Global Solidarity Sunday Collection**Called to Global Communion
March 30/31**

God has bestowed each of us with certain gifts and talents. However, due to oppression, poverty, and lack of education, these are often hidden or stifled for our brothers and sisters. The Global Solidarity Sunday Collection is an opportunity for Catholics of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis to help release the gifts and talents of Catholics around the world.

The collection is distributed among four initiatives determined by the United States Catholic Bishops: humanitarian efforts of Catholic Relief Services, the Church in Central and Eastern Europe, the Church in Latin America, and Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa.

Catholic Relief Services Collection:

Catholic Relief Services (CRS): creates opportunities for U.S. Catholics to help struggling people overseas by supporting CRS relief and solidarity efforts in the poorest 100 countries of the world.

Catholic Legal Immigrant Network, Inc: provides legal and support services to Catholic programs representing poor immigrants. It focuses on reunification of families and protection of those fleeing persecution or civil unrest.

Migration and Refugee Services: resettles approximately one quarter of the refugees admitted to the U.S. It promotes just public policy for newcomers and migrants and responds to their spiritual needs.

Department of Justice, Peace and Human Development: advocates for the poor and vulnerable through international peace and justice. It enables the Church to respond to global concerns such as religious freedom and debt relief for poor countries.

For the Church in Central and Eastern Europe:

Our Catholic family in Central Europe has been a story of vitality and strength, a story of hope. Collection funds are used for projects that build the pastoral capacity of the church and restore faith. Examples of projects include supporting seminaries, social service programs, youth ministry, pastoral centers, and church restoration.

For the Church in Latin America:

Families in Latin America and the Caribbean face numerous challenges as they strive to live and share their faith. And they have tremendous joy and faith in the face of difficulties. The Collection for the Church in Latin America empowers the people of Latin America to deepen their faith and share it with the world. In addition, funds are distributed to aid earthquake victims.

Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa:

The Church in Africa is spiritually rich, but desperately poor. Building from the 2001 statement "A Call to Solidarity with Africa," the USCCB began a diocesan collection to build up the pastoral capacity of the Church in Africa.

From the Desk of Deacon Bob

This week, in our Lenten journey, we are called by Jesus to reflect on "forgiveness." Forgiveness is one of Jesus' central themes. In the gospels, we hear Jesus tell the apostles that they must forgive not just 7 times, but 7 times 70 times. In the numerology of Jesus' culture, 7 times 70 means that the forgiveness we extend to others must be "infinite" in number. In the parable of the Prodigal Son, we are given 3 different approaches to forgiveness: 1) The unconditional forgiveness of the Father toward his sinful son, 2) The prodigal son's belief that he is unable to be forgiven, and, 3) the self-righteous brother's resentment and refusal to forgive his sinful brother. Which one of these do we model in our own lives?

Let's start with the behavior of the self-righteous brother. It is very hard to forgive others who have hurt us unjustly. It is documented that Ann Landers and Abigail Van Buren, sisters by blood and authors of self-help newspaper columns, were angry and bitter to each other the entirety of their lives. The forgiveness they advised others to practice, they were incapable of doing themselves. The refusal to forgive can consume our lives and rob us of any happiness. Do we really want to live the bitterness the self-righteous brother feels toward his prodigal brother?

Unless we are narcissists, we all have done something which fills us with regret. It may be something cruel we have said or done to another person. In learning how badly we have hurt another person, the punishment we inflict upon ourselves spiritually and emotionally, can often exceed that of the hurt we caused. We believe that the hurt we caused can never be forgiven. This is what we see in the behavior of the prodigal brother. Is it a life of despair we want to live?

Finally, we come to the unconditional love and forgiveness of the Father. The Father is not chained to the bitterness and anger of the self-righteous brother nor the despair of unforgiveness felt by the prodigal brother. There is only joy and love that is felt by the Father and extended to both. We can choose lives chained to anger and bitterness, chained to the despair of ever being forgiven, or living the life of God's unconditional love and forgiveness. In which will we experience the most happiness?

Feast of Saint Isidore of Seville ~ April 4

Saint Isidore of Seville, canonized a saint in 1598, declared a doctor of the Church in 1722, and because of his determination to use the world's accumulated knowledge for the service of God's glory, was declared the patron saint of the Internet by Pope John Paul II in 1997. With both his brothers, Leander and Fulgentius, and sister Florentina of Cartagena being recognized as saints as well, Saint Isidore is considered the last of the ancient Christian philosophers and the last of the great Latin Church Fathers. Succeeding his elder brother Leander, he was the Archbishop of Seville for more than three decades.

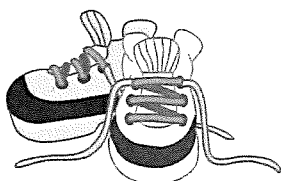
This is part of our Sunday Night Women's speaker series, BUT this time **ALL** adults are welcome!

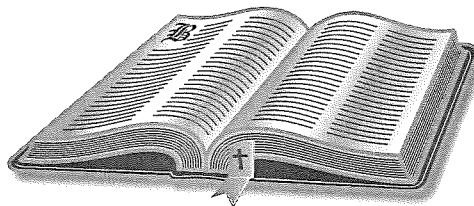

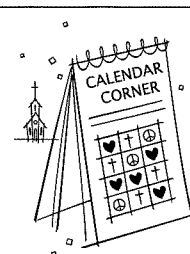
