Dear Friends in Christ.

This coming Tuesday, August 15th, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day which obliges Catholics to attend Mass. We will celebrate this great solemnity with Mass at 6:30 pm. Please plan to attend. The late Trappist Fr. Basil Pennington describes the Assumption in this way:



"Mary was given the singular privileges of being conceived without sin, conceiving, and bearing the Incarnate God, and being assumed bodily into heaven. We know that in God's wise plan, every great gift he gives always comes with a great responsibility, and Mary was no exception. She is a vessel of God's overflowing and particular love for each man and woman. God gave her each of these graces so that she could become a universal Mother to all those who are joined to her Son."

As we celebrate this great feast of God's love, let us also give thanks for our friends and neighbors at **Assumption Parish**. Perhaps our newer parishioners don't know that St. Bridget's was formed in 1968 out of the boundaries of Assumption which this October will celebrate its 100th anniversary as a parish. 32 families/individuals (includes bags of food to food bank) helped with food value \$930



Virgin Mary

The most inspiring woman in my life is my Aunt, Sister Charles Marie (affectionately called Sr. Charlie) Part of a big family that survived the depression and the Dust Bowl in Hays Kansas, she entered the convent at age 18.

Sister taught in schools in Kansas, Missouri and Montana for over 30 years. She was Principal at Sacred Heart School, St. Patrick's School, and North Central Junior High School, Butte, MT. She began her ministry in healthcare and social services in 1988. Sister Charles Marie was the Director of Pastoral Care at St. Mary's Hospital and Medical Center, Grand Junction, CO, Administrator/Coordinator at Ross Hall, Leavenworth, KS and worked tirelessly at Mercy Housing, Kansas City, KS. Later, she became the Mission Director for Seton Center, Kansas City, MO. Upon retiring in 2012, Sister could be found basking in volunteer work wherever she was needed.

She was the center of our family, our gravity, our glue. With family members spread all over the country and sometimes all over the world, we depended on Sister to keep us connected. She was Facebook before PCs or cell phones even existed.

She had the uncanny sense to know exactly when each of us needed her. You'd be going through a crisis and magically you'd get the call from Sister. "Hi, dearie! How ya doin'?" She was the best counselor you could have. When I was struggling with the guilt of leaving a very unhappy marriage, she called almost daily to

support my leaving. She said, "You know there is only one Savior and you're not it." I don't think I could have made it without her.

Sister was well known in the Kansas City area. She worked to connect grocery stores with food banks.

She had connections in the trucking community so if there were 100 frozen chickens that a store wanted to donate, she'd call her buddies and those chickens would get delivered to Mercy Housing. She would leave her car unlocked so anyone could load her trunk with clothes, toys or food. She organized holiday drives for Mercy residents and managed their Christmas party

festivities. She was God's love in action!

When I work with our own Mercy Housing at Magnuson Park through St. Vincent de Paul, I feel like I'm honoring her legacy. When she passed, we had a magnet made for each member of the family with her picture and the words "What would Sister do?"


