St Christopher & Good Shepherd 3rd Sunday of Easter 2025



I think it's safe to say that we have been thinking a lot about St Peter recently. The death of Pope Francis reminds us of the chain of men who have been tasked with "feeding my sheep" as Jesus commends Peter to do in the Gospel this Sunday. The episode in today's reading reminds us that Peter is not perfect but is repentant, reparative, and faithful.

Isn't that what God calls us to be? Peter didn't deny his "three denials," he didn't explain it away or just consider it a "life lesson." He wept at his running away, he had to say he loved the Lord three times, and the he was tasked with feeding the sheep that would become the very first manifestation of the Catholic Church.

Peter ultimately grew to become a strong saint and shepherd. The first Bishop of Rome, he was crucified upside down and his burial place reverenced from the start—he was a hero and a holy man. His bones are today under the main altar of St Peter's in Rome.

Because of timing we may not know who our new "Peter" is by this weekend but let us implore God that he will be a man who will profess loudly and with credibility "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you" in faith—rather than "I do not know the man" in fear or desire for the world's approval. Let's pray for whomever is elected that he will continue to follow the Lord's command to Peter to "Feed his sheep" **Friends:**

This past week probably two billion people watched, recorded or streamed the Papal Funeral. In one way this brings to mind the old adage of Oscar Wilde, "there is no such thing as bad press" after all, the world doesn't stop when the head of the world Methodist confederation passes away - Presidents don't fly to kneel at the funeral of the Grand Imam of Mecca, and I bet you can't even name the head of the Presbyterians.

However, just eyes on screens only goes so far. After all probably the same number watched a part of the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II and almost none of the viewers became Monarchists by watching it. Likewise I wonder if the cultural curiosity of these days past and certainly these days ahead....won't be the exact same.

Yet, the Catholic Faith, isn't meant to be footnoted, observed and admired for it's antiquity alone...it's meant to convert, convict and challenge us to be real followers of Jesus.

That conviction, challenge and conversion, is actually what has made the Church so durable. It defeated the Roman Empire, held back heresy and paganism, it crowned Kings and Queens, outlasted Napoleon, was there to bury the Soviet Union and will slowly and securely beat the poison of apathy and secularism today with a message of hope and the spiritual richness of the Faith. She doesn't adapt to the world—she changes it.

While historic—the Church continues to make history because she is the instrument by which Our Blessed Lord governs, sanctifies and testifies to the faithful and to the world, this life changing message, power and presence of God. She doesn't change just history but also our eternal destiny should we choose to say and live a "YES" to God.

Let's pray that the world won't just watch, wonder and maybe even have a "favorite" Cardinal for election but truly dive in deep for conviction, challenge and ultimately conversion to the Lord who appointed St Peter (the First Pope) to "Feed My Sheep" -
