A REFLECTION BY FR. WILLIAM HERIC

Dear Friends in the Risen Lord,

One of the things we celebrate in the Easter Season is the birth of the church, the body of Christ. The Risen Jesus did not appear in private revelations but to a community of his disciples. His words to them were "Peace be with you" followed by the commission to "Preach the gospel to all the nations and know that I am with you always!" Here at St.

COMMUNITY CONNECTION

SVDP APRIL NARRATIVES

Below are excerpts from three visits recently conducted by our St. Vincent de Paul volunteers. Sometimes it is helpful to dig a little deeper and find out more about the types of calls we receive for assistance, however, no two are ever the same.

For Lalith this call was hard to make, but she said sometimes life feels a little cramped and a little overwhelming, and she was so thankful she could reach out to SVDP for support. Lalith and her significant other live in a large complex near St. Bridget's where her family of 9 people share a 3-bedroom apartment. Her seven children range in age from 2 to 20, and it is here where they not only live, but where she also home schools several of her children. Her significant other doesn't work because of epilepsy and has yet been unable to receive disability. She contacted us recently because she said she didn't know where else to turn. She usually pays her rent with her Section 8 Voucher but had another unexpected debt to pay and had additional application fees for various other needs. She had never used our services before and requested \$650 to pay 3 months back rent which we were able to support her with. When asked about future plans for rent, she said she is covered due to her Section 8 Voucher and because her application fees are now paid. I offered food and grocery store gift cards, but she was determined to handle all her other needs on her own, and she is working hard to find a larger place to accommodate her family. She was so grateful for the help with her rent and felt such relief once that burden was behind her

Maura, whom lives independently in NE Seattle and is disabled, relies each month on a visit from a Vincentian Volunteer from the Assumption – St Bridget SVDP Conference. Since 2013 our neighbor has cheerfully welcomed volunteers into her home for her monthly delivery of food staples and pantry supplies to close the gap on her household monthly budget deficit. Maura is always grateful for the assistance and never lets a visit go answered without a kind expression of thanks. Here is a sample of a recent hand written card she wrote:

To my dear generous Angels of Assumption-St. Bridget SVDP,

Thank you so very much for the unbelievable Christmas basket! I never had such a gorgeous gift of luxurious bath towels! The teal color is exquisite and the plush feel is an ongoing hug from you all.

Thank you deeply. Happy New Year to All! Love Maura

Both of these neighbors expressed how thankful

they were for the personal interactions they had with our volunteers. We are not just a phone number to call, bureaucracy to deal with and a hand-out to solve a need; we provide a face-to-face response, we are local volunteers who



meet each of our neighbors where they are at, filling a need but also providing it with a personal touch. It is this human interaction, showing compassion and dignity to all who reach out to us, that seems to be the most important part of all of our visits.

You read about veterans being in need all the time—many are homeless and have been the subject of discrimination (in particular those who were in Viet Nam). Veterans have benefits available but some don't know how to access them. There are, of course, certain conditions.

Recently a fellow Vincentian and I visited such a man. He hadn't been in Viet Nam—purely by chance as he told us. Some of those in his draft cohort went there, others didn't. He says he was one of the lucky ones. But, here he is, in his late 70's, on low-income health insurance, children in another state not available for much help. After he pays his rent, he has about \$300 to live on for the rest of the month. He is a real reader with a library of books ranging from novels by Thomas Mann to the fables of LaFontaine, and everything in between. His college diploma is on the wall along with his certificate of honorary discharge from the military. His landlord is exceptionally kind and compassionate. He assured us that even though Jack probably couldn't pay his rent in full every month (his situation when we visited), he would not evict him as he knew he needed medications and, well, food.

We were able to help with about ½ of his back rent, brought him food (he especially asked for Cheerios) a few hygiene products and a Safeway card. We also made sure he had a copy of the little pamphlet of resources our conferences developed over time. We gave him sites for the Veterans Administration so he could investigate what benefit he might be eligible for. He was grateful and seemed to us just a little bit lost. In a way he's lucky. We can help him with food on a regular basis, he has a list of nearby food banks and an understanding landlord. Still, is there anyone of us who would want to be Jack? A man who served his country, is in need and is trying to live with dignity. We are happy to help Jack and those like him and ever grateful to your generosity so that we can help. Thank you! Pray for him, pray for us as we go about our work.
