

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### DEAR FRIENDS,

I've always enjoyed reading from the Acts of the Apostles, which is St. Luke's religious history of the early Church. It is read publicly after Easter to Pentecost as the first reading at Mass.

Acts give us a portrait of the early Church that is raw, conflicted, complex, and filled with uncertainty. It reminds me of the world in which we live.

A theme running throughout the book is the perpetual coexistence of struggle and hope. We begin with a severe persecution in Jerusalem following Stephen's martyrdom and the scattering of the first Christians to neighboring cities and regions. We end, unexpectedly, with great joy in the city of Samaria as those scattered Christians spread a life-giving message.

From severe persecution to great joy, all in one brief account. How is that possible? It would be naïve to assume that Philip and the early apostles had simply moved on from Jerusalem and found happiness in more welcoming places. No, the trauma from witnessing the suffering and death of their friends and family members was surely still weighing on them. How is it that Philip's words and charitable works in Samaria, fraught as they must have been with palpable anguish and confusion, could bring about great joy in others?

There is an enduring lesson for us in such accounts. Christian joy is not the absence of pain but the transfiguration of it. Only a belief and worldview that truly gets it—that is, one that compassionately recognizes, comprehends, and accompanies the trauma found in so much of our common human experience—is capable of simultaneously finding great joy. We, like Philip, do not seek pain as a prerequisite for joy, but neither do we naïvely presume that one negates the other. Great joy can be found when we set out, as the early apostles did, on this journey to become one with the Lord.

# SPONSOR/GODPARENT LETTERS AND CERTIFICATES

Often, I am asked to provide a letter indicating that a parishioner is qualified to serve as a godparent or a sponsor at a baptism outside of the parish or at a Confirmation. In order for me to provide this letter, or sign a letter/certificate from another parish, you must meet the following qualifications: you must be a registered member of this parish and attend Mass regularly; you must be a fully initiated Catholic, which means you have been baptized, received your First Communion and were confirmed in the Catholic Church; if married, your marriage must be a valid marriage recognized by the Catholic Church. Marriages before a Justice of the Peace or other civil official are not recognized by the Church as valid. Sometimes special circumstances arise, and I am happy to discuss these with you. Thank you for your understanding.

## Everything everywhere all the time

Thank Saint Athanasius upon reciting the word "consubstantial"—which used to be "one in being with the Father"—the next time you say the Nicene Creed. Athanasius, as deacon, did the theological homework for his bishop, Saint Alexander I, at the Council of Nicea. Together they resisted Arianism. Prior to the council, the central idea of Arianism had been slowly gaining traction among church leaders: that Jesus wasn't God, wasn't co-equal and co-eternal with the Father as taught by the Christian doctrine of the Trinity. As Athanasius insisted of Jesus and the Incarnation, "there is no part of creation deprived of his presence; together with his Father, he fills everything, everywhere, at all times."

## What remains is the legacy

Today the church celebrates the feast of two of the 12 apostles, Philip and James, a peculiar pair of martyrs not otherwise associated with one another in Christian history or tradition. James (also called James the Less) is regarded as the first Bishop of Jerusalem, while Philip was said to have preached in Greece, Turkey, and Syria. The pairing of their feast days is related to their shared reliquary in the Church of the Twelve Apostles, following a secret move from the Roman Catacombs. Thereafter lost to history for some time, their relics were rediscovered in the church crypt in the 19th century. On this holy feast, let's all remember the sacrifices of the church's first teachers and model their lives of holiness and faith.

#### We are a people with a history

When asked to speak at a gathering of the Jewish community in the early days of the church, Paul gives a history lesson. He recounts the liberating activity of God throughout Jewish history and ties God's activity directly to the arrival of Jesus the Messiah and the opening of salvation to all humanity. Our God is the God of history, and our human stories—personal and collective—are part of a much larger historical project of salvation. Play your part in the drama.

Saints and martyrs are the shining lights when it comes to witnessing to Jesus the Christ, often giving their whole lives and their very lives to communicate God's great love. We too are called to be witnesses. "But I'm no saint!" one might protest. "I can't witness like that." You don't have to be! Pope Francis reminds us that "God guides history through the humble courage of those who pray, love, and forgive. There are so many hidden saints, saints who are next-door, hidden witnesses of life, who with little acts of love change history." Next time in prayer, ask God how you've been a hidden witness of God's great love.

#### Choose your destination

But because we are free, we can choose to opt out of that destiny. Just like the people invited to the wedding feast in the Lord's parable, we can decide not to come or simply fail to show up. Just so, when we choose to live in hate rather than love, in violence rather than peace, in punishment rather than forgiveness, we're choosing another destiny. The choice is ours to make.


