From the Desk of Father Eugene Theisen



<u>Padre's Pen</u> ~ Pastor Installation Mass

As announced last week, I have been named Pastor for St. Wenceslaus Parish and our three churches. The Installation Mass will

be this Wednesday at 5:00 pm. Normally this would be done at a Sunday Mass with the Archbishop, but COVID-19 is a game changer. The Dean for Deanery 7 (our deanery), Fr. Brandon Theisen, has been delegated to install me as pastor in lieu of the Archbishop. I think it is really cool for Fr. Theisen to be installed by Fr. Theisen.

One of the reasons I opted for the Wednesday installation is that Fr. Theisen does have parish duties of his own on Sundays. The Wednesday date doesn't force him to find a fill-in priest in his busy parish in Faribault. Also, since we are still not allowed to have church gatherings following Sunday Mass and we can't have a proper parish-wide reception on a weekend, I opted for the Wednesday where I will have a dinner following the Mass with the guest priests, my family (including my mother ~ please pray that we can get her and transport her here), and a couple of other guests in the rectory. I plan to have an open house in the rectory for the parish at a later date to honor you who have been so supportive and helpful to me.

Also, as we enter the new fiscal year on July 1st, we are still playing a little bit of catch up because of shutdowns and social distancing. We have some changes coming soon; you will read in next week's bulletin that our Youth Minister, Emily Shimota, has announced she is moving on to a full-time position in teaching and youth work. We will be advertising in the next week (if it's not already published) an opening for a full-time Youth Minister and Confirmation Coordinator. If you know of someone who is interested, please tell them to keep their eyes open to our website and next week's bulletin for how to apply.

As we progress through the summer and more guidance comes regarding COVID-19 precautions and policies, I just want to reiterate that things continue to change rapidly, and we are keeping up as best we can with limited staff and volunteers. Please consider volunteering if you are able. Please pray for our parish and her people. Please be patient with us.

Lastly, someone asked me, "What will be the first thing you do as Pastor?" I responded that it will be the same thing I did last year when I was named Parochial Administrator; I will go through all our buildings and do a blessing.

~ Today we will learn a bit more about Mary Higgins, Faith Formation Associate.

What was your role in ministry for our parish prior to Covid-19? **Mary:** I've worked in a few different positions in the parish over 26 years, but lately I've been in Faith Formation, with a passion for and focus on adult formation and discipleship. The latest program Laura and I worked on was The 99 Experience, which trains lay people for the ministry of evangelization. We were in the middle of the third segment of that program as our Lenten small group series, when social distancing was mandated.

How has that role changed over the last three months?

Mary: I'm still writing the monthly Discipleship Update and working on a Facebook group for the 99 Masterclass group. We're thinking of how we can restart the small discipleship groups and how to go about with the work of Faith Formation with social distancing. I've been working an average of five hours a week, but I will be stepping in to help with other tasks, since Faith Formation staffing is down. I'll also be helping with streaming/recording Masses.

What do you miss about the way it used to be?

Mary: I have really missed attendance at Mass. Though I've been grateful for many online opportunities available - Masses and virtual retreats, talks, etc. ~ I have missed the Eucharist, which to me is the core of why I am Catholic. I have also missed regular interactions with parishioners and the rest of the staff, all the wonderful, dedicated people. It's been very difficult not to visit my dad at Mala Strana for three months.

What blessings have you noticed that have come out of this time in our parish?

Mary: There has been time for a deeper prayer life and reaching out to others. The staff has really stepped up in ways they did not expect. We have upped our game by streaming daily Masses. The calling of parishioners was a good thing to do and resulted in needed updating of our parish roster.

FAITH FORMATION AND YOUTH MINISTRY

A First Communion Reflection ~

The desire was there, so was the excitement and beauty.

On Sun., June 21st, my 8-year-old daughter, Ellen, received her First Holy Communion. She looked lovely in her aunt's vintage '80s dress and enjoyed having her hair and nails done before Mass, but the best part was her excitement to receive the Eucharist. It was infectious.

