From the Desk of Father Eugene Theisen**Padre's Pen ~ Pentecost**

It's Tuesday morning after Memorial Day and I am just looking at the revised guidelines for our partial opening. I'm going to continue begging your patience and perseverance. I'm hopeful to open to the public for our

daily Masses starting tomorrow, but not as hopeful for this coming weekend. I still need to meet with my staff and work out the last details and changes for our plan. By the time you are reading this, you will already know if we were able to make it happen. Again, please be patient and please persevere in prayer.

A few little housekeeping items I want to be certain everyone knows:

1) the 8:15 pm Mass will not be moving to St. Scholastica this summer. It will remain at St. John.

2) We still have a Capital Campaign because we still have bills and needed repairs. The committee is working hard and discerning a good timeline to restart us from this little "pause" that we have taken. I am deeply grateful for all who have so generously continued to use their Campaign Envelopes or have made other donations.

3) With the departure of our business administrator and the stress of the pandemic response, we have engaged with Catholic Finance Corporation to assist us in developing next year's budget and put together a solid plan for us to present to our Finance Council.

4) We have two Confirmation Masses and three First Communion Masses scheduled. If you have a child in those categories and have not responded to our Faith Formation Office for which Mass you will attend, please do so. If you were unaware of the dates, please contact the Faith Formation Office to get up to date.

5) The ongoing plan for livestreaming is as follows: Livestream Rosary & Mass on Mondays will continue through June 15th, then I will go back to taking Mondays off (after June 15th there will be no livestreams on Mondays). Livestream Mass for Tuesday through Friday 8:00 am, Saturday 5:00 pm, and Sunday 10:30 am will continue for the foreseeable future. We would also like to continue livestreaming the Rosary before Mass for some or all of our livestreamed Masses but we need to consult and collaborate with our volunteers who have normally led Rosary in the past, our music ministry team, and our school (for Wednesday school Masses) to insure we can sustain a livestream Rosary and respect the ministries who partake in our celebration of Mass.

These are quite strange times to most, if not all, of us, but they are not unique in the history of the world. There have been epidemics, pandemics, disasters, plagues, wars, etc., throughout the history of the world. Jesus Christ even states in the Sacred Scriptures that we can expect these events in history. Our mission as faithful Catholics is to pray and persevere in His presence, that His will be done, and that we respond in faith to Him with a sense of common decency and common sense to others.

Today, we will learn a bit more about staff member, MaryCarol Wolf. MaryCarol is the Pastoral Ministry Associate for our parish.

What was your role in ministry for our parish prior to COVID-19?

MaryCarol: *My role in pastoral ministry consists of ministering to the elderly, homebound, hospitalized, as well as organizing and leading Word and Communion services at our senior resident buildings. In addition, I meet with our parishioners in the planning of wake and funeral liturgies along with leading grief support group meetings weekly called GriefShare.*

How has that role changed over the last two plus months?

MaryCarol: *My role hasn't changed much, but every aspect on how to do it has.*

Live streaming Masses have been an addition to my work and has stretched me beyond my comfort zone. I have become comfortable with the camera controls, but there are always unforeseen technical issues we must deal with and much of the time the issues are beyond our control. We thank you for your patience and are very happy we can provide this service to all missing our beautiful Mass.

The saddest change is our Funeral Masses. Planning the liturgy for the Mass with the families breaks my heart. Telling them they may only have ten people in the church to say goodbye to their loved one is just not right. The support of family and friends are missed and unnatural and, for those unable to attend, makes it difficult to find closure. We have live streamed the funeral Masses for those who cannot attend. It helps, but it is not the same. I encourage you all to reach out to these families online, by phone, or cards.

The pandemic has compounded the grief of the participants in our GriefShare support group. They have the loss of their loved one along with the loss of personal freedom, connecting with others in isolation, and leaving them very lonely. We could no longer meet as a group and went to call conference or video Zoom meetings. It has worked out nicely with great attendance but lacking much needed hugs.

Social visits with the elderly and homebound, especially in our senior buildings, have diminished for the unforeseen future. It has been replaced with phone calls and card sending and now the ability to meet outside while social distancing in the warmer weather. We are unable to provide the residents Word and Communion, but they have the capability to view our daily and weekend Rosary and Mass through our live streaming. When shelter in place began, we offered to order and deliver groceries for those in need that may be compromised going into the stores. Give the parish office a call if this service is needed.

What blessings have you noticed that have come out of this time in our parish?

MaryCarol: *I love the parishioner outreach calling. We had so many great, thoughtful volunteers who were willing to call everyone in the parish to see if they had any needs or hardships. It was beautiful to see the connections made and some even stopped to pray together. That is what a true faith community is. Many of the callers were told how they had friends and neighbors watching out for them. I think the isolation has made us all value our relationships with others.*

What do you miss about the way it used to be?

MaryCarol: *The people. Social interaction. I love people. I missed working in the parish office while working at home and the staff working as a team. I miss visiting with those in the senior buildings and the homebound.*

Anything else you would like us to know?

MaryCarol: *Remember God is the one in control and he will see us through this. He is walking every step with us.*

Social Justice Project: Are you accumulating a whole lot of plastic groceries bags at your house? Due to the Coronavirus we have not been able to use our cloth bags. Let's keep them out of our landfills and put them to good use to make sturdy crocheted mats for the homeless. We will begin by gathering your plastic grocery bags and laying them out flat on a pile. We will then show you how to cut them into strips and loop the strips together to make a ball of plarn. Even kids can do this. Later, early fall, we will get our crocheters busy with a pattern to make the mats.

