

## THANK YOU TRACY READ!

Tracy Read has been the President of the Assumption St. Bridget Saint Vincent de Paul Conference for the past six years. We share our sincere thanks for the dedication and wisdom she has shown in leading our conference as we help our neighbors in need.

When Tracy began her leadership role in 2017, she led the Assumption (only) SVdP Conference. Tracy worked closely with Father Bill Heric at St. Bridget parish to oversee the alliance of our two parishes in supporting a single SVdP Conference. We have all benefitted by the synergy of having two parishes and the addition of more Vincentians to assist our neighbors.

Then came Covid... In March 2020, Tracy established new home visit protocols to keep us all safe. Rather than the traditional "home visits" that are the cornerstone of the Vincentian ministry, we transitioned to phone calls whenever possible. And Zoom meetings took the place of our in-person meetings.

Through these ups and downs, Tracy has provided leadership strong for conference. our Her enthusiasm and high energy levels are contagious and have helped us all to be better Christians and Vincentians. Tracy has consistently brought a



good "business sense" to the leadership decisions that she makes – balancing compassion for our neighbors in need with ensuring good stewardship of the funds from our generous parishioners.

In summary, Tracy has been an outstanding leader for our SVdP Conference for the past six years. Thank you Tracy, for putting your heart and soul into this ministry, and helping your fellow Vincentians and parishioners to see and understand what it means to love our neighbors.

## A SVDP NARRATIVE

Norman and Elaine had 3 grown children and one grandchild, who was clearly the apple of Elaine's eye. But they came across some hard times and are now living in low-income housing.

Norman called SVdP to request help with his car registration. It seemed like a simple enough request, but it was not the type of assistance we typically provide. Norman had estimated that the registration would cost \$416. This was more than we felt able to pay for this type of expense. So, Norman suggested that SVdP pay for a portion of the car registration, and he would find a way to pay the rest. It took a day, but Norman and Elaine were able to come up with \$95 in cash.

I met Norman and Elaine at the licensing agency. As I stood with them at the counter, I learned a few more details about their situation. They had purchased the car about one year ago from a private party, who, it turns out, had sold the car to two different people. The seller gave one buyer the title and gave Norman and Elaine the car. As soon as Norman and Elaine tried to register their new car, they encountered legal issues, and the seller was nowhere to be found. In the meantime, Elaine was driving the car and was stopped by police and arrested. She had been to court and needed to resolve the legal ownership issue within a week of when I met her, or she would be charged with

a felony.

We spent a long time at the licensing agency. The agent needed to confirm several reports from the police and check policies for enabling a temporary registration when the title was not available. In the end, the agent approved the temporary registration. On behalf of SVdP, I paid the registration fee, and we walked out of the office.

Elaine hugged me once we were outside the office. She told me that this has been a nightmare for her for the past year, and she was so happy to have the ownership issues and threats of a felony charge behind her.

As I drove home, it occurred to me how the deck is stacked against the poor people in this world. The price of the car was \$500 – but it was all they could afford. They could not afford to visit a reputable dealer who would have been honest in the sales process. This case of a dishonest seller had caused Elaine a year of misery, worrying about how she would find her way out of this mess.

When I got home, I counted the stack of bills, and I also counted my blessings – which were innumerable. And for the day, I felt blessed that God had chosen me and our SVdP Conference to assist this couple in their time of need. And I also felt very blessed by the generosity of our parishioners whose donations paid for the car registration. Thank you so much!!
