



Pastor's Corner

Reflection: The Gospel reading gives us a short parable from the Lord with a powerful punch. The Pharisee came to the Temple and prayed, "Thank you, Lord, that I am not like the rest of humanity especially that tax collector back there." We ask, what is wrong with his prayer?

Obviously, his prayer is a litany of all good he had done. He comes to the Temple to tell God all about his fidelity to his religious obligations. Here we can say, there is no sense of the need for forgiveness. "I fast, I contribute... unlike that tax collector." Meanwhile, the tax collector prayed, "Lord, I am a sinner." What the Pharisee did in his life was good. But he compared himself not with the holiness of God which he was called to imitate but to the tax collector. Instead of striving toward living in the image of God, he compares himself to another human being. Spiritual maturity happens when we compare ourselves not to our neighbor but to our Lord. Yes, it is always important that we strive to imitate Christ and not settle into a spiritual arrogance that comes from our comparing ourselves to others. We must come to our Lord with the humility shown by the tax collector: "O God be merciful to me a sinner."

Yes, Lord 2022: Renewal of our Stewardship and Tithing: After the Parish Accountability Report given to us last weekend by our Parish Manager, Steve Contreras, I am here as your Pastor reminding and encouraging you to renew your pledge of commitment towards your parish stewardship. A person who understands that everything in life is GIFT from GOD, he definitely, would be happy to give back to God. He would embrace holistic stewardship and tithing. He would acknowledge that the gifts he has received come from God and he needs to give it back as a way to thank Him for all these blessings. God has given all of us gifts and material blessings and it is our responsibility to give back and help our community. Stewardship comes in many forms; it is our time, talent and treasure. As followers of Jesus, it is our responsibility to give back to our community in gratitude for all God has given us. I ask you to look into your heart and find out what you can give back to God through holistic stewardship.

Coming from a country where poverty is prevalent, stewardship for me is "loving and helping others". As a human being, it is my responsibility to help my family, relatives, Church and specially those who are marginalized. Growing up until I became a priest, I was always conscious that there are others who needed food for a meal, somebody lonely who needed an ear for listening, and somebody needing one's presence and time.

I am hoping and praying that as we are back to the new normal conduct of our life after the pandemic, we will be more generous with our time, talent and treasure. Let us take the opportunity to create a community where loving and accompanying is our guiding principle; where holistic stewardship is our way to thank God for the life we have and all that He has given us. We need to determine how each of us can express our gratitude to God. For some maybe you share your time to serve in different ministries in the parish; maybe for others sharing your expertise and talents that God has given you and for all of us sharing our material blessings to help our parish continue to survive and maintain its operation. Whatever the Holy Spirit prompts you to do, if you joyfully share whatever God has given you, it will satisfy the inner desire of your heart to express our thanks to God.

MINISTRY FAIR: Next weekend October (Oct 29th-30th) will be our Annual Ministry Fair. This is to give you the opportunity to be part of OMOS pastoral work and commitment obeying God's mandate to build the Kingdom of God here on earth, which is the kingdom of love. It has been the tradition of the parish that during the month of October, we are all invited to renew and embrace the holistic vision of stewardship through a more intentional consideration of sharing the gifts of our Time, Talent and Treasure. We will have information available for the different ministries active in our parish. The COVID pandemic has affected all our ministries. I ask you to look into these ministries and be part of it. Let's give life and energy to our parish ministries again. Our parish Pastoral Staff and Leaders who are active in those ministries will be available to give you more specific information on ministries during this fair. We are all called to share with grateful hearts to God from whom all blessings flow.

Luke 18: Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else"The tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.'...For whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Pope Francis: An interdependent world not only makes us more conscious of the negative effects of certain lifestyles and models of production and consumption which affect us all; more importantly, it motivates us to ensure that solutions are proposed from a global perspective, and not simply to defend the interests of a few countries. (*Laudato Si'*,164)

Reflection: In his encyclical *Laudato Si'*, Pope Francis stresses in the virtues and attitudes necessary to promote the dignity of every human being, to address crises like climate change, and to care for earth, our common home. He also calls our attention to the interdependence that marks our world. Because of this interdependence, the actions of the few can affect all, including consuming resources and burning fossil fuels that cause climate change.

Action: In the face of this tragedy, let us speak to one another. Let us enter into dialogue about our current situation, seeking solutions that will benefit all, not just certain countries or classes of people. The global common good demands that we foster a spirit of solidarity: working to eliminate extreme poverty, promoting the social development of all, and seeking ways to heal the earth. Pope Francis invites all citizens to take control of politics at all levels; only in this way will we be able to confront our social and environmental problems. (*CatholicClimateCovenant.org*)

Prayer: Oh God, Creator of all that is, give us light and strength to know your will, to make it our own and to live it in our lives. Help us to be good stewards of the treasures of your creation: living persons, animals and plants, rivers and forests, lands and seas. As we strive to be faithful caretakers of our common home, help us always to be, not only hearers of your word, but doers. May our humble efforts be always built not on sand, but on the solid rock of our commitment to value and protect what you have made. We ask this through Jesus Christ, your son, who lives and reigns with You, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen. (*Edward Ciuba, Creation of the Crossroads*)


