



Pastor's Corner

REFLECTION: In today's Gospel John is revealing a powerful lesson for us: All of us are capable of knowing right from wrong and the way we should live. We know we are weak; we know sin exists and what it is like. We also know that once we commit sin it has an effect upon us, and it also affects our relationship with other people. Yet we deliberately do what we know is sin. If someone confronts us about it, we attempt to justify ourselves. We rationalize. Self-justification is one of the biggest problems most of us face today. We justify our sinful actions by saying, "There are others who are far worse than me," "The world is like that", "God does not see sin in His children", and so on. All these rationalizations will lead us to nowhere but we feel miserable. What we need is a change of heart. What we need is God's mercy and His grace for our conversion.

As we prepare ourselves to celebrate the birth of Christ, we have another opportunity to heed the call of John the Baptist for repentance and be saved. As long as any sin, whether big or small, whether overt or covert, reigns in our lives, we cannot experience God's total love. As long as we bear the guilt of sin, we cannot protest that God is unjust in allowing us to suffer. Let us, therefore, listen as John urges us to prepare for the coming of the Lord by truly and humbly confessing our sins.

ADVENT COMMITMENT: This season of Advent I am encouraging everyone to enter into the spirit of it and the grace that it offers. If possible I ask everyone to come to participate in the daily mass. Take advantage too, of the sacrament of confession that we normally schedule every Wednesday and Saturday. Spend time to do a holy hour and meditate on the Word. We prepare ourselves spiritually for the celebration of His birth. But we also prepare ourselves for His second coming.

The secular world we have wants a Christmas without Advent, an Easter without Lent, happiness without sacrifice or heaven without our conversion. John reminds us of the importance of reform, that Christmas is a moment to renew ourselves in the power and grace of Jesus Christ.

CHRISTMAS ANGEL TREE: I am asking from the bottom of my heart to for you to share and help others by helping with our Angel Tree needs (which are listed on page 4 of this bulletin). Make your Christmas Season very meaningful. Be generous and share! I am so grateful for all the support and generosity you have shown to our OMOS parish. Thank you so much!

ADVENT PENANCE SERVICE: the Advent Penance Service Schedule for our parish is **December 18th at 4:30pm.** We have several priests helping with confessions. Please take advantage of this opportunity for confession before Christmas. This is the best way to prepare for the Birth of Jesus. Be reconciled and be whole through God's mercy and love. IMMACULATE CONCEPTION: is the belief that the Virgin Mary was free of original sin from the moment of her conception. This is a holy day of obligation. **Our Masses are at 6:30am, 8:30am, and 6:30 pm.**

Scripture Reflection

The Road Home

Scott Hahn reflects on the Second Sunday of Advent

Readings: Baruch 5:1-9; Psalm 126:1-6;
Philippians 1:4-6, 8-11; Luke 3:1-6



Today's Psalm paints a dreamlike scene—a road filled with liberated captives heading home to Zion (Jerusalem), mouths filled with laughter, tongues rejoicing.

It's a glorious picture from Israel's past, a "new exodus," the deliverance from exile in Babylon. It's being recalled in a moment of obvious uncertainty and anxiety. But the psalmist isn't waxing nostalgic.

Remembering "the Lord has done great things" in the past, he is making an act of faith and hope—that God will come to Israel in its present need, that He'll do even greater things in the future.

This is what the Advent readings are all about: We recall God's saving deeds—in the history of Israel and in the coming of Jesus. Our remembrance is meant to stir our faith, to fill us with confidence that, as today's Epistle puts it, "the one who began a good work in [us] will continue to complete it" until He comes again in glory.

Each of us, the Liturgy teaches, is like Israel in her exile—led into captivity by our sinfulness, in need of restoration and conversion by the Word of the Holy One (see [Baruch 5:5](#)). The lessons of salvation history should teach us that, as God again and again delivered Israel, in His mercy He will free us from our attachments to sin if we turn to Him in repentance.

