

From the Desk of Father Theisen



Padre's Pen ~ Ascension Sunday and Summer Programs

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, in which we believe that Jesus' earthly life reached its

culmination in His passing from this world to the Father. He no longer belongs to the world of corruption and death that conditions our earthly life. Whereas the glorified character of Jesus' Resurrected Body was veiled from the eyes of the apostles after His Resurrection, He now passes into the full and unveiled glory in His exalted position at the right hand of the Father.

It is important to understand that the Ascension does not mean that Jesus has departed from us. He has not abandoned us or left us orphans. On the contrary, with His Ascension into heaven, the Lord Jesus is now present to us in a new way. Though Jesus' earthly and visible presence in the world ends, He remains with us in an invisible way. He has not left us alone, but has sent us the Holy Spirit. Through the Holy Spirit, Christ continues to be with us, sanctifying us and giving us life. He acts through the Holy Spirit in the Church and in our souls. He guides us and leads us to the Father.

As we meditate on the mystery of Our Lord's Ascension, we also remember His words to the disciples immediately before His Ascension. He not only promises the Holy Spirit, but He commands the disciples to go forth as missionaries to the world. He gives them the charge of evangelization. He then gives them the power of the Holy Spirit to accomplish this mission.

What are some ways we can evangelize? How can we accomplish this mission? As families we can encourage growth by volunteering with the Church, participating in programs and keeping Christ the focus of our Summer, as well as the rest of the year.

Youth Ministry has some exciting programs this Summer for youth of all ages, including Totus Tuus for grades 1-6 and 7-12, Summer Stretch for grades 5-12 and Summer Festival Camp for grades 6-9. Missionary Priest Visit

Divine Providence Home is a home for disabled children in the state of Andhra Pradesh. Through the efforts of the Divine Providence home, thousands of children have been provided with good education and learned the skills to become employed and able to earn their livelihood.

CFIC is the Latin acronym for the Congregation of the Sons of the Immaculate Conception, founded by Blessed Luigi Maria Monti, in Rome, Italy, in the year 1857, three years after the proclamation of the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception. Today, after 165 years, the Congregation has extended its branches to 23 countries in different parts of the world. In North America, the members of the Order are rendering their services in Canada, the United States, and Mexico. The members of the Congregation, both as priests and lay religious, dedicate themselves to the care of the sick, and the care and education of orphaned, poor, and abandoned children. It is a fact that there are millions of less fortunate children, struggling for their daily survival in the world. They don't have so many big dreams, but they dream of good education and for their one and only daily meal. Suffering in their hardships, the Congregation feels that it is very significant and essential to show them the rays of hope in their lives. Through several caring centers in different countries, the Congregation takes care of thousands of children who are either physically or mentally challenged, poor, abandoned, or orphaned. Most of our caring centers are in India, the Philippines, South Korea, Cameroun, Nigeria, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Poland, Peru, Brazil, and Argentina.

Every summer we are visited by missionary priests from near and far. This year's missionary priest Is Fr. George Jacob. Father Jacob Is a representative of CFIC and has been the Pastor at St. Mary's Church In downtown St. Paul for several years. He will visit us the weekends of May 28/29 and June 04/05. Bl. Karl's Corner

December 30, 19 I 6, Bl. Karl was officially crowned King of Hungary in a beautiful ceremony presided over by Cardinal Csernoch, primate of Hungary. Twenty-nine year-old Karl was presented the sword of St. Stephen and crowned with his crown. Then he received the scepter and then the orb (symbolic of Christ's rule over the entire Earth and a reminder that he was acting as Christ's deputy), before being led to the throne. Special prayers accompanied the entire process. Zita remembered: The thing that impressed both of us most about the whole ceremony was the moving liturgical side of it all -especially the oaths that the King took at the altar before his anointing to preserve justice for all and strive for peace.

