

A REFLECTION BY FR. WILLIAM HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ.

This past Wednesday, February 1st was the **feast** of St. Bridget of Kildare the first Irish-born to be canonized a saint of the church. Born around 450, she felt called to dedicate her life to God as a nun at age 15. She was thought to be an attractive young woman and when her father sought to



arrange a comfortable marriage for her, she prayed that her beauty would disappear. Legend has it she received the pox which disfigured her face and turned off her suitor. Her beauty returned years later when she made her final vows as a nun. Bridget is remembered for her strong spiritual leadership, becoming the abbess of a monastery for women and also for men, something unheard of in her time. She was also famous for her generosity to the poor, offering food and her special libation, beer to all who came to her. St. Bridget is the patron saint of babies, children whose parents are not married, dairy workers, farmers, Ireland, midwives, nuns, poets, printers, and sailors. Her feast day is now a national holiday in Ireland.

She is also the **patron saint of our parish!** Please join us for a **special parish celebration at 6:00 pm on February 4th** following our Saturday Mass. Soft drinks and beer will be served! This is an opportunity to celebrate the gift of our St. Bridget Parish family which has gathered in Laurelhurst for some 55 years. I offer my deep thanks to all who have shared their faith, hope, and love in any way with us over our history. Here's to the life of Christ that God calls us to share moving forward as "Partners in the Gospel."

Bridget, you were a woman of peace.
You brought harmony where there was conflict.
You brought light to the darkness.
You brought hope to the downcast.

May the mantle of your peace cover those who are troubled and anxious.

And may peace be firmly rooted in our hearts and in our world.

Inspire us to act justly and to reverence all God has made.

Bridget, you were a voice for the wounded and the weary.

Strengthen what is weak within us.

Calm us into a quietness that heals and listens. May we grow each day into greater wholeness in mind, body, and spirit. Amen.

FIRST COMMUNION CLOSET

Introducing the first of its kind, the First Communion Closet.

First Communion is a big day for Catholic families. It's an exciting day of celebration but also comes with the added expense of purchasing a gown or suit that will likely be a one-wear wardrobe item. A group of



us have put our heads together and have come up with a plan to take the financial burden off families by starting an Archdiocese-wide First Communion Closet.

To begin, we are asking for donations of gently used or new communion dresses and suits. If you have a dress or suit hanging in the back of your child's closet that could use a 2nd life, please consider donating it so another child could feel confident on their big day.

There will be a bin labeled First Communion Closet in your parish office starting February 1st. Please donate all goods there; they will be picked up and cataloged for checkout by the end of March. St. Bridget Parish will begin as the first housing site for the clothing. The goal is to have clothing ready for checkout by the last week of April for First Communion services in May.

Our hope is for the clothing to be used multiple times throughout the Seattle Archdiocese and for Seattle kids to be able to access clothing that they need for their important day. Big ideas have small starts and the starting point is all of you.

Above please find the St Bridget Collection Revenue for July through December, as compared to our budgeted collection expectation, which included a 13% increase in order to cover our budgeted expenses this fiscal year. We are very grateful that our Christmas collections were very strong, and we are now at 96% of our budgeted revenue as of calendar year end. Our current expenses are very close to what we budgeted, at 101% as of December 31, 2022.

ASB SCHOOL NEWS

EXCITING ANNOUNCEMENT!

Dear Friends, please read this exciting announcement from our ASB School Principal Kathleen Conklin:

I'm excited to announce that we are in the process of purchasing additional property for the school that will be a huge asset to our future strategic planning. The Adrian Dominican Sisters' convent, located across from Assumption Parish and pictured above, was recently put up for sale as the sisters no longer reside or work in that location. Per an agreement with Assumption Parish, the parish had the first right of refusal to purchase the space. The Parish Council agreed that the school would be able to make better use of this space and passed that invitation to us. We had thirty days from the date of the notice to make a decision and offer. Over Christmas break, members of the Governance Council, School Commission, Finance Council and Facilities Committee met to review the space, value and come to a decision. The property is 15,000 square feet with a building that is 12,000 square feet. This was an easy decision as there will never be another opportunity to acquire this kind of space for the school and we have maximized our current footprint. Fortunately, we are in a position that this decision is feasible for the school and we are excited about this opportunity. It is important to note that while the decision to purchase had a very small window, we will be deliberate, thoughtful and strategic as we take time to develop a master plan for this space that is in the best interest of our programming, future needs and provide a positive impact for all students. Our staff, advisory and governing bodies will be heavily involved in this process. We also have the full support of Fr. Oliver and Fr. Bill at our parishes, and are grateful for their help with this process.
