FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

DEAR FRIENDS, Afghanistan is the only country in the world that won't let its women go to school — but that hasn't stopped some girls and their families from risking imprisonment — or worse — to get an education.

Shabana Basij-Rasikh comes from such a family. She was six years old when Afghanistan first fell to the Taliban. The Muslim extremists closed all girls' schools in the country — but Shabana's parents refused to keep their daughters locked up at home. They enrolled Shabana and her older sister in a clandestine school being run out of a former principal's living room. To avoid detection, Shabana's mother dressed her daughters as boys, complete with tee-shirts, pants and "buzz cuts." Those "secret schools," Shabana recalls, were "run by some of the bravest women I will ever know, and I was just one of the many girls who packed into these women's homes and living rooms as they quite literally risked their lives to educate us."

When the Taliban regime fell after the U.S. invasion in 2001, Shabana was able to go to a real school for the first time where she excelled. She won a place in a State Department program to spend a year of high school in the United States. She was placed with a host family in Wisconsin.

"It was the first time in my life where girls had no concerns whatsoever that their freedom to attend school could be taken away from them," Shabana remembers.

While a student at Middlebury College, Shabana conceived the idea for SOLA. Sola is the Afghan word "peace" and also short for "School for Leadership Afghanistan." Shabana envisioned not just a school to educate girls and young women in science, history, math and literature but to train them to be the leaders who will create Afghanistan's future. The first class was up and running in Kabul in 2011. Within five years, SOLA had expanded into a boarding school for girls in grades six through twelve.

SOLA continues to thrive in Rwanda, welcoming new students every year. The faculty is now designing an online academy. And Shabana Basij-Rasikh spends every waking hour preparing for a return to Afghanistan. "Educated girls grow to become educated woman, and educated women will not allow their children to become terrorists," Shabana believes. "The secret to a peaceful and prosperous Afghanistan is no secret at all: it is educated girls."

At the start of 2021, SOLA was thriving with a record number of applications and the construction of a new campus underway. SOLA graduates were going on to university and graduate school and launching professional careers. But that August, the Taliban returned to power when the United States withdrew. The Taliban cracked down on schools like SOLA. Shabana then accomplished the impossible: she moved the school 3,000 miles away to the African nation of Rwanda and, in an escape worthy of a Hollywood thriller, she managed to get the students, teachers, staff and staff families — 256 people in all — out of Kabul to the new campus on Rwanda.

Education is the "cross" that Shabana Basij-Rasikh has taken up; SOLA is the means she has embraced for transforming the cruel ignorance of the present into new opportunities for the future. In much the same way, the cross that Jesus asks his followers to take up is not a cross that cedes to crucifixion but a cross that is the means to resurrection. If we are true to Jesus' call to discipleship, we'll find the courage and wisdom to embrace values that contradict what society prizes; we'll move beyond our fears and doubts to take the first lonely and difficult steps toward reconciliation and peace; we'll discover within ourselves the selflessness to put aside our own needs and wants for what is best for family and community. Every one of us is called to take on such a cross in our lives: a cross that demands a great deal from us but a cross that means life, reconciliation and peace for others. The work of Christ's cross calls us to his same spirit of selfless, generous, sacrificial service to others enabling us to bring the hope and promise of his Resurrection into our badly hurting world.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

Children in public schools or non-Catholic private schools and academics should be attending religious education classes on a yearly basis. Children planning on receiving the Sacrament of First Holy Communion <u>must</u> attend classes for two years (Grade 1 and Grade 2.) Candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation <u>must</u> attend classes for two years (Grade 9 and Grade 10.)

Children in parochial schools and private Catholic schools are required to attend classes only for one year (the year of preparation.) First Holy Communion is usually received in Grade 2 and Confirmation in Grades 9 or above. Registration forms are available on our parish website or in the office at the Our Lady of Loreto Center, Monday – Thursday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. and in the vestibule of the church. There is a fee of \$35.00 per child or \$60.00 per family.

CCD Schedule

Classes will begin on Sunday, September 24. Grades Pre-K through Grade 4 will meet on Sunday mornings from 9:00 – 11:30 a.m. and includes attendance at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Parents are asked to attend Mass with their children. Attendance in the pre-K and Kindergarten are not mandatory. Grades 5 – 10 will meet on Sunday mornings from 11:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Students are required to attend Mass, it is suggested that they attend the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

Religious Education Parents Meeting

There are two meeting scheduled for parents; On Sunday, October 1 at 9:15 a.m. at the Our Lady of Loreto Center for all parents. These meetings are important, for they will include a description of the programs and will include discussions on the reception of the Sacraments of First Penance, and First Holy Communion.

There will be another meeting on Sunday, October 1 at 11:45 a.m. at the Our Lady of Loreto Center for parents of students planning on receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation either in the spring of 2024. Candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation <u>must</u> attend classes for two years if they attend a Public school, which includes private schools. (Grade 9 and Grade 10.) Students who attend parochial schools only need to attend one year of CCD.




