#### A REFLECTION BY FR. WILLIAM HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ,

Some of you know that my youngest brother is also a priest. **"Fr. Heric the younger"** as we refer to him is a priest of the Diocese of Spokane. Fr. Paul serves as the Director of the Catholic Newman Center at Washington State University, and also as the chaplain for the WSU





## **Financial Report - October 2023**

The chart below shows the total assistance that was provided to neighbors in need from the Assumption St. Bridget SVdP Conference during October 2023. All this assistance has come from generous donations from Assumption Parish, St. Bridget Parish, and other benefactors. The total for the month was \$13,454. This consists of both financial assistance and in-kind assistance in the form of groceries and hygiene items from our monthly food drives. All told, our Vincentians assisted 30 families over the course of the month and provided support for 73 people in those homes.



**Rent** continues to be our top assistance category. We assisted 19 people within 8 local families. We also assisted 3 families in South King County with our Twinning gift to the Holy Spirit Conference in Kent.

<u>Utilities</u> was our second largest assistance category. We assisted 20 people within 5 families.

**<u>Beds</u>** was our next largest category, with 4 families getting new beds and bedding during the month.

The next few categories all have to do with food assistance. Our monthly food drives are so successful that we share the groceries with the Georgetown Food Bank. Typically, when we provide food to a family, we provide a bag of groceries, along with a food gift card to be used for fresh food.

All this assistance is due to your generous donations. Thank you so much for contributing to our Assumption St. Bridget SVdP Conference so that we can assist our neighbors in need.

**Mother Cabrini** can teach us how to pray better. Her energy was grounded in her rich prayer life. She had a ferocious desire to do whatever Jesus asked of her.

Mother Cabrini teaches us how to bear difficulties. When we struggle with challenges, acceptance can make the lighter. She said, "If you carry your cross willingly, the cross will carry you."

Mother Cabrini can show us how to grow in humility. St. Frances Cabrini's life is evidence that true humility can lead to bold action and courage. Let us ask her to show us how to follow in her footsteps of faith.

Times change slowly. Just as in Mother Cabrini's time, our world today continues to deal with the challenges of immigration; people coming from wartorn countries, countries plagued with drought or famine, or countries hamstrung by poverty, drugs and human trafficking. Organizations such as one in New York, Cabrini Immigrant Services, help by empowering immigrants and their families with education, access to essential services, and working with communities to be more inclusive.

I have a great personal story about Mother Cabrini. In 2012, a friend of mine had fallen and broken her thigh just above her knee replacement. A short time later I went to the Midwest to teach iconography near Chicago. A friend took me to see sights, including the Mother Cabrini shrine/monument in Chicago. We entered the church and I gazed at the altar, where a relic could be seen from far back in the nave.

It was the thigh bone of Mother Cabrini. After I stopped chuckling, I made an offering to Mother Cabrini and said a prayer of healing for my friend, Maggie.

My Chicago friend was a doctor, and during his training he worked sometimes at Columbus hospital site located near the shrine. He said that videos would be shown in patients' rooms, and that if no video was available, an image of Mother Cabrini's thigh bone would appear on the screen.

## **Prayer**

Almighty and Eternal Father, Giver of all Gifts, show us Your mercy, and grant, we beseech You, through the merits of Your faithful Servant, Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, that all who invoke her intercession may obtain what they desire according to the good pleasure of Your Holy Will ... ( name your request).

O Lord Jesus Christ, Savior of the world, mindful of Your bountiful goodness and love, deign, we implore You, through the tender devotion of Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini for Your Sacred Heart, to hear our prayers and grant our petitions.

O God, the Holy Spirit, Comforter of the afflicted, Fountain of Light and Truth, through the ardent zeal of Your humble handmaid, Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini, grant us Your all-powerful aid in our necessities, sanctify our souls and fill our minds with Divine Light that we may see the Holy Will of God in all things.

Please continue to pray for me as I create icons of St. Brigid and Mother Cabrini for your parish. As I work I pray for all of you. Kathy Sievers

The two icon panels now each have ten layers of gesso on them. I purchased a new sander with a vacuum, as I'll be sanding them in my studio due to the rainy season. Rather than send pictures of blank white panels, I will share more info about St. Bridget and Mother Cabrini. Note: I use the spelling of Brigid or Bridget interchangeably. The next icon update will show the panels with the drawings lined in brown.

