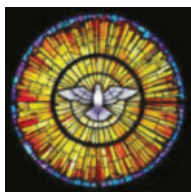

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

I recently came across this article from the Boston Globe that I would like to share with you. It was written by Francis Storrs about his twin daughters turning thirteen. I found it has a lot to say to all of us:

"(Francis') twin girls have just turned 13 — of course, he's known for 13 years that age was coming yet, still, it caught him by surprise. How did those years go by so fast?

"There were a lot of things I didn't know before I became a father," he writes. "How to change diapers. How to do Tik-Tok dances. How to realize sooner that it's horribly embarrassing to watch your dad try to do TikTok dances . . . I suspect there are a lot of things new parents don't know, like how your kids are probably going to outgrow believing in fairies, and maybe even some of the magic of Christmas. How spectacularly unprepared you'll be for pretty much . . . everything.

"If you're a new parent, you might not know that on more nights than you'll care to admit, you're going to wish they'd just go to sleep already. Later, you'll be sorry you were in such a rush. Sorry you worked late so often. Sorry you stared at your phone when you should've been sitting on the floor playing make-believe.

"You might not know that some of the things you found annoying are what you'll miss most. For years, no matter what errand we were driving to, every playground we passed was met with pleas of 'Can we go?' from the back seat. We stopped often, and also not nearly often enough. There's an awful lot I would give to be asked that again . . .

"Here's one that I didn't know: One day you'll put your child down from a piggyback ride, and then you'll never pick her up again."



RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

Chatbox Charley. What is that? It is the latest technique for women to get an abortion. Options for an unplanned pregnancy are on the internet. This website, Chatbox Charley, offers automated answers that direct a woman to get an abortion without ever talking to another person. The bot sends the woman to an abortion pill website, tells minors how to get an abortion by circumventing state laws and without parental consent, and tells women that pregnancy crisis centers are “fake clinics”. The bot begins by asking the woman if she would prefer an abortion procedure or the abortion pills. It does not ask the age of the woman or date of last period to determine the length of the pregnancy. It only asks if you would like to pick up your pills at the clinic or have them mailed to you. No clinical support is provided. If the woman indicates a pregnancy beyond 10 weeks, the woman is directed to a Miscarriage and Abortion Hotline without mentioning the increased risk of complications that occur after 10 weeks of pregnancy. The bot does not provide alternatives to abortions. Changing laws may provide inaccurate information to women. At the end of the exchange, the bot warns the user that pregnancy crisis centers are fake clinics that give you false information about your condition. However there are 3000 pregnancy resource centers nationally that adhere to all standards of ethics when dealing with pregnant women. Abortion clinics make Their money on abortions. It’s their “Golden Egg”.

76% of women who had an abortion say they would have preferred to keep their baby if circumstances were different. If Chatbox Charley offers only one option, abortion, then they are not doing women a service. The Worcester City Council recently voted 7-4 to NOT regulate pregnancy crisis centers, that some argue have false advertising practices, and no counseling for abortion. It’s a win for pro-life. Now we have to stop state laws that want to regulate pregnancy crisis centers. Hard work and prayers are working, and remember God is on our side. Let’s keep up the “good work”.
