

Pastor's Corner

Reflection: The healing of Naaman the Syrian in 2 Kings 5:14ff was a consequence of God's mercy and the cleansing of the ten lepers in Luke 17:11ff was a direct result of His compassion. "...Jesus was met by ten lepers who stood way off and said, "Jesus, Master, have mercy"! In response Jesus said, "Go and show yourselves to the priests, they were healed while on their way" (Lk. 17:14).



Obviously, in Christ the mercy of God is where we get our blessing, healing and growth. We would not be where we are today if it had not been for the mercy and love of God. It beholds on us therefore, to develop deep appreciation and gratitude to God for being a loving and forgiving Father to us. Ingratitude is a sign of arrogance and pride. Like the nine lepers in Luke 17:11-19, we come to Christ many times with desperate longing, once we are blessed however, we go away rejoicing and never return to give "thanks." We can easily lose a sense of gratitude for the blessings we have been given. Let us ask ourselves: do we notice the blessings of God in our everyday lives?

Dear Friends, we must develop gratitude because it is an attitude of a sensitive soul appreciative of its gifts. It is a sign of a good and happy heart which, while it enjoys the gifts, is never forgetful of the giver of gifts. The nine lepers of our gospel were so engrossed with the blessings they had received and forgot their benefactor; this of course saddened Jesus. Let us be like the Samaritan who came back and gave thanks to Jesus. Always remember that, "A grateful heart is a humble and happy heart!"

Scripture Reflection

Returning Thanks

**Scott Hahn reflects on
the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time**

*Readings: 2 Kings 5:14-17; Psalm 98:1-4;
2 Timothy 2:8-13; Luke 17:11-19*

A foreign leper is cleansed and in thanksgiving returns to offer homage to the God of Israel. We hear this same story in both the First Reading and Gospel today.

There were many lepers in Israel in Elisha's time, but only Naaman the Syrian trusted in God's Word and was cleansed (see Luke 5:12-14). Today's Gospel likewise implies that most of the ten lepers healed by Jesus were Israelites—but only a foreigner, the Samaritan, returned.

In a dramatic way, we're being shown today how faith has been made the way to salvation, the road by which all nations will join themselves to the Lord, becoming His servants, gathered with the Israelites into one chosen people of God, the Church (see Isaiah 56:3-8).

Today's Psalm also looks forward to the day when all peoples will see what Naaman sees—that there is no God in all the earth except the God of Israel.

We see this day arriving in today's Gospel. The Samaritan leper is the only person in the New Testament who personally thanks Jesus. The Greek word used to describe his "giving thanks" is the word we translate as "Eucharist".

And these lepers today reveal to us the inner dimensions of the Eucharist and sacramental life.

We, too have been healed by our faith in Jesus. As Naaman's flesh is made again like that of a little child, our souls have been cleansed of sin in the waters of Baptism. We experience this cleansing again and again in the Sacrament of Penance—as we repent our sins, beg and receive mercy from our Master, Jesus.

We return to glorify God in each Mass, to offer ourselves in sacrifice—falling on our knees before our Lord, giving thanks for our salvation.

In this Eucharist, we remember "Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David," Israel's covenant king. And we pray, as Paul does in today's Epistle, to persevere in this faith—that we too may live and reign with Him in eternal glory.

Psalm 98:

Sing to the LORD a new song, for he has done wondrous deeds...all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation by our God. Sing joyfully to the LORD, all you lands: break into song; sing praise.

Pope Francis from Laudato Si':

Any technical solution which science claims to offer will be powerless to solve the serious problems of our world if humanity loses its compass, if we lose sight of the great motivations which make it possible for us to live in harmony, to make sacrifices and to treat others well. (Laudato Si', 200)

Reflection:

In both the first reading and Psalm, we are reminded that the very earth is part of the alliance that God makes with His people. Naaman learns that God's gifts are free with Elisha refuses a present for healing. But Naaman comes to an even deeper understanding of the relationship between the God of Israel and the people when he asks for two mule-loads of earth: The earth is the Lord's and it is given to all people. Carrying the earth with him shows that Naaman accepts his responsibilities to God, to his sisters and brothers, and to the created world itself.

Psalm 98 calls on the earth to break into joyous song, echoing the poem of St. Francis of Assisi that proclaims the universal fraternity that exists between all of God's creatures. Although universal fraternity is the vision that God offers for creation, fulfillment of this dream takes commitment and hard work.

Paul endures the hardship that come with faithfully living God's word— a word that will not be chained. As Pope Francis frequently reminds us in Laudato Si', we are called to take the narrow path, to live morally sober lives, and to promote a lifestyle that will help protect the earth that sustains all life. We must also defend all our sisters and brothers, especially the poorest and most marginalized who are most affected by environmental degradation and climate change. (Catholic Climate Covenant)

Prayer:

God of grace and love, we bring you our prayers, our commitment, our gifts to you this day. Let us who have a keen dedication and awareness of your creation and all it brings to the human family, have courage and conviction that we are able to contribute to the sustainability of the Earth. You who are our Provident God, let your Providence lead the way in our Health and Services. Pour out your blessing upon us today. May each of our



actions reveal our awareness that we are partners with You in the creation and sustainability of this earth that you have given to us to appreciate and enjoy. We ask this in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen. (slife.org)
