A WEEKLY REFLECTION Submitted by Deacon Joe Twidwell

AS TIME GOES BY....

How did you feel when you walked into the home improvement store in September and were greeted by their gigantic Christmas display? If you are like me, you were a little miffed and asked: "What happened to Halloween, Thanksgiving and the months leading up to Christmas?" In our society today it's all too easy to allow ourselves to completely forget about the "Reason for the Season". Realizing this, even before "Black Friday" sales, the Church has observed the season of Advent, so as to give us a time for contemplation and preparation.

Advent is the name given to the season of 24 days leading up to Christmas. The word "Advent" is derived from the Latin word *adventus*, which means "coming". The waiting and anticipation undertaken during Advent symbolize not only the waiting for Christ's birth, but also for his final return.

Within the Church, this period is observed as an Advent season of anticipation and preparation for the coming of Jesus Christ on Christmas. In other words, Advent intentionally sets aside time to pause and thoughtfully reflect on the nativity story and its impact in the midst of a world that seems to rush through the holidays faster and faster each year.

Typically, Advent is celebrated over the four Sundays leading up to Christmas, marked by a reading from Scripture and a devotional or reflection. Many also engage with daily devotionals in the days between each of the four Sundays in order to even more thoroughly orient themselves towards the birth of Christ.

With one week until Advent, what will you do to prepare for the coming of Christ the King, whom we celebrate on this Sunday? Before Diana and I brought our children home from the hospital after their birth, we set about praying, planning and preparing to make our children feel welcome and loved and learning about how to nurture our child. The Baby Jesus is coming into our hearts again and how ready are we to make Him feel loved on Christmas Day, but more importantly, the rest of the year?

What will you and your family do to be ready to fully appreciate the birth of our Savior? There are many opportunities: creating and praying with an Advent Wreath; setting up our nativity set individual pieces each night; reading a chapter from the infancy narrative from the Gospel of Luke and studying about Israel and where the Holy Family might have been on that day; signing up for one or more devotionals such as Matthew Kelly's Best Advent Ever; reconciliation; adoration or creating your own tradition.

"God so loved the world that he gave His one and only Son..." <u>John 3:16</u>. Regardless of what you do; **JUST <u>DO SOMETHING</u> TO SHOW HIM YOU LOVE HIM!!**


