From the Desk of Father Eugene Theisen



Padre's Pen ~

Capital Sin: Acedia/Sloth

It's the Third Week of Lent, if you haven't experienced it yet, beware the sin of Acedia otherwise known as sloth.

Sloth, according to our Catechism of the Catholic Church is "A culpable lack of physical or spiritual effort, acedia or laziness. One of the capital sins." (CCC Glossary, 899)

The temptation to sloth hit hard this last week regarding my Lenten disciplines (and this same thing happens every year). Two of the things I have taken up this Lent are 1) return to the Air Force standard of at least 3 physical workouts per week, 2) Spend at least one uninterrupted hour before the Blessed Sacrament daily. Through these COVID events I had both gained some unwanted weight and relaxed my daily "Hour of Power." Both of which keep me healthy on a physical and spiritual level.

Last Monday, on my day off when I should have all the time in the world, I put off my work-out and got to the end of the day and realized I had not done my Hour of Power. I got the hour in but not the workout. Tuesday morning, I almost gave in to the temptation of skipping again. As I write this column (on Tuesday morning) I have a great deal of energy because I got up and did my workout, and I look forward to an hour with our Blessed Lord this afternoon.

Sloth is a capital sin because it becomes an occasion for other sins and vices. For example, where would my energy level be right now had I not rolled out of bed and got the metabolism going with a 25-minute workout? I would probably be lacking energy and plodding through my morning. Sloth/acedia leads to a refusal of the joy that comes from God and becomes an occasion of being repelled by divine goodness. It becomes about "poor me" instead of about the God who died for me.

In Matthew chapter 26, Our Blessed Lord finds Peter, James, and John asleep when He asked them to stay and pray with Him for an hour. Our Lord recognizes our fallen human nature when he states, "The spirit is indeed willing, but the flesh is weak." As we progress through Lent, we are called to maintain our ascetical practices, to not become lax, to not let spiritual depression enter in through sloth/acedia.

If we have already grown lax, it is time to get back up on the horse and renew our efforts. The spiritual energy that we receive is none other than the Holy Spirit who will fill our hearts with an Easter joy at the conclusion of our Lenten fast; this Capital Campaign is giving us the opportunity to do that.


Is your heart open to bringing the Eucharist to our senior buildings' residents?



Saint Paul lived in that perilous posture you see in cartoon characters whose feet are on opposite supports that are swiftly gliding apart. As a privileged Roman citizen of Cilicia (modern Turkey), Paul had one foot firmly planted in the reality of Greco-Roman culture. Yet the other was just as securely fixed in his Jewish faith. It was a tough posture to maintain. Then Paul encountered the Risen Lord and understood in the gospel the most excellent way to unite Jews and Greeks in an elegantly reconciling Christian message. Christianity is for uniting, not dividing.

Privation of these is true fasting." Being mindful of what goes into our mouths is important today, but being mindful of what comes out of them, even more so. Strive to abstain from the unkind, false, or hostile word today. And if you find you have broken the fast, make amends as best you can. Let this be your spiritual discipline today.

Pray the mercy mantra

Gregory Palamas, a saint of the Eastern Orthodox, Melkite, and Ukrainian Catholic Churches, taught that the use of the Jesus Prayer—"Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner"—prepares one to receive the grace-filled light of the Lord. This short, formulaic prayer has its roots in today's parable of the Pharisee and the Tax Collector. Saint John Paul II repeatedly cited Palamas as one of the great spiritual writers of history. Today, join with John Paul II and Palamas in heaven and the multitude of Catholics throughout the world who recite this spiritual mantra over and over again seeking the Lord's mercy.

TODAY'S READINGS: Hosea 6:1-6; Luke 18:9-14 (242). "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."
