Pope Francis urges us to care for our common home: Let EVERY day be Earth Day!

Scientists have come to a consensus: Climate change will have a major impact on food production, sea levels, and life as we know it. Here and around the world, it is the poor who will be hit hardest with more droughts, floods, hunger, and joblessness. As faithful Catholics, we have a moral obligation to care for both Creation and the poor. It is truly a daunting problem, and we can feel too small to make a difference. But there are things we can all do:



ACT (some simple reminders):

- Unplug your cell phone, ipad, and other electronice devices as soon as they are charged.
- · Replace incandescent lightbulbs with energy-efficient bulbs.
- · Turn off lights and appliances when you leave a room.
- · Turn off water when shaving or brushing your teeth and take shorter showers.
- · Ride a bike, walk, carpool, or use public transportation whenever possible. Consolidate errands.
- · Use biodegradable soap, shampoos.
- Reduce use of disposable products by using reusable containers; if you must buy disposable, buy paper or glass products instead of plastic.
- · Bring reusable cloth bags when shopping instead of disposable plastic bags.
- · Buy local and/or organic food and purchase recycled products whenever possible.
- · Plant a garden and start a compost pile.
- Eat less meat: the UN concludes that "the livestock sector emerges as one of the top two or three most significant contributors to the most serious environmental problems," including climate change.
- · Dry your clothes outdoors when possible and use the dryer less.
- · Reflect on ways to simplify your life: What are my needs vs. wants? How might I reduce the amount of resources I consume?

PRAY:

- for all: that we might see Creation as a gift to be cherished, protected, and shared with all rather than a commodity to be consumed by a few;
- for the poor: that our hearts be opened to their plight, that their dignity be upheld, and that we advocate on their behalf so that they can have the basic necessities of life.

It is a fundamental obligation of a Christian to be a follower of Christ. For more than a year now, parish staff and I have been talking about ensuring that St. Wenceslaus is, and will continue to be, such a parish ~ a "home for and of disciples". We will share ideas and begin the work of laying a foundation that could significantly impact the mission of the New Prague Area Catholic Community. From the Desk of Father Dave

The Lamb

In honor of Good Shepherd Sunday, I thought I would share an experience I had a few years ago. Back in my home county, a teenage girl was struck and killed by a car early in the summer. She was a 4-Her with a sheep project she would never be able to show. Her lamb came to the fair and was put up to bid at the auction after all the other animals had been sold. It brought a great price of over \$600. Then the auctioneer asked the gentleman with the winning bid, "Would you like to donate the lamb back?" "Yes," was the answer. So then the lamb was sold again for almost as much. The question came again, "Do you want to donate it back?" "Yes," boomed the answer. This process went on over and over again. Each time the auctioneer asked if the person wanted to donate it back. Each time the winning bidder answered yes. This was done until over \$14,000 was collected. Her family got the lamb and the money raised went to start a scholarship to be awarded in the young woman's name. There was a great sense of community pride in the arena. I was very happy as my own Dad had been one of the winning bidders. The lamb had brought forth charity from many of those gathered at the fair that day.

Jesus is the lamb and he came at a cost. The cost was his life, and even though the action happened only once, our sins are always paid for. When we sacrifice, we participate in this process. The lamb is sold on our behalf and each time we are asked if we want to participate by following him. For those who believe, the answer is yes. Each time we suffer we give back the lamb, so Jesus can be there for the next one who suffers. Each time we give we are participants in the salvation we receive. We do not earn the salvation, but we are offered this gift over and over again. Ultimately, all of creation is the winner of the scholarship that Jesus earned on our behalf. As Christians, we are asked to give so that our gift may benefit others. We are to give without counting the cost. We gain so much more than we are ever able to give.