The Celtic name Brigid means fiery arrow. It can be traced back to the goddess of the same name, with whom Brigid is often confused. The name Brigid is derived from the Gaelic noun brigh, which means power, strength, vigor, virtue, or exalted. Brigid is sometimes called Mary of the Gael, or Bride of the Holy Fire.

Brigid is recognized as a saint in Catholic, Anglican, and Eastern Catholic and Orthodox churches. A total of 46 miracles are attributed to St. Bridget, which include healing, making or increasing amounts of food, taming domestic animals—all to aid those in need.

At St. Bridget Parish, you follow in Brigid's example in your outreach to poor and sick, particularly helping those families staying at the nearby Children's Medical Center.

A flower, Anemone Coronaria St. Brigid, is a florist favorite, with lavish colors and a long vase life. It is a tough plant that can return year after year. This rugged flower can be a metaphor for the determination and vigor to serve others at St. Bridget Parish.

In Ireland, an old tradition is to put a blue ribbon outside one's house on the night of January 31/Feb. 1. The tradition holds that Brigid will pass by and will bless the ribbon, which can then be used to cure migraines. I have personal experience with migraines so this sits very well with me.

Brigid is the patron saint of midwives, newborns, abused children, Irish nuns, fugitives, blacksmiths, dairy workers, boat men, chicken farmers, cattle, scholars, sailors, those with migraines, and more.

The feast of St. Brigid is Feb. 1. An old custom in Ireland is to celebrate with a meal of potatoes, freshly churned butter, chopped cabbage, and apple cakes, served with tea.

In Ireland in 1964, 595 babies were named Brigid, the 8<sup>th</sup> most popular name of that year. In 1965, the total was 293, 26<sup>th</sup> most popular name. From 1995 to 1962, 62 girls were named Bridget. From 2018 to 2020, 11 girls were named Brigid, and in 2021, only 3. Her name has fallen out of favor, yet she lives on in the lives of believers and in parishes dedicated to her.



# Icon Project for St. Bridget Parish Seattle, WA April 2023



## Hello St. Bridget Parish!

This is an introduction to the creation of icons for your sanctuary. In this very rough sketch, you see the general layout of the icons and how they will fit in the sanctuary.

St. Bridget of Kildare is to the left of the altar, and St. Frances Xavier Cabrini is to the right.

Both of these saints are powerful figures who lived their faith in Jesus Christ by serving others.

# Icon Project for St. Bridget Parish Seattle, WA

Here is a brief outline of the steps in the process of creation of icons.

- 1. Refine drawings of the saints
- 2. Create large wood panels the correct size
- 3. Apply gesso for the base coats on the panels; sand panels smooth
- 4. Transfer the enlarged drawings to the prepared panels
- 5. Begin applying color, then paint highlights
- 6. Apply gold leaf to haloes, etc
- 7. Finishing touches: paint, inscriptions, borders
- 8. Varnish completed icons.
- 9. Deliver icons to parish
- 10. Install and bless icons

I expect the project to take from one to one and one-half years. As I progress through the stages, I will send newsletters to update your community.

I will include information about St. Bridget and St. Frances in each newsletter. They led fascinating lives and are courageous models of Christianity for all of us.

An important part of the process of creating icons is to establish a prayer relationship. I will be praying for you as I work on the icons.

I ask that you would pray for me as I undertake this project.

To create icons, I begin with the Sacramentary and look at the prayers for the feast day of the saint. I study their lives.

Then I look at images that have been created throughout history, models from Western and Eastern Christianity. I also analyze the images to discover the proportions and ratios of the figures and setting.

A canon of rules exist for creating icons, which I follow. These rules have been handed down throughout Christianity. Once I am familiar with the rules for a particular saint, I am free to create variations that remain true to the canon.

Since both of these saints are Western, I can look at models of women saints in the Eastern Church as prototypes.

Sometimes stained glass windows are helpful, such as this image of St. Bridget.

# ST-BRIDGET ® KIDARE

St. Bridget lived in Kildare, Ireland, from 451 to 525. She is considered a pillar of Christianity in Ireland, along with St. Patrick and St. Colomba. She was born a slave, as was her mother. She served the poor from a very young age.

She started communities of religious in Ireland. She ruled as an Abbess over her monastery of Kildare, thus the staff is a symbol of her authority.



St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was born in Italy in 1850. She came to the US as a missionary sister to serve the large numbers of Italian immigrants who had come to the US. She started schools and orphanages for many children, including one just across the street from your parish, which is now Villa Academy.
