Financial Report for Fiscal Year 2025

A message from Reverend Laurence “Ren” Tocci, Pastor



Dear Parishioners,

Thanks to your financial support, and our efforts to control expenses, we had a very good year this past fiscal year. We ended the 2025 fiscal year in the black by **\$75,000**, which included a net operating income of \$44,000 and a net non-operating income of \$31,000. Across the board, the income received exceeded budget, and the expenses were less than what the budget called for. The detailed report included below shows all the operating and non-operating financial activities of the parish, including My Brother's Table. A similar reporting of the cemetery activities is also available below along with the total cash-on-hand of the parish and cemetery.

The cemetery's bottom line doesn't look so optimistic for FY 2025. We didn't sell many lots or columbarium niches this year, nor did we have many grave openings or burials. We were able to save on cemetery maintenance expenses thanks to the free-of-charge service offered by a faithful parishioner. Some monies from openings that we did, came after the fiscal year closed, so it shows on our records as a red line-item.

We have projected a conservative parish budget for this fiscal year 2026 for various reasons. We're planning for less income in offertory, as well as \$15,000 less in Faith Formation revenue due to the decision to cut our fees in half as we introduce our new program. We also saw \$23,000 more in insurance costs, since hiring a new staff member. We had reduced the staff when our parish Director of Communications resigned. But now that we're back in the full swing of things from the pandemic, we assessed our parish's needs and saw that we had to hire a new Administrative Assistant, while Kat became dedicated solely to parish communications and sacramental records.

We also needed to add \$13,000 for landscaping at St. Zepherin. A wonderful parishioner, Michael Mullins, had been doing the landscaping at a minimal cost for us. However, his health has required him to step down from this position. Please keep Mike and his step-daughter in your prayers.

I know last year was a big change for our parish, and I want to thank you all for being patient with me as I adjusted to Good Shepherd—and as you adjusted to me! This year promises to bring some exciting new life to Good Shepherd. The new Faith Formation program, Pathways, is off to a great start—much better than I had expected. We've had over eighty families registered, much more than I had thought we were going to see. In fact, we have hit capacity and had to close registration. The first meeting went very well, and I'll be excited to see how this program works.

We're also adding some events. Deborah Webster volunteered to put our parish library back in order, and has done an outstanding job this summer in doing so. Please visit it at St. Ann; it's open Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays until 3:00pm, and Saturdays until Mass at 4:00pm.

Deborah also has initiated a book group: the Emmaus Readers. We have ten participants in our fall session, reading Henri Nouwen's book *The Return of the Prodigal Son*, and I hear that it's going well. We're planning on introducing an evening Bible study event, to complement the one Pheme Perkins is running for us on Tuesday mornings. Sally DeGeorge will be leading this for us—stay tuned for more details!

We're also offering more spiritual and prayer events this year. Next month, through the courtesy of Shalom World Ministries, we'll be hosting "Jesus Heals": an evening of Mass, Adoration, and Prayers for Healing. We're also participating in the nationwide Rosary Rally next month, and will have a parish Lenten mission this March. All of this in addition to the bi-weekly Holy Hour we introduced last Advent and will be continuing this year.

We also plan on introducing a men's group in January. Cor is a template of a men's group put together by the Knights of Columbus—though it's not exclusively put on by the K of C. This year we'll be focusing on the Lord's Prayer for regular meetings of men to gather for friendship and prayer.

Speaking of the Knights, we've had five men show interest in joining our council. We also have two folks who have signed up for the Order of Christian Initiation, and we hope to bring them into the Church this Easter. Last year we welcomed two newly baptized Christians into Good Shepherd and welcomed a third Christian into the Catholic Faith.