Hear me out

Pope Francis chose one word for the theme of this year's World Communications Day: "Listen!" Since the pandemic has spared no one, we each carry wounds that need to be acknowledged and healed. Dialogue isn't all about talking, the pope notes. At least half the time we should be listening, a task requiring humility in order to receive the truth of another person's experience. At the same time, the quest for truth involves the discernment of reliable information. We begin with the courage to listen, free of prejudice or agenda. Only then can we find our way together to the light.

Give thanks for reverse mission

Membership in the Catholic Church in the Western world is declining. It's painful for those who remain to see fewer and fewer people in the pews—or worse, to experience the closing of their parishes. It can seem like the church is on the ropes. But stop to think: There are an estimated 1.2 billion Roman Catholics in the world—more than 40 percent of them in Latin America, and the largest growth is in Africa and Asia. Many U.S. Catholic parishes now have priests from those regions. Consider how the Holy Spirit might be at work, with those the West once missioned to now missioning to us.

Moved by the Spirit

The scene of Elizabeth greeting Mary, both carrying miraculous pregnancies, is blessedly familiar to Catholic ears. Our "Hail Mary" prayer comes from this encounter. And we hear that even *in utero* John the Baptist recognizes Jesus and leaps for joy. But Saint Ambrose makes an observation about this visit that's easy to miss: "Mary sets out for the hill country She goes eager in purpose, dutiful in conscience, hastening for joy. Filled with God, where would she hasten but to the heights? The Holy Spirit does not proceed by slow, laborious efforts." When has the Holy Spirit prompted you to act in joyful haste?

FEAST OF THE VISITATION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY TODAY'S READINGS: Zephaniah 3:14-18a or Romans 12:9-16; Luke 1:39-56 (572). "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb."

Give thanks to those who gave it all

Today we celebrate the feast of Saint Justin, a figure known for his philosophical prowess, as well as his astute defense of the Christian faith during the second century. His writings are some of the earliest among the church fathers, making his comments on subjects like the sacraments a vital source of information about what the early church believed. He stood out as one arguing for the proto-Christian nature of Greek philosophers such as Socrates and Plato and sought to use their ideas to explain and spread the faith among his non-Christian contemporaries. These included

hostile Roman emperors, and Justin was eventually martyred alongside several of his students. Give thanks for the early witnesses who contributed so dearly to the deposit of faith we have inherited.

May we all get to rest in peace

Little is known historically about early Christians Marcellinus and Peter, martyred in 304. It is said they were killed at an out-of-the-way location by hostile Roman authorities so that other Christians would not have a chance to bury and venerate their bodies. Even so, it is said they peacefully and without protest cleared the spot chosen for their death, an overgrown thicket three miles from Rome. The fact they could die with peaceful hearts indicates the strength of their faith and trust. Pray that we too can find that peace when we come to our own time and place of final repose.

The Spirit is on the move

The astounding growth of the Catholic Church in Africa has not come easily. Many a martyr died along the way, including Charles Lwanga and his companions of Uganda, martyred in 1895. From modest beginnings, there are now well over 13 million Catholics in Uganda—40 percent of the population—and continent-wide, Catholic Church membership rose from 2 million in 1900 to 140 million in 2000. In 2009, when Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI visited Africa, the total had grown to an estimated 158 million. By 2025, one-sixth (230 million) of the world's Catholics are expected to be Africans. Give thanks for the flourishing of the Spirit worldwide.

May the harvest be plentiful

Today is the Jewish festival of Shavuot, the Feast of Weeks. It is the Biblical celebration of the wheat harvest (Exodus 34:22) and, in the Orthodox Jewish tradition, the giving of the Torah to Moses on Mount Sinai. It's called "weeks" because it commemorates the counting of seven weeks from the barley harvest to the wheat harvest, or from the Passover to today. It has a parallel in our Christian tradition of counting from Easter to Pentecost, a word that means "fiftieth," celebrated tomorrow. One of the modern customs celebrated on Shavuot is presenting to the community babies born during the year. Let's pray for all the babies we know who have made it to birth this year.
