

From the Desk of Father Theisen



<u>Padre's</u> Pen ~ Ash Wednesday Palms, Capital Campaign Update, & Blessed Karl

We have now entered February and that means Lent can't be far away. It's a little

later this year with Ash Wednesday on March 2nd. Our Lenten schedule will be coming out very soon, but in preparation for Ash Wednesday, I will be burning last year's blessed palms again and use those ashes on Ash Wednesday.

If you desire to have your palms from last year used for Ash Wednesday, please bring them to the church or rectory in the next 2 weeks, by February 21st so I can prepare them and get them burned in time for Ash Wednesday.

If you miss the deadline with me for burning last year's palms, the proper disposal of them is quite simple. You may burn them yourselves and spread the ashes in your gardens or fields asking God for good growth and/or successful harvest.

Everyone should have received their annual tax statements for 2022 and we included this year an update on the status of Capital Campaign pledges. We are very grateful for the generosity of our parishioners in all 3 of our churches. I have received several requests from people for an update on the status of our projects and the way forward at each of our churches. Those updates are in the works, and we hope to get some dates on the calendar soon (i.e., this spring). Look for more information in the near future.

Lastly, as many of you know who are following the Blessed Karl devotions in our bulletin, the relic of Blessed Karl of Austria has arrived, and we are planning the official transfer from my chapel in the rectory to a chapel of repose at St. John on April 1st. Part of that transfer and of the devotion itself is to ask for Blessed Karl's intercession for the needs in our lives and in our parish. We will soon have a book of intentions that will be available for a time in each of our churches. People may write their requests in this book, and it will go to the chapel of repose on April 1st and be remembered at each Wednesday Mass at St. John. Look for more information on this in the coming weeks in the Blessed Karl Corner of our bulletin.

Franz Ferdinand's may have enjoyed things being 'warm and cozy' at home, but he well knew things were going to soon be changing. Emperor Franz Josef was 83 years old. It seemed safe to assume that it wouldn't be long before Franz Ferdinand would succeed him. But there was another possibility that was playing about in his mind.



May 1914, he invited Karl and Zita over for dinner with his family. When Sophie took the children up to bed, he turned to his nephew and heir, and said, 'I have something to say but I must say it quickly as I don't want your aunt to hear anything of this when she comes down. I know that I shall soon be murdered. In this desk are papers which concern you. When it happens, take them. They are for you.' When Karl protested, his uncle reaffirmed, 'No, I'm serious. After all, everything is ready. The crypt in Artstetten is now finished.' Then Sophie returned and nothing more was said on the subject. Franz Ferdinand was not wrong. He did not have even two months more to live. But what he could not imagine, was that his Sophie would die with him.

They use different liturgies, and some were established during the earliest times in church history. The Ethiopian Catholic Church, for example, uses the ancient Ge'ez liturgy—one of the oldest in existence—and can be traced back to the missionary work of

Saint Mark the Apostle. Today, remember that the Catholic Church is truly universal!

The truth behind the tradition continues

Tradition says that Scholastica, today's saint, had significant influence on her twin, Saint Benedict of Nursia, who codified the monastic way of life with his famous *Rule*. The lack of documentation on Scholastica's life is curious, given her centrality in shaping Benedictine life. There are written accounts of her, but they are sparse. While the historical record is lean, clearly Benedictine women, of whom Scholastica is said to be the first, have achieved spiritual greatness, scholarship, and leadership in their own right over the centuries and illuminated the faith for all of

OPTIONAL MEMORIAL OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Seventh heaven

From ancient times, the number seven was seen as the number of spirituality, perhaps because of the "seven moving luminaries" visible to the naked eye (the Sun and Moon, Mercury, Venus, Mars, Jupiter, and Saturn). There are many examples of the use of the number seven in both Testaments, from the seven days of creation in Genesis to the seven churches of Revelation. Catholicism celebrates seven sacraments, identifies seven deadly sins and seven virtues, seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, and seven corporal and spiritual works of mercy. Today, the seventh day of the week, is a good day to reflect on the seven sorrows and seven joys of the Blessed Virgin Mary.