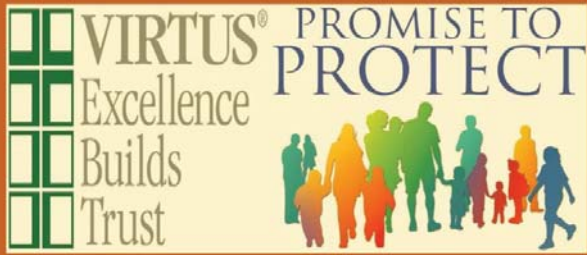

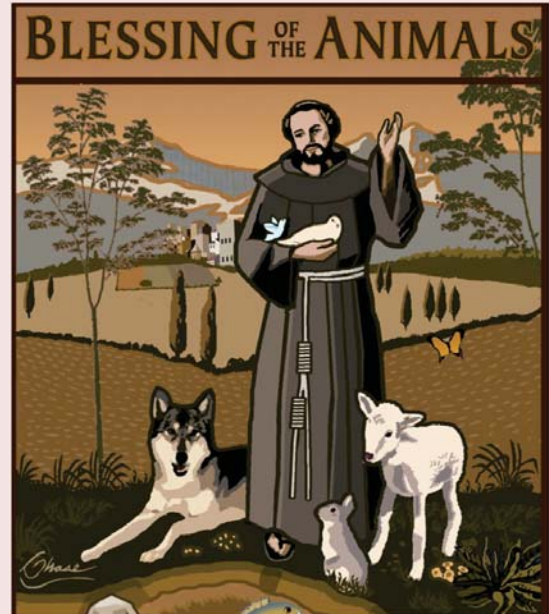
Tom Coan, Child Safety Program Coordinator, will be available after each Mass on the weekend of September 13/14 to help you complete your 2026 Child Safety's documents.

GUARD THE DOOR

How clueless the richest 1% depicted in the first reading (Amos 6:4-7) be? Jesus tells the story of an unnamed mega-rich man and the destitute beggar, Lazarus, that suggest even in hell some people don't get it. A rich man's banquet would include 7 courses: appetizers, 3 entrees, 2 kinds of roast, dessert. Heavy drinking followed the meal. So, every day...?! Certainly, plenty food littering the floor. Visitors to Pompeii can see the mosaic of a snarling, chained black dog with the label 'Beware, the dog' that guards the doorway of a rich house. Jesus lays Lazarus at this man's door with street dogs licking his sores. Every day the man and his guests have stepped over and ignored that scene.

Flash forward to the afterlife. Roman funerary mosaics depict the deceased reclining on a luxury dining couch with their drinking cup of "immortality", cupids bringing roses, and Psyche entertaining on a stringed instrument. Transferred to Jewish visuals, there's Lazarus reclining alongside father Abraham. The rich man even knows Lazarus' name, but takes no responsibility for failing to alleviate that suffering. Instead, he starts negotiating, first for himself – an impossibility that he doesn't notice – then that Lazarus make a Dickens-like appearance from the dead to warn his five living brothers lest they join him in hell.

Against the rich man's assumption that a miracle could cure the "wealth-induced blindness" that prophets opposed, moves Jesus to confirm the moral importance of Mosaic teaching. "If they won't listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead," (Lk 16:31). Instead of shouting against the clueless, socially destructive, wealthy elite, Jesus addresses an audience that includes Pharisees who are respected teachers of Mosaic Law with a comic tone. No fine mosaic guard dog for this man's door. Easily walked over, but a living human being with the street dogs licking his sores ...? Nor can he notice a fiery canyon that would also prevent the righteous from bringing relief to suffering sinners.

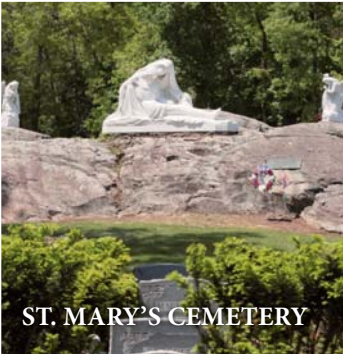

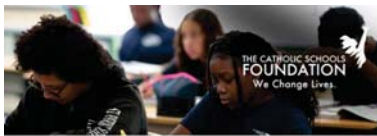
