

### From the Desk of Mary Higgins

I was a stranger, and you welcomed me.

Lord, when did we see you a stranger and welcome you? Whatever you did for one of these least of mine, you did for me.

Matthew 25: 35, 37, 40

Immediately following today's Gospel account of the Magi visiting Jesus in the manger, Matthew tells us that Joseph was directed in a dream to "Rise, take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt..." because Herod had plans to kill the child who threatened his kingship. And the Holy Family became refugees.

What happened to them in Egypt, we might wonder. They must have arrived tired, maybe hungry. Were they wel-

comed, given a place to stay?

This Sunday has been designated as Immigration Sunday Minnesota by our state's Catholic bishops. They hope to increase awareness of the 65 million people around the world who are displaced from their homes, including 2 million refugees from war, violence, and the effects of climate change, living in often very difficult circumstances.

Bishop Cozzens tells us, "We must make room in our hearts for our brothers and sisters, especially those who are most in need. We don't want to be like those persons on that first Christmas who told Mary and Joseph that there was no room in the inn."

What can we do? The first place to begin is in our hearts. Each one of us can ask ourselves, how welcoming am I to others? Do I smile at the stranger in church, in the grocery line, in the restaurant? We can give as we are able to Catholic Relief Services or other organizations that serve refugees. We can offer to bring a meal to Hope House or spend some time with the families there who are working their way out of being homeless. Kudos to our young parishioners who recently raised funds by sleeping outside in the cold, increasing their awareness of what it might be like to be homeless.

Our Minnesota bishops have launched a postcard campaign to help us encourage our legislators to support the DREAM Act of 2017. If passed, it would provide a path to citizenship for as many as 800,000 young adults who were brought into the country without authorization as children and who meet certain conditions, to work, attend college and have a driver's license. President Trump has urged Congress to find a solution to support these young people who contribute much to our country before March, when the first permits issued under the Obama administration will expire.

It's a simple, small thing for us to fill out a postcard and send it to our legislator. Cards are available in the back of church. Maybe it will affect our representative's vote, maybe not. The most important thing it might do is to open our hearts a little more to concern for the stranger. It's a part of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus, as all of us are called to be.

### From the Desk of Deacon Bob

## The Epiphany

In common usage, having an "epiphany" is one of those "a-HA!" moments when a person has a sudden insight or revelation. On this Solemnity of the Epiphany we celebrate the insight of the wise men who behold the presence of the Christ, the anointed One of God, in a most unlikely place, a barn, and in the form of a baby boy. The shepherds had a similar experience when they went to the same barn the night of Jesus' birth. How do the recurring story of these epiphanies of the shepherds and Magi reveal the epiphanies in our lives? Epiphanies, like those of the shepherds and the Magi, often come as a surprise to us. They are suddenly there. We recognize them for what they are. And, just as we begin to wrap our minds around what has happened to us, they quickly leave us pondering about what they mean, just like Mary.

Who has led us to these epiphanies? The angels led the shepherds to the Christ. The Star led the Magi. Who has led us? In my life, it has been my children. I have encountered the presence, the mystery, and the wonder of God in the birth of my children. I have encountered the same at the deathbed of my sister, Mary, and the deathbeds of those to whom I have ministered over 41 years. I have heard the epiphany in a single chord in an orchestral piece, and recently in a piano piece I composed in memory of my unborn grandchild who died as a result of a miscarriage.

How have we in what we have said, or done, or lived our lives led others to a real encounter with the mystery of God? On this feast of the Epiphany, these are good questions for us to ponder, just like Mary did 2,000 years ago.

### Adult Washington, DC, Trip Meeting