That's the message of John, introduced in today's Gospel as the last of the great prophets (compare [Jeremiah 1:1–4, 11](#)). But John is greater than the prophets (see [Luke 7:27](#)). He's preparing the way not only for a new redemption of Israel but for the salvation of "all flesh" (see also [Acts 28:28](#)).

John quotes Isaiah (40:3) to tell us he's come to build a road home for us, a way out of the wilderness of sin and alienation from God. It's a road we'll follow Jesus down, a journey we'll make, as today's First Reading puts it, "rejoicing that [we're] remembered by God."

ANGEL TREE: As we move into the season of Advent it is time to begin preparation for our Angel Tree Outreach. The Angel Tree is a wonderful way for us as a parish to put feet on the gospel. Through the Angel Tree Project we can reach out to the least among us and give them a helping hand. Jesus tells us, "Whatever you did for the least of my brothers, you did for me." (Mt 25:40) How can we challenge ourselves to see Christ in the poor and vulnerable this Christmas?

Shopping can be stressful so we are happy to shop for you. You can make a donation for any agency and we will be happy to purchase items from their list.

Gifts may be dropped in the back of the church or at the Parish Office during the week. Gift cards and monetary donations for all agencies can be dropped in the Parish mailbox anytime or at the office during the week.

St. Vincent de Paul & Project Outreach —They are requesting toys, building sets, balls, books, dolls, art & craft sets, ear buds, make-up/nail polish, play dough, card games, cars, and games for children from birth to 14 years. (*Fry's Gift Cards McDonald Gift Cards and \$15—\$25 Gift Cards for Wal-Mart and Target are always in short supply.*)

Casa Maria, TIHAN, Poverello House, Stand Up for Kids and Sr. Jose Women's Shelter — These agencies are soliciting toilet paper, sweatshirts/hoodies, hats/beanies, gloves, blankets, and toiletries. Snack items such as granola bars, trail mix, apple sauce, cheese or peanut butter crackers, and pop top cans of ravioli, or chili. Gift cards are helpful in meeting immediate needs. *Especially needed men's and women's socks. (Women prefer low cut socks.) Gift cards to fast food or discount stores help to meet the immediate needs of these agencies.*

Respect Life— Reachout Women's Center helps mothers in need and is requesting diapers, wipes and gift cards to discount stores such as Target and Wal-Mart. They also appreciate donations of other baby items.

All items for S.V.D.P, Project Outreach, and other agencies need to be dropped off by December 15th. Gift cards should be dropped off by December 22nd.

Isaiah 11:

There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the LORD, as water covers the sea.

Romans 15:

May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to think in harmony with one another.

Pope Francis:

In the Judeo-Christian tradition, the word "creation" has a broader meaning than "nature", for it has to do with God's loving plan in which every creature has its own value and significance. Nature is usually seen as a system which can be studied, understood and controlled, whereas creation can only be understood as a gift from the outstretched hand of the Father of all. (Laudato Si', 76)

Reflection:

We have not yet succeeded in bringing forth the peaceable kingdom envisioned in today's reading from Isaiah. That vision illustrates predators and victims in both the animal and human realms living together in peace: the leopard and the young goat, the lion and the calf, the poisonous snake and the child. Interconnected while retaining their specific individualities, these creatures constitute the kingdom or reign of God. Although in his letter to the Romans Paul speaks of harmony among all the members of the church, the scope of such a horizon must be opened today to include all creation in that vision of harmony. There can be no societal harmony if the forces of life on earth are not in harmony. This balance will only endure if the interconnectedness of earth's elements is respected and sustained on all levels. Today, we realize that everything that is human is part of cosmic reality. "One accord" and "one voice" includes all the natural forces of the cosmos, that is, God's creation. And all creation glorifies God with one voice and with one accord. (catholicclimatecovenant.org)

Prayer:

We thank you, creator God, for the goodly heritage you offer us, from green downland to the salt seas, and for the abundant world we share with your creation. Keep us so mindful of its needs and those of all with whom we share, that open to your Spirit we may discern and practice all that makes for its wellbeing, through Jesus Christ our Lord. -Rev Peter Lippiett (xavier.edu/jesuitresources)
