
Good Shepherd & St Christopher

Jesus' parable of the unforgiving servant follows directly after His "seventy times seven" speech, driving home the point that if we are forgiven the enormous debt of sin against a holy God, how much more should we be eager to forgive those who sin against us, who are just as sinful as they? Paul parallels this example in Ephesians 4:32 where he admonishes us to forgive one another "even as God for Christ's sake has forgiven you." Clearly, forgiveness is not to be meted out in a limited fashion but is to be abundant, overflowing, and available to all, just as the measureless grace of God is poured out upon us.

II. Sins of Weakness The unprincipled, the lustful, gluttons, & wrathful.

III. Sins of Malice

IV. Sins of Treachery and Betrayal Capped off by the Devil chewing the three worst betrayers in history—if you want to know...come next Wednesday.

For Dante, for us as Catholics, the sins are not the final word. It is sloth, laxity or irrepentance at the time of death. These same sins are purged by penance in Purgatory not simply punished forever in Hell. For Dante humility and contrition are key for God's love to save us & only our choices block it.

Dollars & Sense

As of September 1st— everything under our name is under one account & tracked—there were 17 separate accounts and checkbooks & I was signatory every one. Rather than that lunacy continuing only the cemeteries and "Renew & Rebuild" legally must be separate.

Speaking of accounts they are in good shape compared to some dire predictions from a few years ago. This coming year with an extra priest (salary & healthcare) we should be close to a balanced budget.

Even in a time of inflation we're seeing \$14,300 on an average weekend in the summer. Hopefully we'll get close to \$15-\$16K during the school year. I want to thank you for that and I put it to good use.

Collections are the ultimate fundraiser. If they stink we could run the Price is Right, BINGOs and other painful fundraisers which always have oversized thermometers involved every few weeks and it won't make up for it. A weekly envelope or WeShare is better than an annual raffle.

We're also going to be allocating some of the savings accounts we currently have to interest bearing safe investments which will help us to cover more charitable outreach.

I'll say it again, our senior citizens were the ones (by and large) who brought us through COVID financially. They sent in envelopes through months of lockdowns & got us through almost two years of poor attendance. Thank you! Now that our attendance is up I urge all of our younger folks to just "set it and forget it" on WeShare through the link we'll send via Flocknote this upcoming week.