Parish Business Administrator (PBA) Position Update

Peter Guzulaitis has taken a position with another parish creating a vacancy in the PBA position. A search had begun to fill that position; however, with the onset of COVID-19, the search was put on hold and Ruth Weinandt is the "Interim" PBA until further notice.

The Spirit is still at work

The traditional Pentecost hymn is “Veni Sancte Spiritus” (“Come, Holy Spirit”). It’s called the Golden Sequence—a sequence being a prayer that precedes the gospel reading. It became part of the Pentecost liturgy in the 16th century but was written earlier, probably by Cardinal Stephen Langton of Canterbury around the year 1200. It’s tempting to treat the Mass as something that fell from heaven as is. Liturgy is a collaborative effort, woven across centuries—and evolving still. Put your unique stamp on it.

TODAY’S READINGS: Day: Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13; John 20:19-23 (63). *“Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, ‘Peace be with you.’”*

MEMORIAL OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY, MOTHER OF THE CHURCH

Sing of Mary

Today’s celebration of the Blessed Virgin Mary is still new for the Catholic Church, having been decreed by Pope Francis in 2018. But Mary’s tender loving care has been sung throughout the ages. Yes, we experience her maternal protection for each and every one of us. But it’s another thing to honor her universally as protectress of the Mystical Body of Christ. That’s why this memorial comes when it does: the day after Pentecost Sunday—the birthday of the church. Let us honor Mary in the manner of the decree, as “Mother of the Redeemer and Mother of the Redeemed”—namely, Christ’s mother and ours.

TODAY’S READINGS: Genesis 3:9-15, 20 or Acts 1:12-14; John 19:25-34 (572A). *“Behold, your mother.”*

MEMORIAL OF MARCELLINUS AND PETER, MARTYRS

Take notice

Today’s rather obscure saints from the early church are included in the Roman Martyrology, a catalog of saints who suffered martyrdom during the era of persecution of early Christians. While some claim Catholicism places too much emphasis on suffering and death, recent events suggest there is a deeper wisdom at work in the Martyrology. In times of crisis, heroic witness often involves willingness to suffer or perhaps even die for a worthy cause. Honor martyrs past and present for their witness.

TODAY’S READINGS: 2 Peter 3:12-15a, 17-18; Mark 12:13-17 (354). *“Repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God.”*

MEMORIAL OF CHARLES LWANGA AND COMPANIONS, MARTYRS

And the youth shall lead us

The world today is blessed with many young people willing to take a stand on major issues of our time. They work to end violence in schools and on our streets, protect lives, and ensure that future generations and the earth will thrive. Today in the church we honor a group of teens and 20-somethings who stood up for one another amid the threat of violence and death. Charles Lwanga and his 21 companions were martyred in Uganda in 1886 because their Catholic faith opposed the ruling king’s violent

ways. In light of your faith, when and where are you called to take a stand?

TODAY’S READINGS: 2 Timothy 1:1-3, 6-12; Mark 12:18-27 (355). *“I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God that you have.”*

Thursday, Jun 04, 2020**Not worth fighting about**

Timothy was a peacemaker in the early church. He urged members of newly formed congregations to work out their differences rather than foster needless division. Sadly church life (Catholic and otherwise) still involves far too many stories of division—sometimes over the smallest things. Whatever your community’s issue might be, be a voice for reasonable compromise.

TODAY’S READINGS: 2 Timothy 2:8-15; Mark 12:28-34 (356). *“Tell them in the name of God that there must be no wrangling about words: all that this ever achieves is the destruction of those who are listening.”*

MEMORIAL OF BONIFACE, BISHOP, MARTYR

Aging can bring strengths

The COVID-19 crisis highlights the health risks older folks face. At the same time, it has led occasionally to examples of ageism—the tendency to see someone as weak or infirm simply because of their age. Saint Boniface would have none of that. Traversing the rugged terrain of what is now Germany during the wild and untamed Middle Ages, he continued his tireless evangelization efforts well into his 70s. In fact, only martyrdom could bring his ministry to a close. “Respect your elders” means respecting their ability to continue making meaningful contributions.

TODAY’S READINGS: 2 Timothy 3:10-17; Mark 12:35-37 (357). *“From all these things the Lord delivered me.”*

MEMORIAL OF NORBERT, BISHOP

Humble pie belongs on every menu

Saint Norbert was a key figure in reforming the medieval church and monastic life. An ascetic at heart, he wore the simplest garb and walked barefoot even in winter. Having been appointed archbishop of Magdeburg in 1126 against his wishes, he arrived at the episcopal residence only to be met by a doorman who took him to be a beggar and turned him away! Church officials quickly explained the error to the doorman, but Norbert turned to him and said, “You were right the first time.” A healthy sense of humility will take each of us far.

TODAY’S READINGS: 2 Timothy 4:1-8; Mark 12:38-44 (358). *“Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury.”*

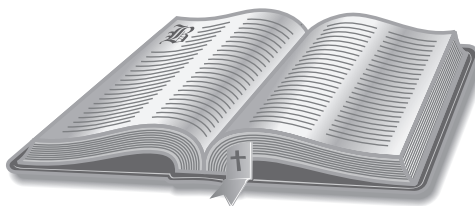
