

# A WEEKLY REFLECTION submitted by Deacon Joe Twidwell

#### THE PARABLE OF THE EVER-LOVING FATHER?

This Sunday's Gospel is commonly known as the parable of the "Prodigal Son" however there are other characters in this story, and which do you identify with? As a parable, Jesus was using a real-life situation to teach a basic theological concept and to provoke introspection by the hearers.

When hearing this parable for the first time, many of Jesus' disciples and apostles must have shaken their heads in confusion. The listeners were family members and each probably could identify with one or more of the characters in story and compared their response to that of the character they identify with. What father hearing that the wayward son wished his father dead so he could inherit his share of the estate would not be appalled and reject that son forever? In this case the father responds in a completely opposite course and goes out every day searching the horizon for his wayward son's return. Furthermore, when he sees him on the horizon, the father runs to greet the son. The final irony is when the father gives the son a ring and cloak and kills the fatted calf to celebrate his return. Many listeners would have thought that the father was crazy.

That shocking action however was the trigger for Jesus being able to tell the listeners about God's unlimited love and forgiveness which was unlike anything they had experienced. Earthly things are limited in quantity and that scarce mentality kept people from believing that God does love each of us totally and completely that His love for one of us does not diminish the supply of love that He has for me in any way.

The parable underscores two essential realities of our relationship with God. First, that God loves all of us forever and there is nothing we can do to separate ourselves from His love- we can refuse it but regardless, He will not stop loving us and will be there if or when we turn back to Him. (Romans 8:38-39) "I am convinced that nothing can ever separate us from his love. Death can't, and life can't. The angels can't, and the demons can't. Our fears for today, our worries about tomorrow, and even the powers of hell can't keep God's love away. Whether we are high above the sky or in the deepest ocean, nothing in all creation will ever be able to separate us from the love of God that is revealed in Christ Jesus our Lord."

The second point is that God's forgiveness is without limit if we ask for it with contrition. Hear this clearly in Matt 18:21-35. Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times? "Jesus answered, "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." And the joy God feels when we ask for forgiveness is evident in Matt 18:12-24. "If a man has a hundred sheep and one of them goes astray, will he not leave the ninety-nine in the hills and go in search of the stray? And if he finds it, amen, I say to you, he rejoices more over it than over the ninety-nine that did not stray. In just the same way, it is not the will of your heavenly Father that one of these little ones be lost."

God's love for us is radical beyond our comprehension. All we need to do is be open to accept it.


