance Service during Holy Week on Tuesday, April 4th beginning at 6:30 PM, at Our Lady of Czestochowa Church, 34 Ward Street, Worcester. Monsignor Pedone and other priests will be available to hear confessions at that time. Confessions can be heard by appointment as well. Please call the parish center at 508 - 753-5001.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

The Season of Lent begins this week with Ash Wednesday, February 22nd . Lent is the season to observe and commemorate the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, the son of God, our Savior and Redeemer. It is an opportune time to reflect on what it means to be a follower of Christ.

Lent is meant to be a time of repentance. That's not a feeling of shame but an awareness that sin separates us from God and of what it cost Jesus to be reunited with us. Shame has its place, but feeling shame over sin is not the same thing as repentance from sin because our tempter, the devil, can take our obedience to God and turn it into a source of pride.

Lent is a time of inner reflection, self-sacrifice, and selfdenial. If something has a grip on you, more than likely, it's become unhealthy. It may or may not be an idol. Lent is an opportunity to grow closer to God, to remember Jesus' life and death, and to focus more on Him and less on ourselves and our busy schedules. Fasting, or abstaining, for certain activities and items in our lives can help us focus on the life and sacrifice of Jesus. Greater intimacy with God is the reward of sacrifice. These 40 days are set aside to praise and worship the Lord; to participate in Mass during the week, as well as on weekends, to take the opportunities to go to confession, to read the Bible more, to pray more often, especially the Rosary. Christians who observe Lent correctly anticipate deeper intimacy with the Lord, which is the blessing; they do not expect rewards such as more favorable answers to prayer or the resolution of health concerns, although many Christians have reported that, following Lent, they experience freedom from longstanding issues.

May this Lent be for you a special and holy time of grace and blessing as we prepare for the great celebration of Easter.


HOLY HOUR FOR THE EUCHARIST

THINK "LENT"

Guess what? <u>Lent starts this Wednesday!</u> Isn't it always the way? The Christmas season is behind us and it feels like Ordinary Time has only just begun—



Make a Plan:

1. <u>Prayer:</u> This Lent, try spending at least fifteen minutes in prayer a day. If you already do this, make the Rosary a daily habit. If you already do that, maybe add a Divine Mercy chaplet or a Holy Hour before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Give it some thought, and write down your commitment.

2. <u>Fasting:</u> Consider taking on some hard-core fasting. Maybe pick a few more days during Lent to practice the Ash Wednesday/Good Friday fast. Maybe have one or two meals a day on one particular day of the week. Some people manage to do a bread-and-water fast at least once a week. If all this sounds too overwhelming, you can simply stick to the requirements of the Church* and do them *well*—with your whole heart and soul.

Give it some thought, and write down your commitment.

*On all Fridays, Catholics are requested to abstain from meat. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 (with exceptions for expectant women, for example) are required to fast. We do this by having only one full meal that day and two smaller meals that, added together, do not amount to the full meal.

3. <u>Almsgiving</u>: Pray about what alms you can give and to who. Discuss it with Jesus. "Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7). Give it some thought, and write down your commitment.

PREPARE FOR LENT

What does it mean to Fast?

To fast is to do without food. Its purpose is to experience the effects of not eating. It also serves to be a penance or a sacrifice.—for the purpose of strengthening us. When we don't eat, we get hungry. When we get hungry, we have a heightened sense of awareness. In this state, we are more apt to ask God to purify us and prepare us to pray more deeply.

What does it mean to Abstain?

To abstain is to not eat meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. Its purpose is to be an act of penance—an act of sacrifice. Of course not eating meat and then having a more enjoyable meal instead would defeat the purpose. Some people do not eat meat so it is not an issue for them. Maybe abstaining from a meal you really want would be a sacrifice.

Merciful God,

you called us forth from the dust of the earth; you claimed us for Christ in the waters of Baptism. Look upon us as we enter these Forty Days bearing the mark of ashes, and bless our journey through the desert of Lent to the font of rebirth.

May our fasting be hunger for justice; our alms, a making of peace; our prayer, the chant of humble and grateful hearts.

All that we do and pray is in the name of Jesus, for in his Cross you proclaim your love forever and ever. Amen.




