From the Desk of Father Theisen

Padre's Pen ~ Pentecost, Synods, & Catechetical Institute

Happy Birthday to Holy Mother Church.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, we remember that the Church is holy because Jesus Christ founded her and sent the Holy Spirit of God to dwell in her and keep her firm throughout the ages. The Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles and Mary at prayer 50 days after the Resurrection and literally sent them out the doors to proclaim God's love for His people and the salvation available to us through that same love.

Please pray for our local Church of the Archdiocese of Saint Paul and Minneapolis this weekend. We are concluding the strenuous efforts of the past two – three years for the Archbishop's Synod. As the Dean for Deanery Seven, I am canonically required to participate as a voting member of this Synod. We have two of our parishioners who are also voting members and one alternate. We have another parishioner who is volunteering to assist at the Synod. As a successor to the apostles, our own Archbishop has called this Synod and is placing the pastoral direction of our Archdiocese into the hands of our Lord with this effort. Please pray for him and our Archdiocese that our deliberations and voting go well and the expected Pastoral Letter later this fall be a true inspiration of the Holy Spirit for our Archdiocese.

Speaking of inspiration of the Holy Spirit... If you have not heard yet, our own Church of St. Wenceslaus has been selected as a remote site for our Archdiocese's Catechetical Institute. It is a two-year program that delves deep into our Catechism of the Catholic Church. Many of our own parishioners have already been through this program and I highly recommend it to you. Please start praying for the inspiration of the Holy Spirit to guide you as to whether you should participate in this program. We will have more information coming in the next couple of weeks and some testimonials from previous graduates of this program. So, for now, pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance.

June - The month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus with the Church celebrating the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on the second Sunday following Pentecost - the birthday of the Catholic Church. This year it falls on June 19. Besides the liturgical celebration, there are many devotionals honoring the Sacred Heart of Jesus. One of the reasons that His Sacred Heart is observed in June is because of the apparitions St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a Visitation Sister, received. Jesus revealed to St. Margaret His Sacred Heart, "more dazzling than the sun and transparent as crystal", in His second appearance to her on a First Friday in 1674. His Sacred Heart symbolizes His redeeming love, as well as His meekness and humility, of which Jesus calls us not only to learn from His heart, but to imitate His love, meekness, and humility. 'Jesus, meek and humble of heart, make my heart like unto Thine.'

Bl. Karl's Corner

Memorial Day guest Saint-to-be: Medal of Honor recipient (posthumously) Father Emil Joseph Kapaun. Fr. Kapaun was born on Holy Thursday, in 1916, in the German-Bohemian town of Pilsen, Kansas. He was a good, hardworking boy. He felt the call to the priesthood as a young man and joined a high school seminary. He was ordained in 1940 at 24 years of age. But he felt called to serve in a different manner, entering the U.S. Army Chaplain Corps on July 12, 1944. He served in Burma and India during the rest of WWII.

In January 1950, Fr. Kapaun was sent to Yokohama, Japan, to join the peace-keeping forces stationed there. When North Korea invaded South Korea in June of that year, Father's unit was among the first American troops sent to assist the South Koreans. Father Kapaun served his men faithfully, staying behind with the wounded and being taken prisoner on November 2, 1950. The men he served in the Prisoner of War camp were convinced that Fr. Kapaun was singled out by their captors due to his unwavering faith that he was willing to share with everyone. Their captors waited for their chance to be rid of him. It arrived when they saw that he was recovering from illness the prisoners had kept secret – as oftentimes the sick were taken to the 'death house' as opposed to the hospital. Fr. Kapaun told his fellow soldiers not to protest, saying, "Don't worry about me," he said. "I'm going where I always wanted to go, and when I get there, I'll say a prayer for all of you." He died on May 23, 1951, at 35 years of age. He was posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor in 2013.

Father Kapaun's cause for sainthood has been opened by the Diocese in Wichita, with miracles already being attributed to his intercession. More information can be found at: frkapaun.org. Booklets and prayer cards will also be available in the back of church.

Sunday, Jun 05, 2022**Embody your faith**

Being church is a different identity than simply going to church. If we are truly the Body of Christ, then we embrace this identity with a sense of purpose. Saint Paul describes the church as a body with many parts that function for the sake of the whole. Some of us have obvious gifts like preaching, teaching, or offering a healing presence. Others may benefit from prayer, spiritual direction, faith sharing, or a discernment retreat to come to an awareness of the particular service to which we're called. Joy is in the discovery of the Spirit's personal invitation to you.

