Dear Parish Family,

How much of the news are you watching these days? How much joy and courage is it bringing you?

This past Friday's Mass we read from 2 Timothy 3, "But wicked people and charlatans will go from bad to worse, deceivers and deceived. But you, remain faithful to what you have learned and believed. . . ." St. Paul is reminding us that when man made and natural evils strike there will be wicked men, and charlatans who will exploit the evil for personal gain. They will build evil upon evil, and will attempt to get us to live in fear. We are not called to live in fear as Christians. Rather we are called to live by what we have been taught. We remain in the teachings of Christ through these evils, and stay vigilant so as not to be deceived by charlatans, and wicked men.

One way to do this is to turn off the news. If you want to stay up to date on current matters, consume some news in moderation, but be careful. The news, many times, will use fear as a way to captivate us, but what it really does is capture us. We become captive to the fears upon which they play. So turn off the TV, and get away from Facebook. Open the Scriptures instead, and spend time with the Word Christ has given us. Foster goodness within your own home, and in your neighborhoods. That is how we respond to evils both man made and natural.
