

A REFLECTION BY FR. WILLIAM HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ.

This Sunday, March 24th begins the church's celebration of Holy Week, where at the start of the Passion/Palm Sunday Mass, we hear these words that introduce this sacred week in the life of our church:



Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of our lord's Paschal mystery, that is to say, of his Passion and Resurrection, for it was to accomplish this mystery that he entered his own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the lord's entry into the city for our salvation, following in his footsteps, so that, being made by his grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in his Resurrection and in his life.

That introduction in many ways summarizes the purpose of Holy Week. It also invites us to enter these days more deeply and give them a special priority in our lives. Please note in our parish communications the schedule for liturgies this week, and make a point to attend one, or more, or all of them. You won't regret it!

The Fruit of our Lenten Sacrifice

"Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the

point of death, even death on a cross." — Philippians 2:7-8

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, one of the most significant moments of the Church year. During this week, we journey with Christ from his triumphant entry into Jerusalem to his final meal with his closest friends and ultimately to his death on the cross.

As we walk with Jesus through Holy Week, we call to mind the countless men, women and children who even today carry heavy crosses: crosses of hunger, of homelessness, of a lack of resources or security. In these brothers and sisters we encounter Christ, as he walks that long road to Calvary. In these encounters, it's important not to forget an essential pillar of Lenten spirituality—almsgiving—which allows us to help those who are most in need.

This final week of Lent is also a time to reflect on those words of Saint Paul to the Philippians. Jesus emptied himself for us; how might we empty ourselves for others? Our Lenten prayers, fasting and almsgiving have prepared us to wrestle with this question.

We must always remember that Holy Week gives way to Easter—the fast turns into a feast. God wins the day. As we prepare to celebrate Easter with joy, it is our responsibility as members of God's one human family to share that joy with everyone, near and far.



Assumption St. Bridget SVdP

Financial Report - February 2024

During February 2024, our Assumption St. Bridget St Vincent de Paul Conference provided \$13,345 of financial assistance to our neighbors in need. This was made possible by the generous donations of our parishioners.

Rent assistance was our largest category as we provided \$8,919 to 17 families to help with their rent. But in some ways, the most interesting assistance category was Beds. We provided 8 beds to 5 families during February for a total cost of \$2,461. This is the most we have ever spent on beds for neighbors in one month.

Four of the families that received beds were from a relatively new community that opened in Magnuson Park called <u>Sand Point Cottages</u>. This is a group of 22 tiny homes on the south side of NE 65th Street, just inside Magnuson Park. These tiny homes are studio and one-bedroom cottages of affordable housing for families and individuals employed at low wages. The community was developed and is managed by the Low Income Housing Institute. Many of these residents were formerly homeless.



The tiny home cottages are wonderful – they have kitchens, bathrooms, lofts, and heat pumps for heating and cooling. However, they were equipped with small cots that have a metal bar in the middle that is very uncomfortable for older and/or larger people. Two of the bed recipients were disabled men in their late 60s, and another was a disabled woman in her mid-50s. We provided 2 twin beds to a woman in her mid-20s with three small children. She is a domestic violence survivor and needed a home and supplies to begin her new life.

The final family that we provided beds for was from <u>Sand Point Family Housing</u>, also located in Magnuson Park. The family consisted of a disabled woman with 4 teenage children. She had finally found an affordable home and was desperate for furniture and supplies in her new residence. Our SVdP conference provided her with 1 Queen and 2 Full beds to give her family the gift of a good night's sleep.