After months of preparation, she was ready. She wanted to receive the Eucharist and join the feast at the Lord's table. That was in April. Due to COVID-19, her First Communion, which was originally scheduled for April 26th, was delayed. It was a bummer, but she took it in stride \sim along with distance learning and social distancing from family and friends.

But in some ways, the delay became a blessing. We continued to talk about the Eucharist as a family and how amazing it is for God to give himself to us in this way. Our time spent "attending" Mass from our living room allowed Ellen to ask questions about the Mass and the Sacrament in real time. "Mom, is the bread changing now?" she'd ask with eyes glued to the computer screen. We filled the months of waiting with spiritual discussions and readings, which fueled an anticipation, a deep desire, to physically receive the Eucharist ~ not only for Ellen but for myself, my husband, and our 10-year-old daughter, Anna.

Then, the day finally arrived. Our little redhead wiggled into her new white tights and donned the frilly white dress, eager to receive the Body of Christ. Her nana, Christa, made her a beautiful white face mask with a purple cross stitched into the fabric for the special and unprecedented occasion.

As we walked into church Sunday morning, I noted Ellen's hand-me-down white shoes, the new silver clip she

selected for her hair, and her big, toothless grin. (She lost a top, front tooth two days prior ~ the same tooth her big sister was missing on her First Communion.) Ellen skipped down the sidewalk, white lace and red curls bouncing. She was happy. She was excited. She knew the day was extra special, and she desired the Eucharist. My heart was full. I bet God smiled, too.

The day was the first time since the beginning of the pandemic that my husband, older daughter, and I physically received Communion. It was wonderful being able to return to the Lord's table with my entire family. It was well worth the wait.

A matching set for all eternity

Saints Peter and Paul are together the patrons of Rome, where both were martyred around the same time. The two men had their differences, but they were central in establishing the Christian faith, which eventually won over the Roman Empire despite fierce opposition from officials. Saint Augustine wrote: "Both apostles share the same feast day, for these two were one . . . Let us embrace what they believed, their life, their labors, their sufferings, their preaching, and their confession of faith." Amen.

MEMORIAL OF THE FIRST MARTYRS OF THE CHURCH OF ROME

Holiness involves dying a little each day

Tertullian, one of the first Christian theologians, wrote: "The blood of the martyrs is the seed of the church." The church's first martyrs are commemorated a day after the feast of Saints Peter and Paul—who tradition says were also victims of Nero's slaughter, beginning in 64. And martyrs aren't meant to be just a memory but also a model. Look no further than first responders and essential workers to see modern examples of those following the model of self-sacrifice for the sake of others. Offer a sign of gratitude for their service.

MEMORIAL OF JUNÍPERO SERRA, PRIEST

Live and learn

Missionaries in the age of the Iberian conquest of the Americas played a complex role, as protectors of the Indians but also projectors of the empire's power. Junípero Serra shares that mixed legacy—a mission priest who brought the saving power of Jesus but also was part of a colonization project that brought harsh treatment and epidemics. We know a little more about

indigenous rights today—and about epidemics too, for that matter. Keep the faith, but mix it with a healthy dose of respect for different traditions.

Jesus healed in ways we consider miraculous, not because he had anything to prove about his power, but because his compassion urged him to alleviate suffering in whatever ways he could. His teaching and his healing went hand in hand: Both were focused on bringing us to wholeness. When he calls the paralytic man his son or child, it displays a mark of the tenderness he feels for all of us. Jesus draws us close in a healing embrace. Accept his healing today.

FEAST OF THOMAS, APOSTLE

Beyond all doubt

Thomas may have started out doubting, but once he saw and touched the truth, his faith took him very far indeed. It is said he traveled to the southwest coast of India in the year 52 and spent the last 20 years of his life there planting Christianity. To this day, "Saint Thomas Christians" in India trace their origins back to the apostle. In fact, Thomas is so popular that India has issued a commemorative stamp in his honor! Doubt does not oppose faith, it makes faith possible.


