## We are not orphans. The Spirit lives in us.

The human spirit is amazing in its ability to come back to life when the body is suffering or struggling. It is not easy; it is extremely hard to overcome many of the obstacles that we face in life, but this story is an inspiration to anyone who will listen. Today, St. Peter reminds us to bear witness to the Lord by the simple goodness of our lives, and by the hope that is in us for the joys of the life to come. In the midst of persecution and ill treatment Peter points out the gentle way and urges us to persevere in it. He points to the Lord who, though innocent, "died for the guilty, to lead us to God". The Lord himself is truly unconquered one, risen from the dead to be our life, inside of us now. It is the Spirit of this unconquered Lord that is given to us now to be our life and our inspiration for good in this world of sin. The Lord told his disciples before his death, "I will not leave you orphans." It is a powerful statement and a vital promise. Orphans are vulnerable people, unsheltered and unprotected from the dangers of this world. They lack the loving care that rightly should be theirs. They are left alone in this world unless someone will love them.

We are not orphans. The life-giving Spirit is given to us in our baptism and confirmation and in the community of the Church. Without the lifegiving Spirit there would be no Church—instead just a fading memory of someone who once lived among us, a good man who lived and died many years ago. But the one who died, rose again. He is the unconquered one and it is his Spirit that now animates his Church and all its members. It is by the power of that Spirit that we can live lives of simple goodness, faithfulness and kindness to others, even when others are not kind to us. It is precisely in times of hardship and persecution that the strength of the Spirit is to be seen in our lives. Persecution does not only mean the oppression of religious believers. It means any kind of human oppression, be it sickness or human hostility, family feuds, conflicts at work and arguments with friends and neighbors; all these are the daily tests of life where the unconquered Spirit of the Lord can be at work. The Spirit is given to us precisely to overcome these everyday difficulties. Remember, the Spirit is a person, not a thing, not a ghost, not imagination; but the Person-Fr. Keith Jesus.

## May 14, 2023 6th Sunday of Easter

My dad was adopted as a baby. It's a big part of my family's story. His birth mother placed him in a Catholic orphanage not long after birth. A young couple longing for a baby strolled among the bassinets. My father, then only a few months old, looked at the husband and smiled. The man said, "That's my son." They took him home and the family grew. This moment of adoption was a wonderful truth they celebrated even when my dad was a young boy. They told him, "You're even more special than the other children, because we chose you to be our son." My dad's eyes well up with tears of gratitude whenever he tells the story, even eighty-three years later.

What is your story? Do we think or act like unwanted orphans? Who do we believe ourselves to be? As we continue to ponder Jesus' resurrection, we hear him say to us this Sunday, "I will not leave you orphans." God doesn't leave us alone like spiritual orphans. The power that raised Jesus from the dead is the Holy Spirit, who is also called the Spirit of Adoption. He chooses us to be His children, to share God's life forever.
