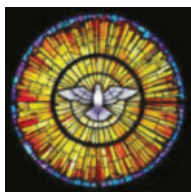

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

Children in public schools or non-Catholic private schools and academics should be attending religious education classes on a yearly basis. Children planning on receiving the Sacrament of First Holy Communion **must** attend classes for two years (Grade 1 and Grade 2.) Candidates for the Sacrament of Confirmation **must** attend classes for two years (Grade 9 and Grade 10.)

Children in parochial schools and private Catholic schools are required to attend classes only for one year (the year of preparation.) First Holy Communion is usually received in Grade 2 and Confirmation in Grades 9 or above. **Registration forms are available on our parish website or in the office at the Our Lady of Loreto Center, Monday – Thursday from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. and in the vestibule of the church.** There is a fee of \$35.00 per child or \$60.00 per family.

CCD Schedule

Classes began on Sunday, September 24. Grades Pre-K through Grade 4 will meet on Sunday mornings from 9:00 – 11:30 a.m. and includes attendance at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. Parents are asked to attend Mass with their children. Attendance in the pre-K and Kindergarten are not mandatory. Grades 5 – 10 will meet on Sunday mornings from 11:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Students are required to attend Mass, it is suggested that they attend the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

October is Respect Life Month

As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable., from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human being.

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

Fr. Tadeucz Pacholczyk is a Catholic priest, world renowned for his work as a neuroscientist. In an article in a recent CFP he noted that the number of young people with gender dysphoria has skyrocketed. Research has shown that many transgender identified children experience a “rapid onset on gender dysphoria” in which one, several or even a group of friends become transgender identified in a similar timeframe. Peer pressure? I have seen this in my own family where friends have approached a granddaughter with the reasoning that “how do you know unless you try it”. Typical age is around 16 with more than 75% girls. Teenage girls with no prior history of gender dysphoria are now the predominate demographic. Experts say this sudden experience is due to mental conditions mistakenly identified as trans because of social pressure. One survey reported that 60% of parents say this “coming out” resulted in increased popularity among peers. Many of these youths reportedly had psychiatric diagnoses and almost half engaged in self harm prior to gender dysphoria. Evidence shows that transitioning can worsen mental health and suicide. Claims that transitioning can reduce the risk of suicide remain unfounded. This surge in transgenderism may be explained by adolescents unable to cope with the everyday challenges of social, sexual, family or peer pressures. Another factor is authority figures, teachers, doctors, therapists, have encouraged the idea of transgenderism. They pressure parents, stating incorrectly, of increased suicidal incidents. Powerful pressure on impressionable youths and parents presents permanent damage through hormonal and surgical treatment. Young people need support and encouragement. Most youths will outgrow their dysphoria once they pass through their turbulent adolescent years. And as always, pray for guidance.

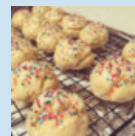
CEMETERY BASKETS

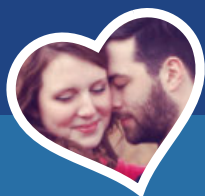
