First Communions, Confirmations, Collections, and Ushers

We have a very busy weekend this weekend! In addition to our regularly scheduled Confessions and Mass, we have a Baptism along with our first weekend of First Holy Communions and Confirmations. Congratulations to our young people who have prepared over this last difficult year to receive these sacraments!

We recall that in the sacraments, Christ acts in a direct and personal way to bestow the saving grace of God upon those who receive the sacraments. The more properly disposed we are to receive the sacraments (i.e., after making a good confession, asking for God's grace, and striving to live virtuously), the more efficacious the grace of God is in our lives. Of note, our one young lady who will be baptized at our 5:00 pm Mass on Saturday will not make a confession before her baptism. Baptism itself is for the forgiveness of sins and is the gateway to all the other sacraments. She will receive her First Holy Communion in the same Mass completely free of sin. She will actually make her First Confession at a later time.

I was asked this week by someone who has recently returned to Mass when we would start taking up collections at Mass. I said that we were already doing it... we have a basket in the back and the wooden lock box right next to it for the contributions. The individual was unaware of this. So, just to let everyone know, we are adding a second basket in the back on the east side of the back of the church (because all our doors are now unlocked on Sunday). You may use these baskets and the lock box in the back of the church for your weekly contributions and our ushers will collect them up and properly secure the contributions.

As a note, we would like to eventually get back to our ushers walking the aisles with the baskets, but we don't yet have enough ushers who have returned. We could also use some tech savvy people to help with weekend live streaming.

We can always use new volunteers.

Live with purpose

Nothing need limit your devotion

The life of Saint Rafael Arnáiz Barón was interrupted by illness. Having endured a pandemic, we know what that's like—we've seen lives cut short by disease and we ourselves have had to put some of our own living on hold. Rafael was born in Spain in 1911 and died at 27. He was a talented artist and studied architecture, then decided to become a Trappist. Severe complications from diabetes prevented him from taking vows as a monk. He accepted God's will, joined as an oblate instead, and died young of his illness. In him you can find an example of surrender, trust, and devotion in the face of loss and disappointment that makes him a model for our times a century later.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:1-18; John 10:1-10 (279). "Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture."

Plant the seeds of belief

The Syrian city of Antioch played a pivotal role in the growth of the early church. A cross-cultural safe haven, it was here that many of Jesus' first followers—all of them Jewish—took refuge after Stephen was martyred, fleeing Jerusalem as they too became targets. Antioch was a cosmopolitan hothouse, its Jews enjoying friendly interactions with the city's many Gentiles. Once new Jews arrived, bearing witness to Jesus, local Gentiles couldn't help but be intrigued. Soon, the fledgling church of Antioch began evangelizing Gentiles intentionally, planting the seed of belief in unexpected places. Where might you plant such seeds?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:19-26; John 10:22-30 (280). "It was in Antioch that the disciples were first called Christians."

MEMORIAL OF PETER CHANEL, PRIEST, RELIGIOUS, MISSIONARY, MARTYR

Let your life bring light to others

There is good reason that Peter Chanel (1803-41) is the patron saint of Oceania. A parish priest from France who later joined the Marist missionaries, Peter was missioned to Western Oceania to convert people who worshipped other gods. Peter's missionary method was low key: He learned the language of the people and cared for their sick. For a few years, all was fine until small groups of native people began to be baptized, in particular, the son and daughter of the island king. Peter was then considered a threat to

the island's power elite. On this day in 1841 he was murdered. That is not the end of Peter's story, however. Within two years of his death, the entire island had become Catholic. How do you bring the light of faith to people around you?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 12:24—13:5a; John 12:44-50 (281). "I came into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me might not remain in darkness."

MEMORIAL OF CATHERINE OF SIENA, VIRGIN, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Not how long a life is, but how good

Saint Catherine of Siena led a remarkable life for a person of any era but particularly for a woman of the 14th century who only lived 33 years. Mystic, nurse, Dominican, counselor, arbitrator, writer, ambassador—she was all these things. Ordinary people came to her for spiritual council and advice in conflicts, leading her to eventually settle fierce church disputes, becoming a confidante of popes. Central to her strength was her union with Christ, which she wrote about in the classic, *The Dialogue*. Find a quiet moment today to—like Catherine—commune with Jesus, who offers wisdom and strength to all.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 13:13-25; John 13:16-20 (282). "Whoever receives the one I send receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me."

Try a little tenderness

When God became flesh and dwelt among us, a revolution was started. Not a military coup that some people expected, but a revolution that would strike deep at the heart. This "revolution of tenderness," as Pope Francis called it in *Evangelii Guadium*, urges each and every one of us to give of ourselves, to be part of community, to serve, and to be reconciled in our relationships with others. In what ways can you respond to Jesus' call to a revolution of tenderness?

MEMORIAL OF JOSEPH THE WORKER

Wanting for a job

Today's memorial honors Saint Joseph the carpenter, standing in solidarity with all working people on the traditional "May Day" dedicated to laborers around the world. At this time last year, more than 30 million Americans had lost their jobs due to the pandemic, the largest unemployment crisis in the country's history. Many of those jobs have not returned and likely are gone forever. What can you and your faith community do to support those whose livelihoods were lost to the virus?

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 1:26—2:3 or Colossians 3:14-15, 17, 23-24; Matthew 13:54-58 (559); Acts 13:44-52; John 14:7-14 (284). "If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it."


