January 25 marks the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle...

St. Paul, named Saul at his circumcision, was born at Tarsus, the capitol of Cilicia. He was a Roman citizen. He was brought up as a strict Jew, and later became a violent persecutor of the Christians. While on his way to Damascus to make new arrests of Christians, he was suddenly converted by a miraculous apparition of Our Lord. From a fierce persecutor he became the great Apostle of the Gentiles. He made three missionary journeys which brought him to the great centers of Asia Minor and southern Europe, and made many converts. Fourteen of his Epistles are found in the New Testament. He was beheaded in Rome around 66 A.D., and his relics are in the Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls near the Ostian Way.

BUILDING ON OUR FAITH, BUILDING ON OUR FUTURE

For the past several weeks, we have been publishing an announcement entitled Building On Our Faith, Building On Our Future. It has been apparent to me and to the Parish and Finance Councils that our revenues from our weekly collections are not meeting our expenses, and haven't for some time, despite significant attempts to trim our expenses. Every week we publish a list of monies collected and how that money is spent and the number the Finance Committee has determined we need to collect in order to meet those expenses - \$8400. Almost weekly we are between \$1500 to \$2500 dollars short. That shortage has mushroomed to a deficit of \$25,000 to \$30,000 annually and it continues to grow. Our yearly Italian Festival raises a significant amount of money, but we cannot rely on this income stream because a lot of variables could affect the amount of money, we are able to raise. We cannot allow this shortfall to continue, and we must begin to address this serious matter now.

This weekend we will have Commitment Weekend during which I will respectfully request that each parish family and household prayerfully look at their weekly gift to the parish and, if possible, to increase it. A number of you have already responded to the mailing that went out last week and I am grateful for your response. I've asked Dominic Mercurio of our Parish Finance Council to speak at all the Masses this weekend about this vital undertaking. Thank you for your continued support and generosity to our parish.

NEW KITCHEN

As many of you know, the kitchen in the church hall is out of code concerning the regulations of the City of Worcester. Consequently, we are unable to use it for parish functions. We are facing prohibitive costs to remodel it. I hired Mr. Michael Pagano, a Worcester architect and a member of our Property Committee, who began a feasibility study to offer suggestions about undergoing an expensive remodeling of the current kitchen or relocating it in the parish center. Michael reported to me and the Parish Council recently and recommends relocating the kitchen in the parish center. I have accepted that recommendation and we will move forward with an extensive remodeling of the parish center to accommodate a larger kitchen and gathering space that will be more easily handicap accessible. I will keep you informed as we begin this project.

Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children

The importance of restoring legal protection for the unborn continues to be a priority for the U.S. Church. In 2004, the bishops of the United States highlighted the importance of praying for the protection of human life, by designating January 22 as a particular day of prayer and penance called the *Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children* (General Instruction of the Roman Missal, n. 373).

All the faithful in dioceses throughout the country are called to observe this day in a spirit of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for the violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion.

We can observe this day through special prayers, fasting, sacrifices, and acts of charity (similar to our Lenten practices), both communally in our parishes as well as individually in our own spiritual lives.


