
SOLEMNITY OF MARY, THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

From the Desk of Father Kevin

Solemnity of Mary ~ Mother of God

Many of you have heard the wonderful Christmas song "Mary, did you know?" This new Christmas carol has really captured me this Christmas. I think the questions asked by it pushes us deeper into what we celebrate as a Christian community, not only here in this Christmas season, but also weekly when the Christian community gathers for Eucharist.

Note some of the words of "Mary, did you know?":

Mary did you know that your baby boy will save our sons and daughters? Did you know that your baby boy has come to make you new?

Mary did you know that your baby boy will calm a storm with his hand? Did you know that your baby boy has walked where angels trod? And when you kiss your little baby, you have kissed the face of God.

Mary did you know, Mary did you know, Mary did you know?

What is the answer to all those questions? In working toward an answer of did she or didn't she, you and I enter more deeply into why we are

So, what did Mary know?

- As she was carrying the fetal Christ within her? Did she know?
- As she held her newborn infant in her arms, what did she know?
- When mysterious strangers from the east came with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh for anointing the dead body of her son, did she know?
- When Mary, Joseph, and infant Jesus had the political environment threaten their very lives and they fled to Egypt becoming refugees in a foreign land so that they could survive, did Mary know?
- When Joseph and Mary, parented the adolescent Jesus and they lose him in Jerusalem and Mary expresses her displeasure with her teenage son, did she know?
- Finally, when she held the lifeless, crucified body of her deceased son, did she know? What answer would Michelangelo give who carved the "Pieta" of Mary holding the lifeless body of her son?

I believe the answers we give to these questions enrich the mystery of the Incarnation of God which we celebrate as a church. My answers are "No" ~ primarily in her conscious thinking Mary did NOT know. She was like us, trying to consciously understand why things are the way they are and dealing with a lot of bewilderment and sometimes painful, alarming shock.

But on the other hand, my answers to "Mary, did you know....?" are also YES she did! Her spiritual intuition unconsciously allowed her to trust the hand of God in the realities of her life and her Son's life. Her life teaches us who we are as disciples of Jesus. She was convinced that whatever happened, her life would "magnify the Lord". She wasn't doing "her thing" her own way. She was pregnant with Christ ~ before and after she gave birth to Him. She was living her life with Christ, in Christ, and thru Christ. It is what got her to where her life needed to be.

Our living as disciples of Jesus gets us to where we need to be. Of course, as with Mary, our journeys are meandering trips where most of the time we don't know the way, except to trust that we journey with Christ. That journey includes the support and guidance that comes from journeying with other disciples within a faith community who are also "pregnant" with Christ living with, in, and through them.



In Pope Francis' view, there is no fundamental difference between domestic violence and nuclear dissuasion. Both of them are based on the same violent logic that he proposes in his <u>message</u> for the World Day of Peace on January 1 to replace with an ethic of non-violence.

In the face of "piecemeal violence," Pope Francis therefore exhorts us to "make active nonviolence our way of life," that is "the hallmark of our decisions, our relationships and our actions, and indeed of political life in all its forms."

"To be true followers of Jesus today also includes embracing his teaching about nonviolence," he insists.

Is this the end of the "just war" and "legitimate defense"? In Rome in April, an international conference organized by Pax Christi and the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace called on the Church to stop teaching "the theory of the just war."

"This message is in continuity with that meeting," answered Cardinal Peter Turkson, the current president of Justice and Peace.

For Cardinal Turkson, who will become the head of the new dicastery on integral development on January 1, when one sees that the theory of just war is being used to justify aggression and not just defense, then there is a need to verify whether the theory of the just war still remains valid."

"This is a question that needs to be examined more deeply," he recognized. "For example, it could be the theme of a synod."

In Cardinal Turkson's view, what needs to happen is to deal with the issue "starting from the human heart."

"The culture of non-violence must commence inside ourselves," he explained.

"Violence takes root inside us, then in families before later expressing itself in the arms trade and wars between states," added Archbishop Silvano Tomasi, another member of the new dicastery.

This was the logic that the pope endeavored to apply in his message, explaining that "the politics of nonviolence have to begin in the home and then spread to the entire human family."

Pope Francis therefore calls for "an end to domestic violence and to the abuse of women and children" inside the family before in the same movement launching "a call for disarmament and for the prohibition and abolition of nuclear weapons."

Presenting the Beatitudes as "a program and a challenge for political and religious leaders, the heads of international institutions, and business and media executive," he therefore proposes "active nonviolence" as "a way of showing that unity is truly more powerful and more fruitful than conflict."

Certainly, Pope Francis admits, "differences can create frictions." But "let us face them constructively and non-violently," the pope counsels.

The Catholic Church too will assist "in every effort to build peace through active and creative non-violence."
