From the Desk of Father Kevin

Preparing to Celebrate "The Sacred Mysteries" of Our Faith

As we approach Holy Week and find our lives immersed in all sorts of plans, I join many of you wondering if I will be able to successfully juggle "all the balls in the air". Nevertheless, I know that given the 41 Good Fridays/Easters I have celebrated as a priest, all this preparation is important. I receive much encouragement and support from the enthusiastic planning done by many people.

Below are some of the preparations that I am aware of:

- Three high school students are working very hard to learn their lines and actions for the Passion according to Luke which will be presented at our St. Wenceslaus site on Palm/Passion Sunday.
- Five adults, three from Faith Point Lutheran and two from St. Wenceslaus are learning their lines and actions for the two Good Friday liturgies we will do ecumenically on Good Friday.
- Lectors are preparing themselves to proclaim God's Word with clarity and conviction for the liturgies of Holy Week.
- Our musicians and choirs are practicing to support our worship with the powerful beauty of sung liturgical worship.
- Sacristans, liturgical decor people, and servers are readying themselves to do the important "behind the scenes" things that enable and deepen the celebration of our faith.
- Our staff, including our skilled maintenance people, are preparing the church and grounds for the gathering of our people to celebrate the sacred mysteries of Holy Week.
- This year we have the opportunity to gather in one Easter Vigil ~ a unified "New Prague Area Catholic Community". Participants from all three of our sites will join together to proclaim the scriptures, lead the sung prayer, act as Mass servers.
 - There are other things happening as well!

All of this activity I connect with the powerful realities that unfold in the lives of our people. Some are entering the life of our faith community having been without any real connection to a community that celebrates and nurtures faith. Some have family members facing into the reality of a terminal disease and needing to awaken the embrace of Jesus who was victorious over human suffering and death. Some will remember the loss of loved ones who have entered fully into the reality of death with the hope of rising with Christ to the fullness of eternal life.

All of us need the consolation and rescue that comes from Jesus Christ's being willing to enter into what it is to be human in all things but sin. He shared with us the limitations of our humanity by fully being one of us. He too suffered terrible things in his short 30 years as Jesus of Nazareth. He too would die and be buried, only by the power and love of God to be raised up out of all of it ~ so we could enter into the mysteries of faith! We have much to celebrate! We have good reason to plan carefully.

Irish Eyes are Smiling

This coming Thursday is St. Patrick's Day. I know many people perceive it as an excuse to drink beer and be disorderly, but it means far more than that to me. St. Patrick's Day reminds me I am part of a clan. My cousins and their cousins along with assorted aunts and uncles represent the Irish side of me. This side is sometimes loud and perhaps a bit rowdy, but the majority of my Irish relatives are Catholic and a fair number of them are active in their parishes. Their relationship with God means something to them. Since around the time my Grandparents died, our clan stopped getting together for Christmas and Easter. We do see each other most St. Patrick's Days. My parents never miss as we march in the parade in downtown St. Paul.

St. Patrick's own story is one of mercy. Patrick, an Englishman, was kidnapped and made a slave in Ireland. He escaped, came back to England and was ordained a priest. He became a missionary Bishop and was sent to Ireland. He developed a deep love for the Irish people. He led them from being pagan to embracing the Catholic faith. His missionary work converted Chieftains and peasants alike. St. Patrick dedicated his life into making Ireland a strong place for the Church to grow.

What mercy St. Patrick must have possessed to be able to forgive the Irish people for his slavery. He didn't hold a grudge. He embraced them with love. His actions show mercy in action. Ireland has suffered much hurt over the centuries, but the spirit of the people has not dampened. Maybe you are not Irish and March 17th doesn't mean anything to you. I would ask you to consider pausing on that day and pray for the intercession of St. Patrick in order to have greater missionary appeal. St. Patrick did the work of evangelization. We can follow his example and spread mercy everywhere we go.

Stations of the Cross

For Catholics throughout the world, the Stations of the Cross are synonymous with Lent, Holy Week, and especially, Good Friday. This devotion is also known as the "Way of the Cross," the "Via Crucis," and the "Via Dolorosa." It commemorates 14 key events on the day of Christ's crucifixion. It honors His final walk through the streets of Jerusalem, carrying the Cross. The Stations originated in medieval Europe when wars prevented Christian pilgrims from visiting the Holy Land. European artists created works depicting scenes of Christ's journey to Calvary. The faithful installed these sculptures or paintings at intervals along a procession route, inside the parish church, or outdoors. Performing the devotion meant walking the entire route, stopping to pray at each "station." Don't miss these last opportunities for Stations of the Cross this Lent.




