Dear Catechists,

It is with great joy that we present to you the newly updated Foundational Faith Formation process for the now Archdiocese of Las Vegas! I also take this opportunity to introduce the newest staff person in the Department of Faith Formation, David Hall. David's job title is *Coordinator of Adult Faith Formation* and his primary responsibility is the certification processes here in the Archdiocese. He will be working closely with all of you to meet our ultimate goal of having everyone involved in ongoing adult faith formation!

All adult Catholics are highly encouraged to enrich their own spirituality and understanding of our faith, however it is most important for those of us who choose to participate in the catechetical mission of the church. The word catechist comes from the Greek word *catechesis* meaning *to sound from above* or to *echo*. Catechists have the mission, the responsibility, the privilege, the vocation of echoing God's word to all people. We cannot *echo* what we do not know and practice ourselves.

In the New Directory for Catechesis Article 425, we read that, "The diocesan catechetical office is to pay particular attention to the formation of catechists, knowing well that the Holy Spirit uses their valuable and expert collaboration in order that the Gospel may be welcomed by all." To this end, it is our goal to provide opportunities for adult faith formation on an archdiocesan level that enrich and enhance our own understanding and enable us to be faithful *echoes of faith* to those we encounter.

We hope you find this packet easy to navigate and self-explanatory. For your own ease in recordkeeping, we suggest that you fill out the information for each course as you complete it instead of trying to remember everything after the fact. Once you have completed all of the courses in this packet, you can fill out the application form and turn the entire packet in to your Director of Religious Education.
