

Dear Friends.

Be watchful! Be alert!

This weekend we begin the holy season of Advent. This is the perfect time to examine our lives and wake up to the urgent call of life within us. Take the time during this Advent season to avail yourselves of the Sacrament of Reconciliation to unburden yourselves of some dead wood. The old year is dying; think of old habits that could likewise be put to rest here and now. We may need to make changes so that our significant relationships may be more lifegiving. How can we move in that direction, and how might we ask God to "return" as well? Sometimes the movement required is monumental, like leaving situations of abuse or injustice behind. Or facing our addictions and admitting we need outside help. Sometimes the cost of change will be extraordinary. But what is the cost of remaining as we are?

Because the time is short, whether we can measure it in years or minutes. We do not know when the time of the great "arrival from ahead of us" will come, as the Scripture scholar Jürgen Moltmann put it, nor do we know the hour of our death. Jesus is coming, and we can't just "look busy," as the T-shirt slogan once advised. The time to change is now or never.

May we use this holy season of Advent to prepare us for the great season of Christmas, to welcome Jesus more fully into our hearts and souls. May Advent be a special time of multiple graces for you and your family.

The Season of Advent

In the Catholic Church, Advent is a period of preparation, extending over four Sundays, before Christmas. The word Advent comes from the Latin *advenio*, "to come to," and refers to the coming of Christ. This refers, first of all, to our celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas; but, second, to the coming of Christ in our lives through grace and the Sacrament of Holy Communion; and finally, to His second coming at the end of time.

Let us spiritually prepare for Christmas! "Let every heart prepare Him room"! Celebrate Advent!

Celebrate Advent by Lighting a <u>Candle</u>

The season of Advent begins on the weekend of Dec. 2-3. Beginning on that weekend, the traditional Advent wreath will be set up in our sanctuary. We invite you and your family to come forward at the beginning of each Mass

RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

Men and abortion. Women say "My body, my choice". But what about the men? The baby is just as much the father's as the mother's. We hear nothing from fathers. Men will say, "I'll support you in whatever you choose", learning of an unexpected pregnancy. Does that mean they will support an abortion? Some men avoid their responsibilities. Abortion was legalized by an all-male Supreme Court, men own the abortion clinics and most abortion doctors are men. Aren't men supposed to be the protectors of women and children? Our Constitution declares our patriotic purpose to, "Secure the Blessing of Liberty to ourselves and our posterity". Posterity is defined as "all future generations of people and descendants of those people". That includes the unborn. We have a responsibility to protect their lives and liberty. Some men accept these responsibilities, others run away from them. Men have an obligation to stand up for their actions.

Other men have not had any lasting success obtaining constitutional rights in courts with respect to abortion. These men have been pushed to the sidelines. Men have tried arguments focused on marital rights equality and on individual circumstances. They have all failed in court. All court decisions regarding constitutional rights and privacy have been in favor of protecting women from governmental interference with an unfettered right to abortion at any time and for any reason. Gestation is the deciding factor in who has abortion rights. Men, after many attempts in court, have no rights in the abortion decision. Men should have equal rights to their child. Advocates for men must keep fighting for their rights. It is their baby too. Every baby that can be saved is a blessing.


