Writing about the Lord's Prayer that we hear in today's Gospel, St. Cyril of Jerusalem, bishop and martyr, and a great teacher and preacher pointed out how the model of Christian prayer "...begins with God, putting his purposes first, and then goes on to our needs, but only insofar as they fit in with God's purposes."

"Above all he who preaches peace and unity did not want us to pray by ourselves in private or for ourselves alone. We do not say "My Father, who are in heaven" nor "Give me this day my daily bread." It is not for himself alone that each person asks to be forgiven, not to be led into temptation or to be delivered from evil. Rather we pray in public as a community, and not for one individual but for all. For the people of God are all one."

"We are new men; we have been reborn and restored to God by his grace. We have already begun to be his sons and we can say "Father." John reminds us of this...*But to all who received him, who believe in his name, he gave the power to become children of God.* Profess your belief that you are sons of God by giving thanks. Call upon God who is your Father in heaven."

"We go on to say, *May your name be hallowed.* It is not that we think to make God holy by our prayers; rather we are asking God that his name may be made holy in us. Indeed, how could God be made holy, he who is the source of holiness? Still, because he himself said: Be holy, for I am holy, we pray and beseech him

that we who have been hallowed in baptism may persevere in what we have begun.”

“*Your Kingdom come.* We pray that God's kingdom will become present for us in the same way that we ask for his name to be hallowed among us. For when does God not reign, when could there be in him a beginning of what always was and what will never cease to be? What we pray for is that the kingdom promised to us by God will come, the kingdom won by Christ's blood and passion.”


“*Daily Bread.* We can understand this petition in a spiritual and in a literal sense. For in the divine plan both senses may help toward our salvation. For Christ is the bread of life; this bread does not belong to everyone but is ours alone. When we say, our Father, we understand that he is the father of those who know him and believe in him. In the same way we speak of our daily bread, because it is the bread of those who touch his body.”

“The gift of bread is followed by a prayer for forgiveness. To be reminded that we are sinners and forced to ask forgiveness for our faults is prudent and sound.

The greatest offering, we can make to God is our peace, harmony among fellow Christians, a people united with the unity of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.”

What is the Lord's Prayer calling us too today? Perhaps a Kingdom of forgiveness and daily bread which leads to salvation not just for us, but for all. I believe we are called to a more expansive vision of the Church which looks beyond itself as it strives to bring all God's beloved creation into the peace of His Kingdom.

When you pray, pray for others first, and then for yourself if you have time. When you hope for salvation, put others in line at the heavenly gates ahead of you. When you hunger for daily bread, make sure you are hungering not only for your own satisfaction, but in solidarity with all the hungry. This is the way to the Kingdom to come!

Family of Parishes Staff Retreat

Last week, the pastoral staffs from our 6 parishes came together at St. Paul of the Cross Retreat Center in Detroit. Here, we were invited into prayer, renewal, and a first real coming together of the various staffs. It was a powerful experience, led by Fr. Steve Pullis, a priest of our diocese who is now serving full time at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit.

During the retreat, we talked about how we can respond to a changing culture which has become more and more secular. We also discussed what the mission of our family of parishes is and how we participate in this great mission of sharing Christ and accompanying people inside and outside the Church toward an encounter with Jesus Christ. Deacon Steve Mitchell also gave us some helpful demographics of who is residing within the parish boundaries of each parish in the family. 
- ◆ How can each of us recognize who is not around the table with us anymore?


