A Life Ordered through Baptism

It is no accident that as the Christmas Season concludes, the next major liturgical moment ushering us into Ordinary Time is the Baptism of the Lord. We may ask "Why was the Lord baptised?" After all, he was not a sinner, and John's baptism was one of repentance.

In short, Jesus was not baptised for himself. No, he was baptised for us. Moreover, the waters had no cleansing or reintegrating effect on him. The waters did not consecrate him. Rather, Jesus baptised the waters! After Israel's long history with water in the story of salvation - think of the creation story, the Hebrews passing through the Red Sea, Noah and the flood, Namaan the Syrian, and so on - Our Lord has desired to give us this Sacrament, that we might receive salvation through water and the Holy Spirit.

Friends, through Baptism, your Christian life had a definitive beginning. You were cleansed of original sin, grafted into the Mystical Body of Christ, adopted into the privileged filial relationship that Jesus alone has with the Heavenly Father, and you took on the offices of Priest, Prophet, and King. You have a mission, and the power and authority to fulfill it, thanks to your baptism.

As Ordinary Time recommences, consider the importance of your own baptism. Examine where your missionary energy has been employed so far and where the Lord may be calling you in 2025. Be bold, renew your baptismal promises frequently, and enjoy God's favour resting on you!

CHILDREN'S SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM 2025

The program for baptised children will commence in Term 1, watch your Catholic school newsletters in the New Year for starting dates.

Eligibility:

Children must be baptised Catholics who are at least nine (9) years of age during the year.

What if a child is not a baptised Catholic?

- 1. If the child is between seven & 12 yrs of age and not baptised Catholic, they ca be prepared through the Rite of Christian Initiation for Children of Catechetical Age (RCCCA).
- If a child is baptised in another Christian denomination they don't have to be baptised again. Instead, a Rite of Welcome is celebrated for those eligible for this program.





ECUMENICAL CORNER— Chapter 4: the Anglican Communion

Speaking on the dialogue which exists between Catholics and the Anglican communion, Putney acknowledges the major "obstacles" of episcopal succession and ordination but affirms "it is very important to speak the truth... and not avoid the hard, even tension-filled issues."
