Then I saw the monkeys – mercy, how unpleasantly they smelt!*

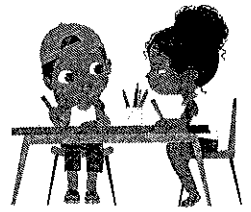
