

From the Desk of Father Theisen



<u>Padre's Pen</u> ~ Spiritual Communion Prayer and Parish Council Update

If you will recall, about 10 months ago I announced that we would do the Spiritual Communion Prayer in Mass until the

end of the year. We are in the new year so I will no longer be leading the Spiritual Communion Prayer during Mass. I highly recommend that our live stream viewers continue to do this prayer at home, and if our parishioners in attendance at Mass would like to continue this devotion they may do so during that time when the priest is receiving/distributing Holy Communion on the altar.

Our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) meetings went quite well in November and early December. I wanted to do an earlier update for you, but my quarantine got in the way. Each of our ministry areas gave a report to the PPC and from those reports they developed and put forward several focus areas for fiscal year 2023 coming up. Here are the Top 5 items that the PPC proposed:

- 1. Proposal: Cost of Living Raises for parish and school staff Reason: We have a great staff and desire to do what we can for our staff
- 2. Proposal: Additional staffing in Faith Formation Reason: With Mary Higgins proposed retirement and the increased workload requires an increase in the adult education position
- 3. Proposal: Campus Security System Reason: We have had several break-in attempts over the past couple years and want to be proactive in protecting our resources
- 4. Proposal: Parish office and school space study Reason: Rectory living areas and office spaces should be separate. Increased enrollment in school squeezes the available teaching spaces.
- 5. Proposal: Additional staffing/volunteers for Pastoral Ministry Area Reason: The need is great and goes well beyond what this one-person department can reasonably accomplish alone.

These proposals will be discussed and reviewed at the Spring Finance Council Meeting and a budget/plan will be developed and proposed for my approval.

Of note, the items above were not the only items discussed/proposed but represent the "Big Rocks" for our Parish Pastoral Plan.

Karl and Zita stayed about a year in their first home, before Karl was promoted and moved to Vienna. It was soon after this move that the couple welcomed their first child. Otto, named after Karl's late father, joined the family on November 20, 1912.

Living in the Austrian capital saw life become more involved for the young family. Being Franz Josef's wife the Empress Elisabeth (Sisi) had been murdered, and Franz Ferdinand's wife Sophie would never be empress, the role of imperial hostess fell to Zita. Franz Josef preferred Karl over Franz Ferdinand. Still Franz Ferdinand,

Karl's uncle, never let it disrupt their relationship. He would tell Karl bow be planned to govern, what role he wanted Karl to play, and how he would prepare things for him when it would be his turn on the throne. It is quite admirable when one considers that the only reason Bl. Karl was to assume the throne was because Franz Ferdinand's own children could not.


Registration is now open for preschool and kindergarten, Fall 2022 at St. Wenceslaus Catholic School. This time of year gets very busy around school. We are se-

You are gifted, any way you slice it

We're all good at something. But not all of us consider our talents and skills as assets given to the Body of Christ. Say you can sew, make people laugh, fix an engine, bake a great pie, or balance a mean checkbook. Of what use are these things to the church, you might ask. Discernment of gifts is something Saint Paul took very seriously in the early community. In our faith sharing, we might ask each other how "mighty deeds" or knowledge or healing might be translated into modern needs the church has. Don't underestimate the healing value of a great pie!

Help the dream awaken

One of the many things Martin Luther King, Jr. taught Americans was that faith could—and should!—be a driving force for positive social change. He also showed that people of all faiths could put aside differences and do this work together. A Baptist minister, King met with Pope John XXIII and many other faith leaders who later together publicly lamented his death. Keep King's spirit of faith-based social action and interfaith cooperation alive—gather with Catholics and other people of God to discuss, learn, pray, plan, and act on a peaceful journey toward healing all forms of inequality.

Shop with a conscience

Today we note Mary Kenney O'Sullivan, who died on this day in 1943. A Catholic mother of three, she poured her considerable talents into organizing working-class women to demand the right to vote and expect justice in their workplaces. She fought for social justice even as the concept of Catholic social teaching was still being refined and formed into what it is today. O'Sullivan understood and lived out social teaching concepts of solidarity, the dignity of the human person, and the dignity of work. Can your shopping choices, voting patterns, and prayers help uplift workers who are currently mistreated?

God loves an underdog

We all tend to cheer for the underdog. We find it inspiring when the person or team least expected to win triumphs. David's victory over Goliath appeals to us for this reason. But there's more to the story. When we have an unsurmountable task before us, it is wise to let God take control. After all, God is all powerful. History is full of saints who did the unexpected because they trusted that God would supplement their weaknesses. As Saint Catherine of Siena advises: "Start being brave about everything . . . Don't look at your weakness, but realize that in Christ crucified you can do

everything." Today pray for God's will to be revealed to you and trust that he will give you the strength you need.

MEMORIAL OF SEBASTIAN, MARTYR

Listen to the peoples' laments

The anguish of physical pain can be a fact of life. In medieval times many artists were fascinated by the martyrdom of Saint Sebastian and created gruesome images of it. For practicing Christianity in the third century, Sebastian was ordered to be executed by arrows. He survived this ordeal, only to later be beaten to death for his faith. Father Robin Ryan, C.P., a Passionist priest, says when he encounters people suffering in any form, he avoids explanations as so much about God and suffering is a mystery. He tries to allow those in pain to lament and share their emotion with God, often using the psalms as a starting point as they "help us to recognize that we belong to a tradition and a community of faith; we are not alone in this experience." Draw solace from the lament tradition the next time you find yourself or others in pain.

MEMORIAL OF AGNES, MARTYR

I stand with Agnes

The stories of martyrs can make us feel a bit uneasy. They edify us, but they also can—and should—horrify us. Why? Because in every story, we encounter human violence, perhaps even a reflection of the violence we ourselves have suffered, committed, or ignored. While we laud fourth-century martyr Agnes of Rome for her sacred commitment to chastity, we must not overlook the fact that she was martyred for resisting a forced, unwanted relationship and inhumane treatment as mere property. Agnes' story is particularly relevant today because women continue to face the very real threat of personal as well as systemic violence. Will you stand with Agnes against gender violence in all its forms?

To embrace a consistent ethic of life is to not only oppose abortion but also to support and defend the dignity and right to life in all conditions and under all circumstances. He said: "Those who defend the right to life of the weakest among us must be equally visible in support of the quality of life of the powerless among us: the old and the young, the hungry and the homeless, the undocumented immigrant and the unemployed worker."
