In composing his gospel, Luke, betrays a practical side to character. In this Sunday's gospel he teaches us about the call to discipleship through the world of economics. Luke did not make up this teaching, however, is the prophetic teaching of Jesus in line with the tradition of earlier prophets such as Amos.

In today's gospel the rich man had a steward (*oikonomos*, manager, treasurer) who was accused of wasting money. It helps to recall that this parable follows that of the prodigal son in 15:13-19, which we heard last week! Both the son and the manager had wasted (*diaskoptizo*; the same verb in each case) goods entrusted to them, and then each one "repented" or reflected on a course of action to get out of the predicament. The manager was then praised for his practical sense in planning ahead for the day he would be out of a job.

The conclusion to this parable, to make friends with the "mammon of unrighteousness", is a perplexing one. The word "mammon" (*mamonas*, money, wealth, property) is not found in the Hebrew Bible but is found in other Jewish writings. The Greek word is apparently a derivation from an Aramaic root meaning "That in which one trusts." Luke's conclusion, then is to not place one's trust in earthly goods - because they inevitably fail - but only use them and be on friendly terms with them. Perhaps, in our day and age, the concept of "mammon" could be extended beyond money, to politicians, ideologies, even the accustomed patterns of living in the church, or in our lives. They are useful to the extent that they lead to the kingdom. I am

often reminded of this when change makes me uncomfortable. I believe we grow so accustomed to “the way things are” that we sometimes canonize the status quo. Without periodic critical reflection on the status quo, on our habits and customs, we may end up holding on tight to them at the expense of the gospel. Perhaps this is what Jesus means when in encourages us to make use of “mammon” on the way to the kingdom, while cautioning not to hold on too tight to what we know. The love of God that awaits us is so much more that the mundane habits we create for ourselves. That is why it is said we should store up “riches in heaven.” The disciple must choose to serve God, and merely use mammon. if not, it will be a case of serving mammon and "using" God.

Last week many of us enjoyed St. Cyprian Parish picnic. There was food and games and fun and fellowship. Today it is St. Joseph and St. Timothy’s turn to celebrate on the grounds of St. Timothy parish and next week, Sacred Heart, Grosse Ile and Our Lady of the Woods, Woodhaven. Come and connect! When we celebrate with each other, we realize the greatest treasure of all!


Catechetical Sunday