SOLEMNITY OF PENTECOST

TODAY'S READINGS: Day: Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 or Romans 8:8-17; John 20:19-23 (63). *"There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord."*

Monday, Jun 06, 2022**You will not be orphaned**

Although the devotion to Mary as "Mother of the Church" is ancient, today's memorial is relatively new—having been instituted in 2018 by Pope Francis when he decreed it will be celebrated annually on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday—to "encourage the growth of the maternal sense of the church." Reflect on how you can "mother" the church—as well as your family and friends, your community and work place, and even yourself. You don't have to be or have a mother in the traditional sense to know how to offer loving care. Standing beneath the cross, said Francis, Mary "welcomed all people in the person of the beloved disciple as sons and daughters"—that means you, too.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 3:9-15, 20 or Acts 1:12-14; John 19:25-34 (572a). *"He said to his mother, 'Woman, behold, your son.'"*

Tuesday, Jun 07, 2022**Let go and let God**

On this day in 1925, Blessed Matt Talbot—40 years sober—died enroute to Sunday Mass. Though Alcoholics Anonymous wouldn't exist for another 10 years, Talbot had already discerned the central truth of AA's Twelve Steps. "It's as hard to give up the drink as it is to raise the dead to life again," he said. "But both are possible and even easy for our Lord. We have only to depend on him." Talbot is the patron of those who struggle with alcohol addiction. Ask his intercession for yourself or another who needs to kick a harmful habit.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Kings 17:7-16; Matthew 5:13-16 (360). *"Your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."*

Wednesday, Jun 08, 2022**Honor and emulate a trailblazer for racial justice**

On this day in 1910, Father Stephen Theobald was ordained for the Archdiocese of Saint Paul-Minneapolis, the first black diocesan priest ordained on U.S. soil. Theobald was born in Guyana in 1874 and later worked as a journalist in Canada before being recruited to Minnesota by Archbishop John Ireland, a fierce racial justice advocate. For his entire priestly career, Theobald served at Saint

Peter Claver Catholic Church in Saint Paul, the only black parish in the state. He also served in the local chapter of the NAACP, advocating tirelessly for black lives. May we all follow his lasting example of saying "Yes!" to God and "No!" to injustice.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Kings 18:20-39; Matthew 5:17-19 (361). *"Let it be known this day that you are God in Israel and that I am your servant."*

Thursday, Jun 09, 2022**Sing with the Syrian saint**

Although you may never have heard of him, today's saint left a lasting imprint on the church. Ephrem of Syria (306-373) is known for his writing—primarily for works that battled heresies—but even more so for introducing singing as a form of worship and education. Known as the Harp of the Holy Spirit, he cleverly wrote lyrics that educated the faithful against false teaching. Syriac churches still sing hymns that originated with him. The next time a hymn moves you, say a prayer of thanksgiving to Saint Ephrem.

Friday, Jun 10, 2022**Let's get our bearings**

"Why are we here?" is an age-old question. As Dostoyevsky writes in *The Brothers Karamazov*: "The mystery of human existence lies not in just staying alive, but in finding something to live for." One might think that Christians have it easy because Jesus clearly spells out our purpose for living: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind . . . [and] you shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matt. 22:37-39). But on a day-to-day basis in any given situation, it is not always obvious what the loving response is and whether we are prepared to offer it. That is where prayer comes in. It can provide just the right environment for hearing God's finest whispers leading to the path of love.

TODAY'S READINGS: 1 Kings 19:9a, 11-16; Matthew 5:27-32 (363).

"There was a tiny whispering sound. . . . A voice said to him, 'Elijah, why are you here?'"

Saturday, Jun 11, 2022**One, holy, catholic, apostolic**

In our recitation of the Nicene Creed at Sunday Mass, we profess our belief in "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church." Those four adjectives are called the four "marks" or "attributes" of the church. *One*, because despite the many divisions and denominations of Christianity all worship one God, one Spirit, and one Lord, Jesus Christ. *Holy*, because, like sacred objects, the church is set apart for God's purpose. *Catholic*, from the Greek word for "universal," because it is for all without excluding any group or class of people. *Apostolic*, because it arises out of the efforts of the apostles, both the original 12 and others, like today's saint, Barnabas, who were later named apostles. And like you and me, called today to embody these same attributes.

MEMORIAL OF BARNABAS, APOSTLE

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 11:21b-26; 13:1-3; Matthew 5:33-37 (580; Gospel 364). *"Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.'"*


