Encourage us, we pray, in our struggle for justice, love, and peace.



More on Laudato Si'...

~ September 1st ~

A Day to Especially Pray for the Care of Our Common Home!

What kind of a world do we want to leave to our children? In what positive ways can we impact the future of the planet? We will be asking ourselves these questions here at St. Wenceslaus in the coming year. On September 25, we will celebrate the dedication of our new parking lot as we gather around a large sign gracing the corner of the intersection northwest of the church. This sign will be a visible reminder of our connection as a church community to all of creation, proclaiming the words "Laudato Si'," which come from the first two words of St. Francis' Canticle of the Creatures. Laudato Si': On Care for our Common Home is the title of Pope Francis' encyclical on integral ecology.

Pope Francis has taken the lead in calling Catholics and all people to conversion. Laudato Si' is about the interconnected relationships of: our Creator, the earth, and each other to all life on the planet. He especially asks us to look at the needs of the poor, who are affected most by climate change. He accepts the best scientific research and the growing scientific consensus but grounds his call to action in a spiritual perspective ~ beginning with the call to care for creation from the book of Genesis. He asks us to examine the effects of technology and economic systems that put profit ahead of people and challenges us to make sacrifices for the common good.

This document has a sense of urgency about it, yet *Laudato Si'* is hopeful, assuring us that God is with us, that we CAN make a difference in our personal and collective response and concern for creation and all life.

During the past year, a group of parishioners studied *Laudato Si* and, this week, school and parish staff will be attending a retreat day on *Laudato Si* at the Franciscan Retreat Center in Prior Lake, led by Rochester Sister of St. Francis, Sr. Kathy Warren. We hope to focus this year on understanding how we can make a difference in responding to the call to care for our common home. I encourage and invite all of us to be a part of the discussion, the prayer, and the acts in behalf of our common home.

Why clean your feather pillows?


