

Has Jesus Been Calling You to Spend Time with Him?

For any relationship to thrive, continue to grow, and deepen, we must share ourselves through time spent together and through conversation. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament at St. Vincent de Pau is your opportunity, on Fridays from 9 a.m. - 7 p.m., to be with Jesus. He invites you to spend time with him. He waits for you in the church, and looks forward to spending time with you. He waits to hear all you have to tell him, and all that you have to ask of him. He waits for you to open your heart to hear what he has to say to you.

An hour in adoration is your personal time with Jesus to cultivate a true relationship with Him. Sit quietly, or have a silent heart to heart conversation. Be present to Jesus as He is Present to you. Adore him-show him love and Gratitude. Consider his humility as he avails himself to you.

In adoration of the Blessed Sacrament we answer the call from the Lord to adore His Real Presence in the Eucharist. We join a line of people that stretches through the centuries, from the stable in Bethlehem in the company of the Angels, shepherds and Magi—through all history to this day. This mystical union of ages and adoring souls has sustained the very heart of the Church. Adoration is the giving of your time to the Lord, and for such a commitment, graces and blessings will be bestowed on you and your loved ones-in this life and the next. Adoration will also strengthen our parish family, and help us to stay focused on the important events in our journey through life.

I am new to adoration and am finding it somewhat awkward to fill the hour without becoming distracted. What can I do to remain focused? To help regain your focus when you find your mind drifting away from your conversation with or contemplation of Jesus you can:

- ◆ *Pray the rosary or Chaplet or the Liturgy of the Hours.*
- ◆ *Read and pray about Scripture or spiritual reading*
- ◆ *Pray for: The intentions of the Pope, The Pope, The Church, Our Priests, our Parish, our Youth and Youth Programs, Vocations, The Right to Life, The family-and any concerns you have.*

Faith Formation

ASBESTOS removal will start October 21st in the PEC. We ask parents to please bring their children no earlier than 10:30 a.m., while this process is happening. We will not have access to the gym or cafeteria during this time. Thank You!!

The Diocese of Amarillo requires two years of preparation for the sacrament of First Eucharist. Therefore any child 7 years, or older planning to celebrate First Eucharist needs to attend Sunday Faith Formation (10:40-11:45) the First year and the second year of preparation attend Sunday Faith Formation and Wednesday classes (6:00-7:15 p.m.) in the PEC.

As of October 3rd of this year in our Faith Formation program we have 246 children and youth registered and there are 99 preparing for a sacrament. Twenty-nine catechists are sharing their faith and are involved in the Faith Formation program.

During October & November Faith Formation will having their safe environment classes for all the children and youth. Parents thank you for making the effort to bring your children on time. It is very important that they do not disrupt the class and they get all the information possible during that hour.

ADULT SAFE ENVIRONMENT training for all adults who have any contact with children or youth in the parish will be on Monday October 28th at the PEC at 6:00 p.m.

Scripture Insights

Today's liturgy celebrates the virtue of perseverance. In the reading from Exodus, the Israelites face an attack from the Amalekites, a nomadic tribe they encountered in their wanderings through the desert. Through Moses' perseverance, as he interceded with God in prayer, the people of Israel finally triumph over their enemy.

In the Gospel reading, a widow's perseverance wins as well.

Three groups of people were considered the most vulnerable and in need of support; the widow, the orphan, and the stranger. In the justice system in Israel, a judge was expected to give special attention to each of these groups. This makes the judge's lack of attention to the widow's pleas even more outrageous. Despite his rejection, the widow persists. Finally the judge gives in, not because of the justice of her cause but because she had worn him out.

The message of these two accounts could be easily mistaken. They both advocate persistence in prayer. A literal reading of these accounts may convey that persistence in prayer will change God's mind, but this is nonsense. The God we believe in is a God of love, who promises fidelity to his covenant people. God's love is always constant. Persistence in prayer is for our benefit. Through persistence in prayers, we change and deepen our faith and trust in God, his promises, and his love for us. Paul also calls on his coworker, Timothy, as he exercises his ministry of proclaiming the word, to "be persistent, whether it is convenient or inconvenient, convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching."

Why are we called to persevere in prayer?

Who are the people that we are called to champion and support in our world?

Where is God calling you to persevere?

Oramos, Señor, por tu justicia

La Viuda es una mujer sola, sin el apoyo físico y social del varón. La viuda hace de cabeza de familia ante las dificultades, cualesquiera que sean, aunque bien sabemos que toda mujer que deja de contar con esa fuerza colaboradora del varón, típicamente, resulta victima de abusos. En los tiempos de la Biblia debía ser peor. Por eso, junto con huérfanos y extranjeros, las viudas, son las mas protegidas por la legislación biblica, pero “del dicho al hecho, hay mucho trecho”. Jesús lo sabe y en varias ocasiones se refiere a las viudas con especial simpatía, y hoy nos da esa parábola de esta viuda, sin defensor, que padece injusticia hasta del propio juez de la ciudad.


Como toda victima de abuso, la viuda no tiene otro recurso que apelar a la justicia de Dios. Del corazón de estas victimas ha surgido la oración de Israel: “Hazme justicia, oh Dios!” Los salmos para pedir justicia han sido la oración de los desvalidos de todos los tiempos, porque la injusticia es lo mas difícil de transformar. Todo abuso nace de una mentirosa superioridad de otros, de su arrogancia y desprecio que descargan sufrimientos indecibles sobre los débiles. Ni quejas y lagrimas de estos consiguen cambiar a sus opresores. Lamentable, pero hay que reconocer que el pobre es un especialista en la resistencia pacífica ante la altanería, porque sabe que lo único que le queda es orar, para que Dios envíe su Espíritu sobre el ofensor y lo convierta. Solo el Espíritu de Dios puede vencer la maldad, cuando los ricos y los poderosos se han adueñado de la justicia terrenal, pero queda la del Cielo.

Jesús pide nuestra perseverancia para orar por la justicia de Dios. La justicia humana es imperfecta, y muchos inocentes padecen en nuestro mundo, con una sensación de que los administradores de justicia terrenal no temen a Dios ni a los hombres. Cuando hay fe, oramos para que la transformación de la injusticia sea una realidad.

Jesús nos da la clave: Hemos estado orando por la justicia con fe? Hemos orado constantemente, sin desfallecer, por una causa justa? La oración es indispensable. Hemos sido fervientes en orar por los empobrecidos, los marginados? Santa Teresa decía: No es tiempo de tratar con Dios negocios de poca importancia”. Hay que orar sin desfallecer.
