

A REFLECTION BY FR. HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ,

This past Wednesday, we had an initial meeting of those who have been nominated to serve on the **Parish Family Advisory Council**, henceforth known as **PFAC**. This is the consultative body that will eventually serve as the pastoral council for the single parish we will become in NE Seattle. The "Handbook for Parish Families" describes the role of the PFAC as follows:



This council is the pastor's go-to group to consult about **Partners in the Gospel**, including changes that impact the

parish family, shared events, collaboration across parishes, and more. Comprised of parishioners from each parish in the family, this council focuses on the health of the entire parish family, looking beyond the needs of each individual community. They will be the key consultative body for the creation of the strategic pastoral plan called the One Parish Plan that will be submitted to the archbishop prior to becoming one canonical parish. They will also help ensure the necessary discernment processes are in place for the completion of the strategic pastoral plan.

I've highlighted the last sentence because it describes what I think is the most important role of the PFAC, which is to facilitate the discernment that is vital to the success of this plan. **Discernment** involves regular prayer, listening, dialogue, and forming a consensus as to what the Holy Spirit is calling us to become as the Catholic Community in NE Seattle. Discernment involves everyone in our four parishes. One of the PFAC's essential roles will be to facilitate synodal listening sessions to hear the hopes and dreams of our community, and also the fears and concerns we need to address in becoming a single parish.

We are blessed to have 18 people willing to serve on our PFAC. In order to become a manageable working group, we are narrowing the final number to 12, which will include 3 representatives from each of our four parishes. I hope to announce the members of the group sometime after Easter, and to begin meeting with them regularly from that point on. Please pray for this process to produce a dynamic and spirit filled renewal of the life of our NE Seattle Catholic Community!



Lenten Recipe -Chole Punjabi

Ingredients: 1 T canola oil, 1 onion, 2 tsp minced garlic, 1 minced jalapeno, 1 -14oz can diced tomatoes, 1.5 tsp paprika, 1 tsp ground coriander, 1/2 tsp garam masala, 1/4 tsp turmeric, 1 tsp salt, 2 - 15 oz cans chickpeas, 1 tsp lemon juice, prepared brown rice



Method: Heat oil. Cook onion until soft

and translucent. Add minced garlic and jalapeno for 1 min. Add canned tomatoes, undrained. Cover and cook 5-6min. Transfer to a blender or blend using an immersion blender. Return contents to pan and add spices, chickpeas, and lemon juice. Simmer over low heat, stirring about every 10 minutes for a total of 50-60 min. Serve over brown rice.
