

From the Desk of Father Eugene Theisen



<u>Padre's Pen</u> – The Presentation of the Lord; Candlemas

Originally observed in the Eastern Churches of our faith as "The Encounter," the Presentation of Our Lord began to be celebrated in the West around the 6th century. In Rome it had a more penitential character and in France it was celebrated with solemn blessings and processions with candles. It was popularly known as Candlemas.

The candles/lights of this day remind us of Simeon's words upon seeing his savior presented in the temple, "... mine own eyes have seen the salvation which you have prepared in the sight of every people: a light to reveal you to the nations and the glory of your people Israel." The light from the Star of Bethlehem at the Nativity has now come into the temple of the Lord in Jerusalem. He comes as an infant in His mother's arms. In accord with the Jewish law, she offers him to the Father.

This is Mary's ongoing fiat. She continues to offer all that she is and all that she has (including her Son, Jesus). Today's celebration brings to a close the Nativity as our Lord enters the silent years until his public ministry begins (with the exception of the Finding in the Temple at age 12). Today is our opportunity to rededicate our lives to God in the "silent years" of our daily lives and we have no better advocate than our Blessed Mother to assist us. We can ask her to take us in her arms and offer us as well to the Father as she did her Son. We can do this in the prayer of St. Alphonsus Liguori:

Today, Oh my queen, I also, in imitation of thee wish to offer my poor heart to God... Offer me as thine to the eternal Father and to Jesus, and pray him that through the merits of his Son, and by thy favor, he may accept me, and take me for his own.



March for Life Trip 2020

Hello everyone! My name is Emily Shimota, and I am your Youth Minister. This past week, I went on a pilgrimage along with one of our youth to March for Life in Washington, D.C. and put together this summary of the trip so you can share in our journey! Tuesday, January 21 and Wednesday, January 22:

We traveled with the Archdiocese of Minneapolis and St. Paul, and all together we had about 270 youth, priests, chaperones and other youth ministers going to stand up for life. On Tuesday evening, we had a sendoff Mass with Archbishop Hebda presiding and received a special blessing.

We then began our long journey to Washington DC, spending about 24 hours on the bus. We drove through mountains, prayed morning and night prayer, discussed the dignity of the human person and human life, and got to know the other people on our bus. We arrived in DC, checked into our hotel and had Mass, games, heard students' testimonies, practiced our pro-life chants for the March on Friday, and prayed night prayer. Our three pillars for this trip were Prayer, Education and Action.

Thursday, January 23:

Today we went to Mass at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception. It was absolutely beautiful, and such an incredible feeling to be with hundreds of young people, parents, youth ministers, priests, nuns and bishops praying for the pro-life movement and the expectant moms and babies.

After Mass, we went to pizza place called "We the Pizza." It was delicious!

We then went to the Holocaust Museum. There are no words to describe the horror of what happened during this time and what we saw at the museum. It relates well to the pro-life movement and what we are fighting for: rights and respect for the dignity of every human person and an end to violence.

We went to the Air and Space Museum after that, and walked around the city. Below is a picture of our group (we were combined with a group from the parish St. Vincent de Paul). Later, we went back to the hotel and had an evening session with everyone else - praying, singing, hearing testimonies from other youth, making signs for tomorrow's March and writing letters to senators and representatives.


Friday, January 24:

Today was the day - the March for Life! We went to Mass in the morning, which our own Bishop Cozzens celebrated and shared a wonderful pro-life testimony, and then went to the Pro-Life Rally, where we heard speakers, including the President of the United States, who was the first President ever to attend the March for Life.



The March for Life started, and we marched with hundreds of thousands of other people from all over the country to stand up for life. We marched for about two hours to the Capitol and ended at the Supreme Court. The march was very peaceful and joyful, filled with prayer and love.

A Catholic church kindly hosted us and gave us hot chocolate and donuts after, and then we headed back to the hotel and had a celebration featuring a pizza party and swing dancing. What a day! A day filled with emotions, some sadness but mostly hope, faith, joy and love and a conviction of what we are doing is important and making history.





From my post on social media:

What an incredible experience at March for Life today. I march for a world where all lives, born and unborn, have rights and are valued. I march for an end to violence against the smallest, most defenseless, voiceless and precious members of our society. I march to stand up for the dignity of every human person. Every life matters, and I am proud to stand up and fight for pro-life today and every day.

There were four priests and Bishop Cozzens along on our pilgrimage, and one of the priests was Father Skluzacek! We were grateful to have him along with us.

Saturday, January 25:

This morning, we got up extra early and packed up our buses. We had Mass at our hotel and then headed off to the National Pro-Life Summit, the pro-life conference featuring many prominent speakers and Students for Life of America. 


