FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parish Family,

Christ is truly risen as our hearts still burn with the fire of the Resurrection. Yet, how are we living Easter today?

Three young men were ordained to the sacred priesthood in our Archdiocese this weekend. Watching them prostrate before the altar, I was struck by the profound "yes" each one offered to Christ, laying down their own wills to become servants of mercy and instruments of grace. Their ordination is not only cause for celebration; it is a living proclamation that Easter is not a single Sunday, but the very heartbeat of every day in the Church.

Easter is profoundly communal. Just as our new priests were shaped by the prayers and encouragement of our priests, religious, and lay faithful, so each of us has been formed by someone's faith. This week, invite a neighbor to coffee. Write a note of thanks to a catechist whose patience mirrors Christ's own patience. Allow the joy of Easter to overflow from our parish walls into the wider world, building relationships that witness to the peace only the Risen Christ can give.

Christ's mandate to "love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12) becomes flesh in service. Our new priests will anoint the sick, absolve the penitent, and feed the faithful. We, too, are called to serve: visit someone who is homebound, volunteer at a food pantry, or lend a listening ear to someone weighed down by loneliness. In each act of mercy, Easter blooms again as we serve at the altar of Christ.


As we rejoice locally in our new vocations, we also lift our prayers for His Holiness Pope Leo XIV, elected by the Holy Spirit to be shepherd of the universal flock. May his ministry strengthen us in faith and unity. Let us unite our prayers with those of Catholics around the globe, forging a single, Easter-filled community that knows no borders.

Easter is not a fleeting moment but a journey we walk each day, transformed by the Risen Christ's victory over sin and death where we can resolve:

- 1. To deepen our prayer life, inviting Christ to shape our minds and hearts.
- 2.To strengthen our community, sharing Easter joy in word and deed.
- 3.To commit to acts of mercy, becoming hands and feet of the Risen Lord.

May the gift of our new Holy Father and these new priests inspire us to renew our own "yes" to God, allowing the Resurrection to continue to shine brightly in our lives – today and always.



















Why did Jesus Talk in Stories?

Jesus used them to explain the Kingdom of God to his friends, the apostles, and also to anyone who followed him, his disciples. **Parables** are simple stories; there are **parables** about seeds and plants, figs, pearls, candles, fathers and sons, workers, etc.

Jesus was a Teacher

Teachers use stories to help students learn new information or ideas that could be difficult to understand. For example, you learn the ABCs by thinking of pictures and things that start with each letter, like A for apple, and you learn to tie your shoe laces by thinking of a bunny going around a tree and into a hole.

Since it is still Easter (6th week), here is something of an Easter egg: This is a picture of Pope Leo XIV (far left) and his brothers as children.




Ask a family member:
