#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends.

In 1963, a student rabbi was sent to a small southern town to conduct Yom Kippur services at a synagogue too small to have a resident rabbi. The night before there had been a heavy rain, and the gutters along the road were full of mud. Approaching him on the narrow sidewalk was an old black woman, toothless, dressed in a faded calico dress, a ragged straw hat on her head, and canvas shoes with holes in them on her feet. Her head was bowed. When she was about twenty feet away, she stepped into the muddy gutter to let the young rabbinical student pass.

The student thought to himself that, given the teachings of the Talmud as well as simple human decency, he should be the one to step into the muddy gutter and let the old woman pass.

The moment had a profound and lasting effect on the student, now a distinguished theologian and professor. Forty-five years later, he still remembers the incident:

"To that old black woman, I did not represent the Torah or basic human decency. To her I represented centuries of those who have publicly humiliated her people. Her long experience had taught that her safety, maybe even her life, depended on humiliating herself. So, on the holiest day of the year, when I was supposed to feel that I was being cleansed before God, I felt profoundly dirty not for what I had done but for what I represented [to this woman] who had so debased herself because of my very presence before her."

Today's Gospel portrays Jesus as a teacher who possesses an "authority" immediately perceived by his hearers, authority that is centered in the example of his own compassion and empathy for those he has been called to serve. Such an authority comes not from the power to enforce but from the ability to inspire.

The student rabbi discovers that his ministry will find its fulfillment not in his exalted status before a future congregation but in the life he will struggle to lead in their midst as he seeks to bring them to God. May we seek to possess the "authority" of the Gospel Jesus: to become men and women of empathy, compassion and selfless generosity for those we are called to teach, guide and serve.

#### Did you know....

#### February 2nd is significant in several ways.

- Among the many feasts in the Christian calendar, the <u>Feast of the Presentation</u> is one of the oldest. "...on the fortieth day, Joseph and Mary brought the Lord into the Temple..." <u>Jesus</u>——"the Light of the World"
- <u>Candlemas Day</u> became a day in Christianity when Christians would take their candles to the church to be blessed. By placing candles in their windows, they felt blessings would be brought to their household for the remaining winter.
- During a plague in the sixth century in Constantinople, the emperor ordered huge prayer processions with candles during the Feast of the Presentation to ask God for deliverance from the disease. After the plague passed, the celebration of Candlemas spread throughout Europe.
- As time passed, the day took on another interpretation.
   The following English folksong highlights the idea of weather prognostication.

"If Candlemas be fair and bright, Come, Winter, have another flight; If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, Go Winter, and come not again."

In Germany, an animal was introduced, and according to German lore, if a hedgehog saw his shadow on Candlemas Day, there would be a "Second Winter" or 6 more weeks of bad weather. As Germans came to America, namely Pennsylvania, so also came their folklore. In Punxsutawney, PA, in 1886, a groundhog was chosen to help predict the weather and thus **Groundhog Day** came about.

Even though Groundhog Day is a day to take everything a little less seriously and break up the winter mol notony, let us not forget the importance, in our lives, of

The Feast of the Presentation

#### Lent is coming.....

In a few weeks, we will begin our Lenten journey. It is a time when we are reminded that the Lord calls us to repentance and self-denial. Will you be ready for Lent?

#### THINK "LENT"

Don't blink. Lent will be here before you know it. Isn't that how it always is? The Christmas season is behind us and it feels like Ordinary Time has only just begun—

But suddenly it's Ash Wednesday, and we're scrambling to decide what we're doing for Lent and wondering whether our choice of penance is too hard or too easy. This year, don't let Lent take you by surprise—have your plan in place.

#### <u>Make a Plan:</u>

1. <u>Prayer:</u> This Lent, try spending at least fifteen minutes in prayer a day. If you already do this, make the Rosary a daily habit. If you already do that, maybe add a Divine Mercy chaplet or a Holy Hour before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Give it some thought, and write down your commitment.

2. <u>Fasting:</u> Consider taking on some hard-core fasting. Maybe pick a few more days during Lent to practice the Ash Wednesday/Good Friday fast. Maybe have one or two meals a day on one particular day of the week. Some people manage to do a bread-and-water fast at least once a week. If all this sounds too overwhelming, you can simply stick to the requirements of the Church\* and do them *well*—with your whole heart and soul.

Give it some thought, and write down your commitment.

- \*On all Fridays, Catholics are requested to abstain from meat. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 (with exceptions for expectant women, for example) are required to fast. We do this by having only one full meal that day and two smaller meals that, added together, do not amount to the full meal.
- 3. <u>Almsgiving</u>: Pray about what alms you can give and to who. Discuss it with Jesus. "Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:7). Give it some thought, and write down your commitment.

#### RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY




