

A REFLECTION BY FR. WILLIAM HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ,

Serving in the Northeast Seattle Catholic Community brings me near **St. Luke Parish** in Shoreline, where I grew up in a family of five boys and two girls. We were part of the post-war baby boom, as were many Catholics. Many of the families we knew at the parish had at least five children. We knew several with 8 or



more, most of which attended the parish school. When I started at St. Luke in 1960, there were 748 students in the school. My first-grade class numbered 60, taught by a young Dominican Nun who was just out of college. My sibs and I received most of our sacraments at St. Luke, where I also presided at my first Mass after being ordained a priest in 1981. My most recent experience at St. Luke's was this past July 24th, when the family gathered to celebrate our beloved mother's funeral Mass. For that reason, and many others, St. Luke's holds a special place in my heart.

This Friday, October 18, is the **Feast of St. Luke the Evangelist**, whose gospel we will hear in the lectionary cycle C readings that begin Dec. 1, the first Sunday of **Advent**. Luke's gospel is a powerful and brilliant literary work. It highlights Jesus' concern for the poor, his healing ministry to the sick, and the important role that women played in his ministry. That ministry continues in Luke's second book, the **Acts of the Apostle**, which describes the formation of the church of Jesus.

Luke's gospel then highlights some important ministries in our family of parishes. Our **St. Vincent de Paul Society** gives valuable assistance to the poor in North Seattle. Please consider offering financial support for this work or joining one of our conferences. The **Camillus Ministry** offers pastoral care to Children's Medical Center families, while other parish volunteers bring communion to homebound people. We could use more volunteers in this area as well. Finally, last weekend, the **Phoebe Circle** at OLL reminded us of the ministry and pastoral leadership of so many women in our parishes. Thanks to **Beth Schweiger, Chris Covey, and Anne Rademacher** for their fine reflections at all our Masses last weekend.

The October Narrative

Your contributions to St. Vincent de Paul are at work now more than ever at the Sand Point Cottages at the entrance to Magnuson Park on 65th NE. Over the past year, our Conference has been helping these new neighbors who were formerly homeless as they settle into the Cottages community. Although small, the





cottages themselves include a kitchenette, dining/living room area, bathroom, sleeping loft, and, in the larger units, a small bedroom as well. To date, we have helped 21 families of all ages,

which include 22 adults and 11 children. Homes were initially furnished with only a cot for sleeping, and one of the most frequent requests at the outset was for a twin bed and bed linens. Our 'bed package' includes a mattress, box springs, frame, linen set, and a vinyl or insect-repellant mattress cover as needed. It ranges in cost from \$235 to \$355 per bed. Over the winter, one of our members rallied friends and gathered comforters for these neighbors. In addition, St. Vincent de Paul store vouchers or Goodwill gift cards were provided for some household goods and small furnishings needed when setting up a new home. We have also helped with requests for rent support as these neighbors adjust (support has averaged \$460). Finally, the generous donations by parishioners of food and hygiene items have enabled us to help stock pantries that started out quite empty. Our conference president consults with the cottage manager and social worker to help these new neighbors. Please keep them in your prayers.
