A special thank you to many people who at Good Shepherd & St Christopher's who participated in either the processions or extended Adoration before or after the Masses. You could sense the difference from the norm. A spirit of prayer pervaded both churches and I want to thank the extra servers and musicians who made it a sacred time to be together.



Years ago a very "new agey" priest who conducts retreats for a living wrote an article based on almost 50 years of his experience. Even though I generally find him a bit "out there" he did raise something I found powerful. He wrote that he found that for 95% percent of people their default operating image of God was their own dad.

It doesn't make it a true image of God but it certainly effects people for good or for bad. If they lived with someone controlling, abusive or angry—God seems often like someone merely to be kept at bay or appeased. If they grew up with a absent father or distant—their image of God is maybe like a divine watchmaker who creates but doesn't care or is even non-existent. Sadly, warped relationships result in warped images of God.

However, if a dad models real presence, faith, love and forgiveness the likelihood that a child, but particularly a son will have a model and image of God which is closer to the truth and much more beneficial.

Chances are that all of us have a bit all of this. No one is perfect, even the best parent has weaknesses and even the worst of us isn't without virtue. Nevertheless many people are in need of healing that image of God in their life. May our time of silent prayer, scripture reading and sacramental life (especially the Eucharist & Confession) helps us develop a healthier & holier friendship and sonship with God—Our Father. Blessed Father's Day men....you have a noble calling and a great responsibility in how you model the virtues of faith to your kids and grandkids.

Genuflect when you enter and exit your pew to remind yourself of the honor our Eucharistic Lord is due.

Say "Amen" as a means of saying "I Believe" when you are presented with the reality of Who is in front of you as the priest gives you Holy Communion.

Don't receive if you are after of a serious sin until you have gone to confession first.


Be smarter than a demon—Jesus is truly present—even demons know this, for example when exorcists go to possessed people they will often convulse if they sense the Eucharist is near the priest.

After Communion—close your eyes—and ask Him—Lord, give me Your comfort, give me Your courage and give me Your presence always.

Resolve to come to Mass 15 minutes early—to pray, to prepare, to settle before the most important prayer of your week begins.

Stay after, visit during the week, come to Adoration, drop into the church regularly.


